ADJUSTMENT OF THE BOUNDARIES OF THE SHIRE OF MANSFIELD.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1863* (27 Victoria No. 176, § 284) it is amongst other things enacted that, for adjusting the boundaries of shires and districts to those of electoral districts, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, if it shall seem fit, but so far only as may be necessary for such adjustment, to do without petition all or any of certain acts therein mentioned, and amongst other acts to take away from any shire or district any portion thereof: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the twenty-fourth day of December, 1866, the Shire of Mansfield was constituted: And whereas it is expedient to adjust in part the boundaries of the said shire to those of an electoral district as provided by the said recited Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, proclaim that, with the advice of the Executive Council, I have taken away from the Shire of Mansfield a portion thereof, for the purpose of adjusting the western boundary of the said shire to the eastern boundary of the Electoral District of Dalhousie; and, in order more clearly to show the boundaries of the said shire as now altered, I do hereby define the same in manner following, that is to say:—

THE SHIRE OF MANSFIELD.—Starting at the source of Merton Creek, thence following the waters of that creek and the Delatite to the Goulburn River; thence up that river to the Howqua River, and by the Howqua River to its source; thence by a line to the source of Back Creek; thence by Back Creek to the Broken River; thence up the Broken River to Sandy Creek, and by the last creek to its source; thence by a line to the nearest summit of Strathbogie Range, and by that range to the starting point.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-fourth day of March, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, and in the thirty-first year of Her Majesty's reign.

STACKS BURNT NEAR HARCOURT RESERVOIR.

SEVENTY POUNDS REWARD.

WHEREAS about Eleven at night on Saturday, the 15th of February last, a fire occurred near the Harcourt Reservoir, by which a Stack of Oaten Hay, of the value of £40, the property of Edward O'Keefe, and a Stack of Straw, of the value of £30, belonging to Thomas Stevens, were completely destroyed: And whereas at an inquest held to inquire into the origin of the fire, a verdict was returned that it was the work of an incendiary: And whereas each of the owners of the property destroyed has offered a Reward of £10 for the detection of the person or persons guilty of causing the fire: Notice is hereby given that a Reward of Fifty pounds (supplemental to the two rewards of £10 each above referred to) will be paid by the Government for such information as will lead to the conviction of the person or persons guilty of originating the fire whereby the stacks aforesaid were burnt.
