I, William McCrea, being the Chief Medical Officer in attendance on the execution of Joseph Whelan, at the Gaol of Melbourne, do hereby certify and declare that I have this day witnessed the execution of the said Joseph Whelan, at the said Gaol: And I further certify and declare that the said Joseph Whelan was, in pursuance of the sentence of the Supreme Court at Melbourne, hanged by the neck until his body was dead.

Given under my hand this thirty-first day of March, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, at the Gaol of Melbourne.

We do hereby testify and declare that we have this day been present when the extreme penalty of the law was carried into execution on the body of Joseph Whelan, convicted at the Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court, held at Melbourne on the seventeenth day of February last, and sentenced to death; and that the said Joseph Whelan was, in pursuance of the said sentence, hanged by the neck until his body was dead.
