COMMONS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable SIR JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1862* it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon or within five miles of any gold-field, or in or within five miles of any town not contained in any municipal district, or within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land to be a municipal common, or a gold-fields common, or a town common, or a farmers' common respectively, as the case may be: And whereas by *The Amending Land Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected under *The Land Act 1862*, or selected or leased under the now reciting Act, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land a farmers' common; when one-eighth part of any agricultural area has been selected under *The Land Act 1862*, or selected or leased under the now reciting Act, the Governor in Council may proclaim any unselected and unleased portion of such agricultural area, not exceeding twice the quantity so selected and leased, to be a temporary common for the use of such selectors and lessees; and it is also enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common theretofore or thereafter to be proclaimed or re-proclaimed, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of *The Land Act 1862* and the now reciting Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim, increase, or abolish (as the case may be) the commons hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, that is to say:—

CURRAWA AGRICULTURAL AREA FARMERS' COMMON.—The Currawa Farmers' Common, described in a Proclamation bearing date the 31st day of December, 1866, is hereby increased by adding thereto the allotments of land hereinafter enumerated, and comprising an area of 3897 acres, more or less, viz.:—Parish of Currawa, allotments 22, 23, 24, 25, 26, 27, 28, 29, 30, 31, 32, 33, 34, 39, 50, 51, 62, and 55.—(67.P.15680.)

HEYWOOD TOWN COMMON.—The Heywood Town Common, described in a Proclamation bearing date the 15th day of February, 1864, is hereby increased by adding thereto the unappropriated Crown Lands comprised within the boundaries described as follow, viz.:—Commencing at a point bearing south forty chains from the south-west angle of suburban allotment 14 of section 2, in the parish of Heywood; thence to the said angle of that allotment by a line bearing north; thence by the south boundaries of sections 2, 3, and 4, bearing east one hundred and sixty-five chains fifty-nine links, more or less, to the east angle of allotment 15 of the last-named section; thence by lines bearing respectively south one mile, and west eighty-six chains, more or less, to the road from Heywood to Portland; thence by that road bearing northerly to a point bearing east from the point of commencement; and thence to that point by a line bearing west one mile, more or less; as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne. Area, 1000 acres, more or less.—(68.Q.3202.)

MARYBOROUGH UNITED TOWN AND GOLD-FIELD COMMON.—The United Town and Gold-field Common of Maryborough, described in three several Proclamations, bearing date No. 49.—APRIL 21, 1868.—1.

respectively the 27th day of October, 1862, the 13th day of November, 1862, and the 19th day of January, 1863, is hereby abolished.—(68.R.583.)

MARYBOROUGH BOROUGH COMMON.—The unappropriated Crown Lands within the borough of Maryborough, shall be and constitute a borough common for the use of all householders of that borough.—(68.R.583.)

MARYBOROUGH GOLD-FIELD COMMON.—The unappropriated Crown Lands within the boundaries hereinafter described shall be and constitute the Maryborough Gold-field Common, viz.: Commencing at a point on the Bet-bet Creek, bearing N. 45° W. from the west angle of the borough of Maryborough; thence by a line bearing S. 45° E. two hundred chains, more or less; thence by a line bearing south five hundred and seventy chains, more or less, to the north boundary of the Amherst Gold-field Common; thence by that common, bearing east eighty chains, more or less, and south eighty chains, more or less, to the north-east angle of the town of Amherst; thence by the north boundary of the Amherst Town Common, bearing east one hundred and thirty-eight chains, more or less; thence by a line bearing north three hundred and fifty chains, more or less; thence by a line, bearing east eighty chains, more or less, to the south angle of the borough of Maryborough; thence by the south-west and north-west boundaries of that borough, bearing respectively N. 45° W. three miles, and N. 45° E. two miles; thence by a line, bearing N. 45° W. three hundred and forty-five chains, more or less, to the Bet-bet Creek aforesaid; and thence by that creek, bearing south-westerly to the point of commencement; as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(68.R.583.)

RATHSCAR TEMPORARY COMMON.—The allotments of land hereinafter enumerated, and comprising an area of 1405 acres, more or less, shall be and constitute a Temporary Common for the use of selectors and lessees in the agricultural area of Rathscar, viz.:—Parish of Rathscar, allotments 19, 28, 30, 31, 36, 37, 38, and 49.—(67.O.13895.)

SMYTHESDALE UNITED BOROUGH AND GOLD-FIELD COMMON.—The United Borough and Gold-field Common of Smythesdale, described in two several Proclamations, bearing date respectively the 1st day of February, 1864, and the 21st day of November, 1864, is hereby increased by adding thereto the unappropriated Crown Lands within the boundaries hereinafter described, viz.:—Commencing at the south-west angle of the existing common; thence by the Brown's and Scarsdale Borough Common and by a line bearing south two hundred chains, more or less, to the Linton's, Brown's, Springdallah, Happy Valley, Lucky Woman's, and Italian Gully Gold-field Common; thence by that common and by a line bearing east two hundred and twenty chains, more or less, to the Cardigan Farmers' Common; thence by that common, bearing north two hundred chains, more or less, to the south-east angle of the existing common aforesaid; and thence by that common, bearing west two hundred and twenty chains, more or less, to the point of commencement; as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne. Area, 4400 acres, more or less.—(68.Q.2918.)

**CUTTING OR REMOVING TIMBER OR BARK ON
OR FROM CERTAIN LANDS IN THE PARISHES
OF MALDON AND BARINGHUP PROHIBITED.**

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable SIR JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1862* it is amongst other things enacted, that notwithstanding anything thereinbefore contained the Governor in Council may by Proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut or remove live or dead timber or bark, or stone or gravel, from such portions of Crown lands as are named in such Proclamation, or shall exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any license granted under the authority of the third part of the said Act: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor, and the seal of the colony, bearing date the third day of April, 1865, it was declared that no person should cut or remove live or dead timber or bark from the portion of Crown lands therein described, including Mount Tarrangower, in the parish of Maldon: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut or remove live or dead timber or bark from the unappropriated Crown lands within the boundaries hereinafter described, the said lands being an extension of the area described in the above-mentioned Proclamation, viz.:—One thousand six hundred and sixty-four acres, more or less, county unnamed, comprising part of allotment 5, allotments 6 and 7, part of allotment 8, allotment 9 of section 1 A, and a portion of land adjoining the last-named allotment on the north, part of allotment 1 and allotment 2 of section 2 A, all in the parish of Maldon; part of allotment 15 and allotment 21 of section 1 A, and allotments 4 and 5 of section 2 A, all in the parish of Baringhup: Commencing at the south-east angle of allotment 9 of section 1 A, parish of Maldon; thence by a line bearing north ninety-five chains one link to the south boundary of the area described in a Proclamation as aforesaid, dated 3rd April, 1865; thence by the said boundary of that area, and by a line (crossing a road) bearing west forty-one chains to the north-east angle of allotment 7; thence by a road bearing north seventy chains fifty-six links, and N. 5° 30' E. nine chains eighty-six links; thence by a line bearing west eight chains forty-eight links; thence by a road bearing S. 33° 30' W. twenty-five chains twelve links, S. 53° 15' W. twenty-one chains ninety-seven links, and S. 84° W. forty-one chains seven links to the north-west angle of allotment 15 of section 1 A, parish of Baringhup; thence by a road bearing south one hundred and sixty-one chains thirty links to the south-west angle of allotment 5 of section 2 A; thence by a road bearing east forty chains, N. 69° 15' E. forty-one chains seventy links, and N. 75° 34' E. thirty-seven chains fifty links to the road from Baringhup to Castlemaine; thence, crossing that road, by a line bearing N. 75° 34' E. to the northern side thereof; and thence by the said side of that road, bearing S. 66° 50' E. two chains fifty links, more or less, to the point of commencement; as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(63.L.2773.)

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1862* it is amongst other things enacted, that notwithstanding anything thereinbefore contained the Governor in Council may by Proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut or remove live or dead timber or bark, or stone or gravel, from such portions of Crown lands as are named in such Proclamation, or shall exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any license granted under the authority of the third part of the said Act: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the twentieth day of January, 1868, it is amongst other things declared that no person shall cut or remove live or dead timber or bark from the allotments of land hereinafter enumerated, viz.: Parish of Maldon, allotments 6, 7, the unappropriated portion of allotment 8, and allotment 9, all of section 1 A. Area, seven hundred and eighteen acres, more or less: And whereas it is expedient to revoke so much of the said Proclamation as relates to the parish of Maldon: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the

advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke so much of the Proclamation hereinbefore recited as relates to the parish of Maldon.

By His Excellency the Honorable SIR JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the session held in the twenty-eighth year of Her Majesty's reign (No. 285), called *The Police Offences Statute 1865*, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* extend all or any of the provisions contained in Part I. of the said Statute to any city, town, district, or place in Victoria, and may define the limits of any such city, town, district, or place, and vary and alter such limits, and may revoke any such proclamation; and upon any such proclamation the provisions so proclaimed shall extend to and be in force in such city, town, district, or place: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, do, with the advice of the Executive Council, by this my Proclamation, extend the provisions contained in sections V., VI., VII., VIII., IX., X., of Part I. of the said Statute to the Township of Ballan.

Second quality to be made of flour known in the trade as "best seconds," and the third quality (that issued for prisoners of the Crown) to be made of flour, the produce of prime wheat, from which twelve per cent. has been extracted in bran and waste.

3. Fresh meat is to be supplied in such proportions as may be required, and, when the quantity admits, to be delivered in fore and hind quarters alternately. When shins of beef form a portion of the supply, a fair proportion of the bone, not less than five inches, must have been cut off.

6. Should the contractor fail to supply any articles at the time mentioned in the order they will be otherwise procured, and the expense over and above the contract price will be deducted from his account.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the supplies as to the quality, the same to be decided, in cases where the article is not of a perishable nature, by a Board of Survey composed of persons named by the head of the department, and the decision of the board is to be considered final.

8. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which, it will be procured by the person requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 6.

9. In cases where the article is of a perishable nature, or when from some other cause injury would be sustained either by the person to whom the rations are due, or to the contractor in waiting for Board of Survey, the head of the department, or officer in charge of the station, will have power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing, and that the contractor must take back the rejected article and supply good in its stead; failing which, it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 6.

10. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report of the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £50, as the Government may direct. It will also be in the power of the Government to terminate the contract forthwith.

11. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

12. 14.
