NOTICE TO MARINERS. CLEVELAND BAY.

Gordon Reef, or Virago Rock.

THE position and extent of Gordon Reef, or Virago Rock, Cleveland Bay, having been examined and fixed by Commander Bingham, R.N., of H.M.S. *Virago*, the following notice is published for general information:—

Gordon Reef, or Virago Rock, which has been discovered since the chart of Cleveland Bay was published, is awash at low-water springs, and is situated in Rose Bay, its outer extreme being at a distance of a mile from high-water mark, with its centre at the following bearings:—

Point Hawkings ... N.E. by E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. easterly.
Cape Pallarenda ... N.W. $\frac{1}{2}$ N.
Mount Cudtheringa ... S. by E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E.

The reef is about one-third of a mile in length, and rather more than one cable in width, lying in a N.W. $\frac{1}{2}$ N. and S.E. $\frac{1}{2}$ S. direction, and having a depth of 9 feet off its outer, and of 7 feet off its inshore side. The red buoy, which points out its position, lies three cables to the E.N.E. of the reef.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

ALTERATION OF LIGHTS.—MIDDLE CHANNEL, MORETON BAY.

IN consequence of the changes that have taken place in the Middle Channel, an alteration in the position of the Lower or Yellow Patch Light will be made on the 16th April; the light on and after that date being exhibited from a white hexagonal tower, 30 feet high, placed to the northward of the present Yellow Patch Light, and at an elevation of about 46 feet above high-water mark.

On the same date the Green Light will cease to be exhibited from Comboyuro Point Light-house. That light will therefore be obscured as formerly, between the Red Light outside the east banks, and the White Light inside the Inner Middle Channel Buoy.

On and after the 16th instant, therefore, the following will be the directions to be observed by vessels entering the port by the Middle Channel:—

By Day.—After rounding the Cape, steer as formerly, and bring the Cape Moreton and Yellow Patch Light-houses and the road-way, on the slope of the Light-house Hill, in line. Keep these objects on, bearing about E. $\frac{1}{2}$ S., until the Inner Middle Channel Buoy is passed, and the ship Patch is opened out to the westward of Cowan Cowan Point; then proceed towards Yule Roads, keeping these marks open as usual.

By Night.—After rounding the North Point and sighting the Red Light on Comboyuro Point, steer for it until the Light-house and the Yellow Patch Lights are in line. Steer about W. $\frac{1}{2}$ N., keeping the lights in line, until the Red Light is obscured and again opened out as a bright white light on a S.S.E. bearing, when haul up and steer south, making due allowance for tide until the light on Cowan Cowan is opened out, when proceed up the Bay as formerly, the Cowan Cowan Light in sight leading clear of the western edge of the Venus Bank.

These directions will lead over the East Bank, and to the northward of the Knoll, in not less than three fathoms at low water.

2. Bread. A sample of the best ordinarily retailed to the public will be considered as a test loaf for first quality. Second quality to be made of flour known in the trade as "best seconds," and the third quality (that issued for prisoners of the Crown) to be made of flour, the produce of prime wheat, from which twelve per cent. has been extracted in bran and waste.

3. Fresh meat is to be supplied in such proportions as may be required, and, when the quantity admits, to be delivered in fore and hind quarters alternately. When shins of beef form a portion of the supply, a fair proportion of the bone, not less than five inches, must have been cut off.

4. The supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts are to be delivered direct to the establishment entitled thereto on the written order of the officer in charge. All other supplies will be ordered by the head of department, either for delivery at the Stores and Transport Office, or at the office of the department concerned, as may be stated in the order.

5. The order issued by the head of department must accompany the goods, and the account is to be rendered simultaneously with delivery of the supplies. In other cases the account is to be rendered monthly. The rates quoted in the orders cannot be exceeded.

6. Should the contractor fail to supply any articles at the time mentioned in the order they will be otherwise procured, and the expense over and above the contract price will be deducted from his account.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the supplies as to the quality, the same to be decided, in cases where the article is not of a

perishable nature, by a Board of Survey composed of persons named by the head of the department, and the decision of the board is to be considered final.

8. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which, it will be procured by the person requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 6.

9. In cases where the article is of a perishable nature, or when from some other cause injury would be sustained either by the person to whom the rations are due, or to the contractor in waiting for Board of Survey, the head of the department, or officer in charge of the station, will have power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing, and that the contractor must take back the rejected article and supply good in its stead; failing which, it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 6.

10. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report of the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £50, as the Government may direct. It will also be in the power of the Government to terminate the contract forthwith.

11. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

12. It will be competent for the Inspector of Stores, on behalf of the Government, or the contractor, on his own behalf, to terminate the contract, by giving, in writing, a notice of three full calendar months, it being understood that such notice can be given only from the first day of the month. It will also be competent for the Inspector of Stores to terminate the contract, without notice, on infringement of condition No. 11, or should there be reason to know that the contractor takes advantage of his contract to communicate improperly with a prisoner.
