INCORPORATION OF THE MELBOURNE BENE- VOLENT ASYLUM.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the 5th day of
May, 1868.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-seventh year of
the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled *An Act for
Hospitals and Charitable Institutions*, it is amongst other things
enacted, that any institution established for the cure of disease,
or for the relief of diseased, aged, incurable, or destitute persons,
and supported in whole or in part by the voluntary contribu-
tions of not less than fifty persons, each of whom shall have

paid not less than One pound per annum or Twenty pounds in
one donation, may be incorporated as thereinafter mentioned,
and all persons who shall have paid as aforesaid shall be deemed
contributors within the meaning of the said Act; and it is also
enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, on
the receipt of a petition signed by not less than twenty-five of
the said persons praying that such institution may be incor-
porated, to cause the substance or prayer of such petition to be
published in the *Government Gazette*, and (if no counter-peti-
tion, signed by an equal or greater number of such persons, shall
have been delivered at the office of the Chief Secretary within
one month after the date of such publication) the Governor in
Council may declare the contributors for the time being to such
institution to be and they shall thereupon become and continue
a body politic and corporate by the style and title named in
the Order in Council, and shall have perpetual succession and
a common seal: And whereas the Governor in Council has
received a petition signed by not less than twenty-five contri-
butors to the institution known as the Melbourne Benevolent
Asylum, praying that the said institution may be incorporated:
And whereas the substance or prayer of the said petition has
been published in the *Government Gazette*, and no counter-
petition has been delivered at the office of the Chief Secretary
within one month after the date of such publication: Now
therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the
Executive Council, doth by this present Order declare the
contributors to the said institution to be a body politic and
corporate in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, in
manner following, that is to say:—

The contributors for the time being to the institution called
and known as the Melbourne Benevolent Asylum are hereby
declared to be a body politic and corporate by the style and
title of "The Melbourne Benevolent Asylum."

And the Honorable James McCulloch, Her Majesty's Chief
Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein
accordingly.

THE SHIRE OF BERWICK.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir JOHN HENRY THOMAS
MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most
Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-
in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1863* it is
amongst other things enacted, that if at any time in any
district, whether single or united, which shall contain an area of
not less than one hundred square miles, the total amount
actually paid in respect of the general rate then last made shall
have amounted to One thousand pounds, it shall be lawful for
the Governor in Council to proclaim, if it shall seem fit, such
district, by such name as in and by such Order in Council may
be assigned thereto, to be a shire within the meaning of the said
Act, and such district shall thereupon be and be called such
shire accordingly; and no district, after the proclamation thereof
as such shire, save as therein provided with regard to the
adjustment of boundaries to those of electoral districts, shall be
united with any other shire or district, or with any borough or
municipal district: And whereas by a Proclamation under the
hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the
twenty-ninth day of September, One thousand eight hundred
and sixty-two, a Road District was proclaimed under the designa-
tion of "The Berwick Road District." And whereas by an
Order in Council bearing date the fourteenth day of November,
One thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, the said Road
District was subdivided as therein set forth: And whereas
the area of the said district and the amount of the last general
rate therein are not less than the area and amount in the said
Act mentioned, and it seemed fit to make an Order in Council
this day to proclaim the said district to be a shire accordingly:
Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of
the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the district here-

tofore proclaimed and called the Berwick Road District to be a Shire within the meaning of the said Act, by the name in and by such Order in Council assigned thereto, that is to say:—

THE SHIRE OF BERWICK.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this fifth day of May, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, and in the thirty-first year of Her Majesty's reign.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable SIR JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1862* it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon or within five miles of any gold-field, or in or within five miles of any town not contained in any municipal district, or within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land to be a municipal common, or a gold-fields common, or a town common, or a farmers' common respectively, as the case may be: And whereas by *The Amending Land Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common theretofore or thereafter to be proclaimed or reproclaimed, and may from time to time reprocclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of *The Land Act 1862* and the now reciting Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby increase or diminish (as the case may be) certain commons as hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Acts, that is to say:—

GLENGRANT AND TARNAGULLA UNITED FARMERS' COMMON.—The portion of the Glengrant and Tarnagulla United Farmers' Common within the shire of Marong, which, by Order in Council of the 21st October, 1867, was declared to be a separate common, is hereby diminished by excluding therefrom the portion of allotment 1 of section 21, in the parish of Woodstock, in the Agricultural Area of Tarnagulla, comprised within the boundaries hereinafter described, and containing fifty-six acres three roods eleven perches: Commencing at a point bearing N. 81° 19' W. one chain from the north-west angle of allotment 1 of section 11, in the parish of Marong; bounded thence by a road bearing S. 9° 3' W. fifteen chains; thence by a line bearing N. 81° 19' W. thirty-seven chains eighty-eight links; and thence by roads bearing respectively N. 9° 3' E. fifteen chains, and S. 81° 19' E. thirty-seven chains eighty-eight links to the point of commencement; as shown on the plan deposited at the crown Lands Office, Melbourne. The bearings are taken from the true meridian.—(68.Q.71.)

HEYWOOD TOWN COMMON.—The Heywood Town Common, described in two separate Proclamations, bearing dates respectively the 15th day of February, 1864, and the 6th day of April, 1868, is hereby increased by adding thereto the unappropriated Crown lands comprised in the three several portions within the boundaries hereinafter described as follow, viz.: 1. Commencing at the south-east angle of allotment 1 of section 2, in the parish of Drumburg; bounded thence by a line bearing south one hundred and eighty-two chains, more or less; thence by a line bearing east sixty-eight chains eighty-eight links to a point bearing south forty chains from the south-west angle of allotment 14 of section 2, in the parish of Heywood, being the western side of the extension of the Heywood Town Common, proclaimed on the 6th day of April, 1868; thence by the said side of the extended common, allotment 14 of section 2 aforesaid, across a road, allotment 7 of that section, across a road, allotments 6 and 1 of the said section in the last-mentioned parish, and across a road, to the south-west angle of allotment 6 of section 1, bearing north one hundred and twelve chains twenty-five links; thence across a road, and by allotments 11 and 12 of that section in the same parish, bearing N. 60° W. thirty-six chains seventy-four links; thence by the last-mentioned allotment, across a road, and by allotment 10 of section 1 aforesaid, bearing north twenty-seven chains eighteen links to the right bank of the River Kitz Roy; thence by a line bearing north-westerly to the south-east angle of allotment 3 of section 2, in the parish of Drumburg aforesaid; thence by that allotment, bearing N. 65° W. nineteen chains fourteen links; and thence by the first-mentioned allotment bearing N. 51° W. twenty-five chains seventy-five links to the point of commencement.

2. Commencing at a point bearing south forty chains from the south-west angle of allotment 14 of section 2, in the parish of Heywood, being the south-west angle of the extension of the Heywood Town Common, proclaimed on the 6th April, 1868; bounded thence by the said extension bearing east seventy-seven chains, more or less, to the west side of the road from Heywood to Portland; thence by the west side of that road, bearing S. 5° 15' W. four chains, more or less, S. 7° 30' E. thirty-seven chains, S. 6° W. seven chains, S. 3° W. seven chains, and S. 15° W. nineteen chains; and thence by a line bearing north-west, more or less, one hundred chains, more or less, to the point of commencement.

3. Commencing on the left bank of the River Surry, at the point where the east side of the road from Portland to Heywood abuts thereon; bounded thence by that road, bearing north fifty-one chains ninety links, more or less, N. 17° E. seventy-seven chains, more or less, N. 6° E. thirty-five chains, more or less, N. 15° E. seventeen chains, more or less, N. 3° E. seven chains, more or less, N. 40° W. sixteen chains, more or less, N. 49° W. ten chains, more or less, N. 41° W. seventeen chains, more or less, N. 15° E. nineteen chains, more or less, N. 3° E. seven chains, more or less, and N. 6° E. four chains, more or less, to the southern boundary of the extension of the Heywood Town Common, proclaimed on the 6th day of April, 1868; thence by the said southern boundary of the extension aforesaid, bearing east to the west side of the proposed Portland and Hamilton Tramway; thence by the said tramway, bearing S. 11° 45' E. sixty-five chains, more or less, and S. 26° E. two hundred and ten chains, more or less, to the left bank of the River Surry aforesaid; and thence by the said bank of the said river, bearing north-westerly to the point of commencement; containing 1716 acres, more or less; as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(68.R.4765.)

GOD SAVE THE QUEEN!

PETITION UNDER "THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1863."

ALEXANDRA TOWN AND VICINITY.

A PETITION has been presented to the Governor, bearing seventy-six signatures of persons representing themselves to be inhabitants of the township and district of Alexandra, in the county of Anglesey.

The petitioners state that they are each possessed of property rateable under the provisions of the Act 27 Vict. No. 176, and situate within the area which they describe as follows, viz.:— "Starting at the junction of the Home Creek with the River Goulburn; thence by a line due north to the boundary of the county of Anglesey; thence by that boundary to the source of Merton Creek; thence following the course of that creek and the Delatite to the Goulburn River; thence up that river to the junction of the Jerusalem Creek with the Goulburn; thence by a straight line in a south-westerly direction to the junction of the Little River with the Acheron River; and thence by a straight line to the starting point."

They further state that the said area does not lie within the limits of a municipal or road district; that it is wholly within the county of Anglesey, and contains not less than forty square miles; and that it contains rateable property of a net annual value far exceeding £5000.

Finally, they declare their desire that the said area be proclaimed a Road District under the said Act, and that it be designated "The Road District of Alexandra."

The Governor has been pleased to order that the said petition be taken into consideration by his Executive Council, on Monday, the 22nd day of June next ensuing.

WORKS ON MAIN ROADS.

3. Fresh meat is to be supplied in such proportions as may be required, and, when the quantity admits, to be delivered in fore and hind quarters alternately. When shins of beef form a portion of the supply, a fair proportion of the bone, not less than five inches, must have been cut off.

4. The supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts are to be delivered direct to the establishment entitled thereto on the written order of the officer in charge. All other supplies will be ordered by the head of department, either for delivery at the Stores and Transport Office, or at the office of the department concerned, as may be stated in the order.

10. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report of the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £50, as the Government may direct. It will also be in the power of the Government to terminate the contract forthwith.

11. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

12. BOROUGH OF BALLARAT EAST.

BYE-LAW No. 1A, FOR REGULATING THE CONDUCT OF OFFICERS AND SERVANTS, AND PROVIDING FOR THE DUE MANAGEMENT OF THE COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF BALLARAT EAST.

GENERAL CONDUCT OF BUSINESS.

1. In all cases not herein provided for, resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of Parliament, which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the council.

2. At every meeting of the council, the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting, and the reading of the minutes of the proceedings of any committee reported at any such preceding meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings; and the said minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting shall then be signed; and the rough minutes of the proceedings of the council at any meeting shall be read at the close of such meeting.

3. After the signing of the minutes as aforesaid, the order of business of any ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable; but for the greater convenience of the council at any particular meeting thereof, it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

- (I.) Reading of copies of letters sent by authority of the council.
- (II.) Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
- (III.) Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
- (IV.) Presentation of reports of committees.
- (V.) Payments.
- (VI.) Ordinary business.
- (VII.) Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings.
- (VIII.) Extraordinary business, and new rules and regulations.
- (IX.) Other motions of which previous notice has been given.
- (X.) Notices of motion.

And the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

4. Whenever a division shall be demanded by any councillor, the councillors voting in the affirmative shall first hold up their hands, and then those voting in the negative shall hold up their hands, and the result be declared by the chairman.

5. All addresses to the Governor shall be presented by the mayor and the town clerk, unless otherwise ordered by the council.

MOTIONS.

6. All notices of motion shall be dated and numbered, and given by the intending mover to the town clerk at the close of the meeting of council, or forty-eight hours prior to the next meeting of council; and the town clerk shall enter the same in the notice of motion book in the order in which they may be received.

7. No member shall make any motion initiating a subject for discussion but in pursuance of notice given as prescribed in the last preceding clause.

8. No motion, except that of receiving the same, shall, unless under most urgent circumstances, be made on any petition, memorial, or other like application, until the next ordinary meeting of council after that at which it has been presented.

9. Except by leave of the council, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received and recorded by the town clerk in the notice of motion book; and if not so moved or postponed, shall be struck out.

10. No motion entered in the notice of motion book shall be proceeded with in the absence of the councillor who gave notice of the same, unless by some other councillor producing written authority from him to that effect.

11. No motion for an address or petition shall be entertained unless the mover shall at some previous meeting have submitted a draft of the same.

ORDER, ETC., OF DEBATE.

12. Any councillor desirous of making a motion or amendment, or taking part in discussion thereon, shall rise and address the chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the councillor (if any) calling to order shall have been heard thereon, and the question of order disposed of, when the councillor in possession of the chair may proceed with the subject.

13. Any councillor desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the council thereon.

14. No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the council.

15. No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the council unless it be seconded; but a councillor may, however, require the enforcement of any standing order of the council by directing the mayor's or chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

16. A councillor moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon, but a councillor merely seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

17. The councillors in meeting of council shall designate each other by their official titles, namely, that of mayor, chairman, or councillor, as the case may require.

18. If two or more councillors rise to speak at the same time, the chairman shall decide which is entitled to priority.

19. The chairman shall rise in addressing the council to discuss any question, and shall not leave the chair on such occasions.

20. No councillor shall speak a second time on the same question, unless entitled to reply, or in explanation when he has been misrepresented or misunderstood.

21. The chairman, when called upon to decide on points of order or practice, shall state the provision, rule, or practice which he deems applicable to the case, without discussing or commenting on the same, and his decision as to order or explanation in each case shall be final.

22. No councillor shall digress from the subject matter of the question under discussion, or comment upon the words used by any other councillor in a previous debate; and all imputations of improper motives, and all personal reflections on councillors, shall be deemed highly disorderly.

23. Whenever any councillor shall make use of any expression disorderly, or capable of being applied offensively, to any other councillor, the councillor so offending shall be required to withdraw the expression, and to make a satisfactory apology to the council.

24. A councillor called to order shall sit down unless permitted to explain.

25. Any councillor using offensive or disorderly language, and having been twice called to order and to apologise for such conduct, and refusing so to do, shall be guilty of an offence.

26. Any councillor not attending in compliance with an order for a call of the whole council, without reasonable excuse to the satisfaction of the majority thereof, shall be guilty of an offence.

27. Any councillor may, of right, demand the production of any of the documents of the council applying to the question under discussion.

28. The council shall vote by show of hands.

29. The chairman shall, in taking the sense of the council, put the question first in the affirmative, then in the negative, and the result thereof shall be recorded in the minutes.

30. At every meeting of the council all motions, whether original motions or amendments, shall be reduced into writing, signed by the mover, and delivered by the chairman immediately on their being moved and seconded.

31. No subsequent amendment, whether upon an original proposition or on an amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of.

32. If an amendment be carried, the question as amended shall become itself the question, whereupon any further amendment upon any portion of the question coming after such first-mentioned amendment may be moved.

33. If an amendment be negatived, then a second may be moved to the question to which the first-mentioned amendment was moved, but only one amendment shall be submitted to the council for discussion at a time.

34. The mover of every original proposition, but not of any amendment, shall have a right to reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the chair; but no councillor shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question,

unless permission be given to explain or the attention of the chair be called to a point of order.

35. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the council, but if on the question being put the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration or the next on the notice paper shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment be carried.

36. Any councillor may protest against any resolution of the council, and notice of intention to protest shall in every case be given forthwith on the adoption of the resolution protested against; and the protest shall specify the reasons for protesting, and shall be entered three days at least before the next ordinary meeting of the council by the protesting councillor in a book to be kept for that purpose in the town clerk's office, and signed by such councillor, and shall be also entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the intention to protest shall have been given previously to the confirmation thereof; but such protest may be expunged from the minutes if declared by a majority of the council to be not in accordance with truth or in its terms disrespectful to the council.

LAPSED QUESTIONS.

37. If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the number of the councillors present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate may be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted on motion upon notice.

38. If a debate on any order of the day be interrupted by any such insufficiency of number as aforesaid happening, such order may be restored to the notice book for a future day on motion upon notice, and then such debate shall be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.

COMMITTEES.

39. Minutes of all proceedings of committees, as well as of their reports, numbered in consecutive order, shall be entered in the committee's minute book, and being signed by the chairman of the committee, shall be presented to the council; and the town clerk, when practicable, shall attend all meetings of committees.

40. The town clerk shall convene every committee within ten days of its first appointment, or at any other time thereafter by order of the council, or on the written order of the chairman, or of any two members of such committee.

PETITIONS.

41. No petition shall be presented after the council shall have proceeded to the orders of the day.

42. It shall be incumbent on every councillor presenting a petition to acquaint himself with the contents thereof, and to ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the council, and that the contents do not violate any of the by-laws or any provision thereof.

43. Every councillor presenting a petition to the council shall write his name at the beginning thereof.

44. Every petition shall be in writing, and not printed or lithographed, and shall contain the prayer of the petitioners at the end thereof, and be signed by at least one person on every skin or sheet on which it is written.

45. Every petition shall be signed by the persons whose names are appended thereto by their names or marks, and by no one else, except in cases of incapacity by sickness.

46. No letters, affidavits, or other documents shall be attached to any petition.

47. Every councillor presenting a petition to the council shall confine himself to a statement of the persons from whom it comes, of the number of signatures attached to it, of the material allegations contained in it, and to the reading of the prayer thereof.

APPOINTMENTS, ETC., OF OFFICERS.

48. No appointment to any office at the disposal of the council shall take place until seven clear days' public notice shall have been given by advertisement in one or more new-papers circulating in the borough, inviting applications from qualified candidates for the same.

49. The salary or allowance attached to all offices and places at the disposal of the council shall in all cases be fixed before they proceed to appoint any person to fill the same, and all such appointments herein referred to shall be made by ballot of the council.

50. No councillor or officer of the council, and no assessor or auditor of the borough, shall be received as a surety for any officer appointed by the council, or for any work to be done for the council.

51. In all cases of security being given for the faithful performance of any duty or contract, the expense of preparing such security shall be borne by the person providing the same.

MISCELLANEOUS.

52. All the plans and specifications for any public work shall be laid before the council at least six days prior to the same being considered and ordered upon, and be open for inspection by any ratepayer during that time.

53. The common seal of the borough shall be kept in a box having two locks, of one of which locks the mayor and each councillor shall have a key, and of the other of which locks the key shall be kept by the town clerk, and the corporate seal shall not be affixed to any document unless the mayor and one other member of the council, or, in the absence of the chairman, unless two councillors be present.

54. Any one or more of the rules or regulations contained in this subdivision may be suspended for a special purpose on motion upon notice duly given, and shall not otherwise be suspended except by an unanimous vote of the council.

55. Every person who shall offend against this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds for each such offence.
