WHEREAS by The Electoral Act 1865 it is amongst other things enacted that where any accidental or unavoidable impediment, misfeasance, or omission shall have happened in the preparation or transmission or printing of any general roll or supplementary roll or ordinary electoral roll or roll of rate-paying electors, the Governor in Council may take all such measures as may be necessary for removing such impediment or rectifying such misfeasance or omission, or may declare any such roll valid as to and notwithstanding such impediment, misfeasance, or omission; and every such Order in Council shall state specifically the nature of the impediment, misfeasance, or omission, and shall be forthwith published in the Government Gazette: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power in him vested by the 68th section of the said Act, doth by this present Order declare to be valid the Supplementary Rolls for the Franklin and Lexton divisions of the Electoral District of Greswick, notwithstanding that the Lists for the said divisions were revised on a day not legally appointed for that purpose.

Note.—During the past quarter, the excess of births over deaths amounted to 3.584, and the excess of arrivals over departures to 1.099. The total gain to the population was thus 4.683, as stated above. The figures for the 31st December, 1867, exceed those given in the published tuble for the quarter ending at that date, by 36 as regards the males and 6 as regards the tennies, or by 32 for the total population. This difference has aften in consequence of a final examination of the Deputy Recriptor's returns having developed a few inaccuracies which have now been recified.

BYE-LAW OF THE MINING BOARD OF THE MINING DISTRICT
OF BALLARAT.—NO. 5.

A Ta Meeting of the Mining Board of the Mining District
of Ballarat, begun and holden at Ballarat, in the said
district, on the twenty-first day of April, in the year of our
Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixy-eight, it is ordained
by the said Board as follows, that is to say:—

1. BYE-LAW NO. 1 A.—FOR REGULATING THE CONDUCT OF THE OFFICERS AND SERVANTS, AND PROVIDING FOR THE DUE MANAGEMENT OF THE AFFAIRS OF THE COUNCIL OF THE REPORTED FOR THE COUNCIL OF THE C BOROUGH OF BALLARAT.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, No. 184, intituled An Act to consolidate and amend the Laws relating to Municipal Institutions, power is given to the council of every borough from time to time to make such bye-laws as they may think fit, for the purpose of regulating the conduct of their officers and servants, and for providing for the due management of the affairs of the council: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the Council of the Borough of Ballarat as follows:—

GENERAL CONDUCT OF BUSINESS.

1. In all cases not herein provided for resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of Parliament of Victoria, which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the council.

sman be homed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the council.

2. At every meeting of the council the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings; and the said minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting shall then be signed, as by law required; and the rough minutes of the proceedings of the council at any meeting shall be read at the close of such meeting, if required by any councillor present at such meeting.

3. After the signing of the minutes as aforesaid, the order of business of an ordinary meeting shall be as follow, or as near thereto as may be practicable, but for the greater convenience of the council at any particular meeting thereof it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

(L.) Reading of copies of letters sent by the authority of the

(1.) Reading of copies of letters sent by the authority of the council if called for.
 (11.) Reading letters received, and considering and ordering

thereon thereon.

(III.) Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.

(IV.) Receiving deputations from the ratepayers, as provided in clause (48).

(v.) Presentation of reports of committees

(V.) Presentation of reports of committees.
(VI.) Payments.
(VII.) Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings, and any business the mayor may think desirable.
(VIII.) Other motions of which previous notice had been approximated.

(VIII.) Other motions of which previous notice had been given.

(1x.) Notices of motion, and the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

4. Whenever a division shall be demanded by any councillor, the councillors voting in the affirmative shall first hold up their hands, and then those voting in the negative shall hold up their hands, and the result be declared by the chairman.

5. All addresses to the Governor shall be presented by the mayor and the town clerk, unless otherwise ordered by the council.

6 All notices of motion shall be dated and numbered, and given by the intending innover to the town clerk at the close of the meeting of council; or if not required by law to be given at a meeting, then three clear days prior to the next meeting of council; and the town clerk shall enter the same in the notice of motion book in the order in which they may be received.

7. No member shall make any motion initiating a subject for discussion but in pursuance of notice given as prescribed in the last preceding clause.

8. No motion, except that for receiving the same, shall, unless under most urgent circumstances, be made on any petition.

8. No motion, except that for receiving the same, shall, unless under most urgent circumstances, be made on any petition, memorial, or other like application, until the next ordinary meeting of council after that at which it has been presented.

9. Except by leave of the council, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received and recorded by the town clerk in the notice of motion book, and if not so moved or postponed shall be struck out.

10. No motion entered in the notice of motion book shall be proceeded with in the absence of the councillor who gave notice of the same, unless by some other councillor producing written authority from him to that effect.

11. No motion for an address or petition shall be entertained unless the mover shall at some previous meeting have submitted a draft of the same.

ORDER, ETC., OF DEBATE.

12. Any councillor desirous of making a motion or amendment, or laking part in discussion thereon, shall rise and address the chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the councillor (if any) calling to order shall have been heard thereon, and the question of order disposed of, when the councillor in possession of the chair may proceed with the subject.

13. Any councillor desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must stare the nature of the same before he addresses the council thereon.

14. No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the council.

15. No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the council unless it be seconded; but a councillor may, however, require the enforcement of any standing order of the council, by directing the mayor's or chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

16. A councillor moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon; but a councillor meanly seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

17. The councillors, in meeting of council, shall designate each other by their official titles, namely, that of mayor, chairman, or councillor, as the case may require.

18. If two or more councillors rise to speak at the same time, the mayor or chairman shall decide which is entitled to priority.

19. The mayor or chairman shall rise in addressing the council to discuss any question, and shall not leave the chair on such

occasions.

coasions.

20. No councillor shall speak a second time on the same question, unless entitled to reply, or in explanation when he has been misrepresented or misunderstood.

21. The mayor or chairman, when called upon to decide on points of order or practice, shall state the provision, rule, or practice which he deems applicable to the case without discussing or commenting on the same; and his decision as to order or explanation in each case shall be final.

22. No councillor shall digress from the subject-matter of the question under discussion, or comment upon the words used by any other councillor in a previous debate; and all imputations of improper motives, and all personal reflections on councillors shall be deemed highly disorderly.

23. A councillor called to order shall sit down unless permitted

23. A councillor called to order shall sit down unless permitted

to explain.

24. No councillor shall use offensive or disorderly language. and every councillor so doing shall, upon being called to order by the mayor or chairman, apologise for such conduct, and with-

hy the mayor or chairman, apologise for such conduct, and withdraw such language.

25. No person not being a councillor, who having been admitted to any meeting of the council, shall be guilty thereat of any improper or disorderly conduct, and every such person shall leave such meeting when lawfully requested by the mayor or chairman so to do.

26. No councillor shall absent himself from any council meeting in compliance with an order for a call of the whole council without reasonable excuss to the satisfaction of the majority thereof.

27. Any councillor may of right demand the production of any

27. Any councillor may of right demand the production of any of the documents of the council applying to the question under

The members of the council shall vote by show of hands,

28. The members of the council shall vote by show of hands, and every councillor present shall vote except he be disabled by law from so doing.

29. The mayor or chairman shall, in taking the sense of the council, put the question first in the affirmative, then in the nexative, and the result thereof shall be recorded in the minutes.

30. At every meeting of the council all motions, whether original motions or amendments, shall, if required by the mayor or chairman, be reduced into writing, signed by the mover, and be delivered to the chairman immediately on their being moved and seconded.

31. No second or subsequent amendment, whether upon an original proposition or on an amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of, 32. If an amendment be carried the question or amendment as amended shall become itself the question or amendment as amended shall become itself the question of amendment as amendment upon any portion of the question coming after such first-mentioned amendment may be moved.

33. If an amendment be negatived, then a second may be moved to the question to which the first-mentioned amendment was moved, but only one amendment shall be submitted to the council for discussion at a time.

34. The mover of every original proposition, but not of any amendment, shall have a right to reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the chair, but no councilior shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question theless permission be given to explain or the attention of the chair be called to a point of order.

35. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the council, but if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration or the next on the notice-paper shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment be made.

36. Any councillor may protest against any resolution of the council, and notice of intention to protest shall in every case be given forthwith on the adoption of the resolution protested against; and the protest shall specify the reasons for protesting, and shall be entered three days at least before the next ordinary meeting of the council, by the protesting councillor, in a book to be kept for that purpose in the town clerk's office

LAPSED QUESTIONS.

37. If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be inter-rupted by the number of the councillors present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate may be resumed at the point where it was interrupted on motion upon

notice.

COMMITTEES.

39. Minutes of all proceedings of committees, as well as of their reports, numbered in consecutive order, shall be entered in the committee's minute-book, and being signed by the chairman of the committee, shall be presented to the council, and the town clerk, when practicable, shall attend all meetings of committee.

40. The town clerk shall convene every committee within ten days of its first appointment, or at any other time thereafter by order of the council, on the written order of the chairman of

the committee or of any two members of the committee.

PETITIONS.

41. No petition shall be presented after the council shall have proceeded to the orders of the day.

42. It shall be incumbent on every councillor presenting a petition to acquaint himself with the contents thereof, and to ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the council, and that the contents do not violate any bye-law or any

45. Every petition shall be signed by the persons whose names are appended thereto, by their names or marks, and by no one else, except in cases of incapacity by sickness.

47. Every councillor presenting a petition to the council shall confine himself to a statement of the persons from whom it comes, of the number of signatures attached to it, of the material allegations contained in it, and to the reading of the praver thereof.

48. Deputations from the ratepayers wishing to be heard before the council in support of any petition or otherwise must send in an application in writing to the town clerk at least three days before the meeting of the council at which such petition is intended to be pre-ented.

APPOINTMENTS, ETC., OF OFFICERS.

49. No appointment to any permanent office at the disposal of the council shall take place until seven clear days' public notice shall have been given by advertisement in one or more newspapers circulating in the borough, inviting applications from qualified candidates for the same 50. The salary or allowance attached to all offices and places at the disposal of the council, shall in all cases be fixed before they proceed to appoint any person to fill the same before the advertisement inviting applications as aforesaid, and shall be specified in such advertisement.

51. No councillor or officer of the council, and no assessor or auditor of the borough shall be received as a surety for any officer appointed by the council, or for any work to be done for the council.

52. In all cases of security being given for the faithful per-formance of any contract, the expense of preparing such security shall be borne by the person providing the same.

53. All the plans and specifications for any public work shall be laid before the council at least six days prior to the same being considered and ordered upon, and be open for inspection by any ratepayer during that time, except in cases of emergency.

54. It shall be lawful for the treasurer of the horough, from time to tune, on the written order of the town cierk, to disburse such moneys as shall have been appropriated by the council for the purposes of this clause, and as shall be required for any necessary occasion, not exceeding in the whole in an interval between two ordinary meetings of the council the sum of Five pounds.

55. The common seal of the borough shall be kept in a box having two locks, of one of which locks the mayor shall keep the key, and of the other of which locks the key shall be kept by the town clerk; and the corporate seal shall not be affixed to any document unless the mayor and one other member of the council, or in the absence of the mayor, or unless two councilors he present.

56 Any one or more of the rules or regulatious contained in this subdivision may be suspended for a special purpose on motion upon notice being duly given, and shall not otherwise be susmended except by a unanimous vote of the council.

57. Every person who shall offend against this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each such offence.
