WARDS OF THE BOROUGH OF CLUNES.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the thirteenth day of January, 1868.

WHEREAS by *The Municipal Corporations Act 1863*, it is amongst other things enacted, that at any time after the first annual election or general election, as the case may be, or first appointment of councillors for any original or proclaimed borough (hereinafter sometimes called in common "single borough") the Governor in Council, if it seem fit, may, if he shall have received a petition to that effect signed by one-fourth of the number of persons liable to be rated under the said Act in respect of rateable property in such borough, within three months after the receipt of the same divide the borough into three separate wards by such names as shall by such Order in Council be assigned to the same, and in and by such Order in Council the boundaries of such wards shall be set forth; provided that no such division shall be made upon or within thirty days before any day appointed for holding any annual election of councillors in or for such borough: And whereas the Governor has received a petition signed by not less than one-fourth of the number of persons liable to be rated under the said Act in respect of rateable property in the borough of Clunes, praying that the said borough may be divided into three wards: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, by this present Order divide the said borough of Clunes into three separate wards, by the names hereby assigned to the same respectively and with the several boundaries hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

NORTH WARD.—Commencing at a point in the centre of Creswick's Creek at its intersection with the northern boundary of the Borough of Clunes; thence east to the north-east angle of the borough; thence south along the eastern boundary of the said borough to its intersection with the centre of the road between allotments 21 and 22 of section B, parish of Smeaton; thence south-westerly along the centre of the said road and Smeaton street to the intersection of the said street with Creswick's Creek (at a bridge); thence north-westerly along the centre of the said creek to a point bearing north-easterly from the intersection of Frazer and Service streets; thence south-west to the said point at the intersection of Frazer and Service streets; thence north-westerly along the centre of Frazer street, to its intersection with Camp street; thence north-easterly, along the centre of Camp street, to the centre of Creswick's Creek; thence northerly, along the centre of the said creek, to the point of commencement.

WEST WARD.—Commencing at a point in the centre of Creswick's Creek at its intersection with the northern boundary-line of the borough of Clunes; thence southerly, along the centre of the said creek, to its intersection with the centre of Camp street; thence south-westerly, along the centre of Camp street, to its intersection with Frazer street; thence south-easterly, along the centre of Frazer street, to a point bearing N. 22° E. from the north-east angle of allotment 20 of section 3; thence S. 22° W. to the said point, and along the boundary-line between 19 and 20, and between 7 and 8 of section 3, and across Bailey street, and along the eastern boundaries of allotments 32, 30, 20, and 5 of section 4, to the centre of Alliance street; thence south-easterly, along the centre of Alliance street, to its intersection with the centre of Service street; thence southerly, along the centre of Service street and a road east of allotments 7, 8, 9, and 10 (Two-mile Hill survey), to the southern boundary

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of the borough; thence west to the south-west angle of the borough; thence north to the north-west angle of the borough; thence east to the point of commencement.

EAST WARD.—Bounded on the north by the North Ward, and on the west by the West Ward. The southern boundary being a portion of the southern boundary of the borough; and the eastern boundary being likewise a portion of the eastern boundary of the borough.

And the Honorable James McCulloch, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

Printed forms of tender and conditions of contract may be obtained from the Inspector of Stores, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge of police at each station, by whom also any information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

The tenders for each station will be accepted or rejected separately.

Tenders will be received for either oats, bran, hay, or straw; but if all be included in one tender, it may be accepted for one article only, if advisable.

Tenders must express the prices in words as well as in figures, and without alterations or erasures.

As much forage as the storage will accommodate will be ordered at a time for the convenience of contractors.

The price must be per ton for hay and straw, and per bushel of 40 lbs. for oats and 20 lbs for bran (net weight), including delivery at the stations and all charges; bags to be returned when empty.

Tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for one-third of the estimated amount of the contract, within ten days after the acceptance is notified. Two approved securities are required for contracts amounting to £150 and upwards, and one surety for contracts under £150.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contracts satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

All tenders must be enclosed in a separate envelope, marked "Tender for Forage," and deposited in the box at the Government Stores, King street; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Stores and Transport Office, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known by *Gazette* notice, and by letter to accepted tenderers.

CONDITIONS.

1. The hay to be eaten, good, sound, and sweet; the straw to be wheat, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats (colonial grown) and bran to be sound and sweet and of the best description.

2. The supplies are for police and telegraph horses, and are to be delivered on the order of the officer in charge of the district or station. The quantities stated in the schedule being only approximate, it must be understood that the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned; and should new telegraph stations be formed, or additional horses be required to be stationed in any of the districts tendered for, the supplies required may be drawn from the contractor. The excess over the estimate will not, however, exceed during the whole year 50 per cent. of the estimated quarterly consumption.

3. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by the particulars of quantity, showing the gross weight, the tare, and the net weight, to be endorsed on the back of the order, which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

4. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the District, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.

5. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

6. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the board is to be considered final.
