WEST CHANNEL, PORT PHILLIP BAY.

Commanders of vessels, pilots, and others navigating the West Channel are hereby informed that the hull of the schooner *Sea Bird*, which was stranded on the western bank of the West Channel, on the 19th June, 1867, having drifted into eighteen (18) feet water, close to the western bank, its position has been marked by a wreck buoy.

The following bearings taken from the wreck marks its position—

West Channel Lightship N. 84° E.
No. 7 Black Buoy S. 35° W.

The wreck lies outside the channel of navigation.

 (31 Vict. No. 310), it is amongst other things enacted
 that this Part (that is to say, Part II.) of this Act shall apply to
 all places where the Part of the Act thereby repealed, or any por-
 tion thereof, has been in force, and all or some of the provisions
 of this Part shall also apply to every such city, town, borough,
 shire, district, or place in Victoria as the Governor in Council
 shall by Proclamation direct; and the Governor in Council may
 at any time, and from time to time, alter, repeal, or revoke any
 such Proclamation theretofore or thereafter made: Now there-
 fore I, the Governor of Victoria, in pursuance of the provisions
 of the said Act, and in exercise of the power thereby conferred,
 do, with the advice of the Executive Council, by this my Pro-
 clamations direct that all the provisions of Part II. of the said
 Act shall apply to each of the Boroughs hereinafter mentioned,

RULE 30 AMENDED.

The local committee of each such school shall be entitled to receive annually a sum not exceeding £200 in aid of the salary of the superintendent of male teachers in training, and not exceeding £150 in aid of the salary of the superintendent of the female teachers in training; and also for each male teacher in training who shall have successfully passed the examinations and stood the tests hereafter mentioned, payment at a rate not exceeding £45 per annum, and for each female not exceeding £40 per annum; and in addition to the foregoing payments the committee shall be entitled to claim a bonus of £10 for each teacher in training who shall have received a teacher's certificate, and a second bonus of £10 for each such teacher in training as shall at a subsequent examination have obtained a first-class certificate of the second year.
