WEST CHANNEL, PORT PHILLIP BAY.

Commanders of vessels, pilots, and others navigating the West Channel are hereby informed that the hull of the schooner Sea Bird, which was stranded on the western bank of the West Channel, on the 19th June, 1867, having drifted into eighteen (18) feet water, close to the western bank, its position has been marked by a wreck buoy.

The following bearings taken from the wreck marks its rossition—

West Channel Lightship N. 84° E. No. 7 Black Buoy S. 35° W.

The wreck lies outside the channel of navigation.
