REGISTRAR-GENERAL'S REPORT ON THE VITAL STATISTICS OF MELBOURNE AND SUBURBS DURING THE MONTH OF MAY, 1868.

ACTUAL Daily Mortality of persons of both sexes under and over five years of age in the Statistical District of Melbourne and suburbs, embracing a radius of ten miles, and including the Statistical Sub-districts of Melbourne Proper, East Melbourne, North Melbourne and Carlton, Fitz Roy Municipality, East Collingwood, Richmond, Jika-jika parish (exclusive of North Melbourne, Collingwood, and Richmond), South Yarra and Prahran, Emerald Hill and Sandridge, St. Kilda and Brighton, Doutta Galla and Keilor, Boroondara and Heidelberg, Cut-paw-paw parish, and the shipping in Hobson's Bay; also, the Temperature in the shade at the Melbourne Observatory, calculated upon a reduced mean corresponding with that of twenty-four hourly observations taken on each day during the month of May, 1868:—

The mortality of May was slightly above the average, and was also rather higher than that of April. The mean temperature of the month was lower by 7 of a degree than the average during nine years.

Deaths of males and females were in the relative proportions of 55 and 45 per cent. Forty-five per cent. of the deaths were of children who had not attained their fifth year against 43 per cent. in May, 1867; 47 per cent. in May, 1866; 56 per cent. in May, 1865; 58 per cent. in May, 1864; 52 per cent. in May, 1863; 54 per cent. in May, 1862; 53 per cent. in May, 1861; and 56 per cent. in May, 1860.

Twenty deaths were recorded for the 16th, 18 for the 26th, and 16 for the 24th of the month. These were the highest numbers. The lowest were 6 for the first, and the same for the last day of the month.

Seven deaths of persons over 75 years of age occurred during the month, viz.:—Those of a female aged 76 of paralysis, of a female aged 78 of heart disease, of a carpenter aged 79 of old age, of a female aged 80 of old age, of a carpenter aged 80 of tumor, of a female aged 82 of apoplexy, and of a gentleman aged 84 of old age.

Nine violent deaths took place during the month, of which, 1 was attributed to suicide and the remainder to accident. The suicidal death was that of a male described as a dealer, who poisoned himself with strychnine. The particulars of the others are as follow:—A midshipman, aged 21, died of a fractured spine, caused by falling into the hold of a ship; a laborer, aged 30, of a fractured skull, caused by a fall; a ship's butcher, aged 34, of a fractured skull, caused in a manner not stated; a gentleman, aged 36, of a fractured skull, caused by being knocked down by a cab; a farmer, aged 60, of internal injuries, caused by a fall from a horse; a female, aged 64, from the effects of burns received whilst drunk; a police magistrate, aged 40, from the effects of a snake bite; and a laborer, aged 35, of drowning at the Yarra Bend Asylum.

Fifty-seven deaths, or 17 per cent. of the whole, occurred in public institutions, viz.:—Thirty-six in the Melbourne Hospital, 2 in the Lying-in-Hospital, 6 in the Benevolent Asylum, 1 in the Immigration Hospital, 2 in the Immigrants' Home, 3 in the Industrial Schools, 5 in the Yarra Bend Asylum, and 2 in the Carlton Asylum.

NOTE.—The Melbourne Hospital is in Melbourne Proper, the Reformatory Asylum in North Melbourne and Carlton, the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum in Jika-jika parish (remainder of), and the Industrial Schools in South Yarra and Prahran.

* This calculation is made upon the population at the last census, instead of the present population, as there are no means of estimating the changes which have taken place in the different sub-districts since the census was taken. It is believed that the present population of the whole district of Melbourne and suburbs amounts to 165,000. If this be correct, the mortality of the month under review would indicate a proportion of 2.08 deaths to every 1000 persons living.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 154, of which 78, or nearly 51 per cent., were of males, and 76, or about 49 per cent., were of females. Of those dying, 81 were under one year of age, 36 were between one and two years, 17 were between two and three, 13 were between three and four, and 7 were between four and five.

The persons dying at a more advanced age than five years numbered 189, of which 112, or about 59 per cent., were males, and 77, or nearly 41 per cent., were females; 16 were between five and ten, 5 were between ten and fifteen, 12 were between fifteen and twenty, 12 were between twenty and twenty-five, 13 were between twenty-five and thirty, 19 were between thirty and thirty-five, 32 were between thirty-five and forty, 19 were between forty and forty-five, 12 were between forty-five and fifty, 11 were between fifty and fifty-five, 11 were between fifty-five and sixty, 9 were between sixty and sixty-five, 4 were between sixty-five and seventy, 7 were between seventy and seventy-five, 3 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 4 were eighty and upwards.

The number of deaths from zymotic diseases fell from 124 in April to 117 in May, and their proportion to the whole mortality from 37 per cent. in the former, to 34 per cent. in the latter month. In May, scarlatina and diphtheria caused 41 deaths against 39 in April; croup caused 11 deaths against 4, and typhoid and infantile fever caused 17 deaths against 12. On the other hand, whooping-cough caused only 3 deaths against 17. Dysentery and diarrhoea caused 30 deaths both in April and May. Thirty-seven deaths resulted from phthisis in May against no more than 23 in April.

WHEREAS by a Statute of the Parliament of Victoria, No. 310, intituled *An Act to amend the Laws relating to or affecting Public Health* it is enacted, that, if at any time before the coming into operation of this Act any land shall have been set apart or used as a burial ground or shall have been conveyed to trustees for the purpose of the interment of the dead, the Governor in Council may, by Order, direct that such land or any part thereof shall, subject to the trusts, if any, upon which such land was conveyed, be a cemetery within the meaning of any law then in force relating to public cemeteries, or shall be annexed and united to any cemetery under such law, and thereupon and subject to the trusts, if any, aforesaid, and subject with the limitations thereafter provided to all rights of exclusive interment, if any, in such land acquired by purchase or otherwise before the coming into operation of such Order, the said land or part thereof shall be a cemetery or part of a cemetery, as the case may be, within the meaning of such law, and the trustees of such cemetery, if any, and the trustees who may be appointed for the united cemetery, as the case may be, shall have the same powers and be subject to all the same obligations and liabilities, and may be removed in like manner as trustees of public cemeteries under such law: Provided that no such Order shall take effect until three months notice thereof shall have been given in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas all that piece or parcel of land situate in the town of Belfast, at Port Fairy, in our said colony, known as the Old Burial Ground, has been used and set apart as a burial ground, and part of it has been conveyed to trustees: And whereas it is desirable that such land should be declared a cemetery within the meaning of *The Cemeteries Statute 1864*, being the law now in force relating to public cemeteries: Now therefore His Excellency Sir John Henry Thomas Manners Sutton, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor of the colony of Victoria, doth, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the same, by this Order direct that the said land situate at Belfast, aforesaid, shall be a cemetery within the meaning of *The Cemeteries Statute 1864*, subject however to the trusts, if any, upon which such land or any part thereof was conveyed, and subject to all rights of exclusive interment, if any, acquired by purchase or otherwise before the coming into operation of this Order.

THE ECHUCA ROAD DISTRICT ADDED TO.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1863* it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time, if it shall seem fit, to add to any district not divided into subdivisions, or to any subdivision, or separately to two or more subdivisions of a district so divided, any portion of the colony actually adjoining to such district or subdivision, as the case may be, and not lying within the limits of the city of Melbourne or town of Geelong, or of any municipal or road district; and every such portion so added shall thereupon become and be part of such first-mentioned district to all intents and purposes, and of the subdivision, if any, to which the same shall have been added: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the eighth day of February, 1864, a road district was proclaimed under the designation of "The Echuca Road District": And whereas it has seemed fit to the Governor in Council to add to the said road district the area of territory lying eastward of the junction of the rivers Murray and Goulburn and extending to the Owens River, being a portion of the colony adjoining to such district, and not lying within the limits of the above-mentioned city and town, or any municipal or road district: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby add to the Echuca Road District a portion of the colony adjoining to such district (such portion not lying within the city or town above mentioned, or any municipal or road district), in accordance with the above-recited provisions of the said Act; and do re-define the whole of the said road district added to as aforesaid, in manner following, that is to say:—

THE ECHUCA ROAD DISTRICT.—Starting at the junction of the Campaspe River with the north boundary of allotment 4, section 8, parish of Elmore, and by the north boundaries of allotments 4, 5, and 1, to the north-west angle of allotment 1, same parish; thence southerly six chains eighty-three links by the west boundary of said allotment 1; thence about eleven hundred and sixty-six chains by a line 278° 30', the bearings being here and hereinafter right-handed from true north, to a line 8° 30' from the south-west angle of allotment 2, section 20, Huntly parish; thence in that last direction to Mount Hope Creek, and by that creek to its junction with the margin of Kow Swamp, and by the eastern margin of

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1863*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for ten or more inhabitants of any part of Victoria not lying within the limits of the city of Melbourne or town of Geelong, or of any municipal or road district, and of whom each one shall possess property rateable under the said Act within the area next thereafter mentioned, to sign and present to the Governor a petition setting forth that the area, which shall by metes and bounds be described in such petition, contains not less than forty square miles, and rateable property whereof the net annual value is not less than Five thousand pounds, and praying that such area may be constituted a road district; and it is also enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, upon being satisfied that the statements set forth in the petition are true, and that it is desirable to comply with the prayer thereof, to constitute such part of Victoria, under such name as shall in and by the same Order in Council be assigned thereto, a new road district; and the words "proclaimed district," where used in the said Act, shall be deemed to mean such new district: And whereas a petition signed by more than ten inhabitants of the area or part of Victoria hereinafter described, possessing rateable property in such area, has been presented to the Governor, setting forth the matters and things required by the said Act, and due notice of such petition has been published as provided by the said Act, and in compliance with the prayer thereof, an Order in Council bearing even date herewith, has been made, to constitute the said area a new road district: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby constitute and proclaim the part of Victoria hereinafter described to be a new road district, under the name assigned thereto in and by the Order in Council hereinbefore mentioned, that is to say:—

THE ALEXANDRA ROAD DISTRICT.—Starting at the junction of Home Creek and the Goulburn River; thence true north to the boundary of Angelsea county; thence by that boundary to the source of Merton Creek; following thence the waters of Merton Creek to the Goulburn River; thence up the Goulburn and Jerusalem rivers, as far as the latter coincides with the boundary of Torbreck Run; thence by the boundaries of Torbreck, Thornton, Acheron, Niagara, and Wanegarwen, including those runs, to the starting point.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1862* it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon or within five miles of any gold-field, or in or within five miles of any town not contained in any municipal district, or within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land to be a municipal common, or a gold-fields common, or a town common, or a farmers' common respectively, as the case may be: And whereas by *The Amending Land Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold

within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected under *The Land Act 1862*, or selected or leased under the now reciting Act, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land a farmers' common; when one-eighth part of any agricultural area has been selected under *The Land Act 1862*, or selected or leased under the now reciting Act, the Governor in Council may proclaim any unselected and unleased portion of such agricultural area, not exceeding twice the quantity so selected and leased, to be a temporary common for the use of such selectors and lessees; and it is also enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common theretofore or thereafter to be proclaimed or re-proclaimed, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of *The Land Act 1862* and the now reciting Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby increase the commons hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, that is to say:—

TRUGANINA CEMETERY.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE TRUGANINA GENERAL CEMETERY.

ALL charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the vault or grave is opened.

2. Applications for permission to make a vault or erect a monument in the cemetery to be made to the trustees. Permission in the form contained in Schedule A will be granted to applicants, on payment of the required charges.

3. The charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in the cemetery, provided that satisfactory evidence be given to the trustees that the deceased was without means, and that the relatives or friends are unable to pay the costs and charges.

4. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but when a brick grave or vault is required it must be constructed by the applicant under the direction of the trustees, or of some person appointed by them. No grave to be less than four feet deep.

5. Orders for interment to be given to the secretary, or other person appointed by the trustees, between the hours of Eight o'clock a.m. and Six o'clock p.m., and not less than six working hours before the time fixed for the funeral. The particulars required in Schedule B must be stated when giving the order.

6. The time appointed for the funeral must be the time of arrival at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.

7. The hours appointed for interment are from Eight o'clock a.m. until Six o'clock p.m., from 1st September to 30th April, and from Eight o'clock a.m. to Four o'clock p.m. from 1st May to the 31st August.

8. The plans of all vaults, monuments, gravestones, and fences proposed to be erected, must first be submitted to the trustees for approval.

9. All monuments, tablets, and fences are to be kept in proper condition, at the expense of the owners, or they may be removed without notice, by order of the trustees.

10. Every coffin in a vault must be bricked in and cemented, or covered by a slab of freestone, slate, or iron.

11. If an interment is to be made in any privat vault or grave, the consent of the owner (in writing) must be left with the order.

12. A plan of the cemetery and register will be kept by the secretary.

13. No person employed by the trustees will be permitted to accept any gratuity for the discharge of his duties.

14. Any person who shall wantonly or wilfully do, or cause to be done, any damage to the cemetery or its monuments, fences, or ornaments, will be prosecuted as the law directs.

15. All meetings of the trustees to be convened by circular from the secretary.

16. The trustees reserve the right to alter these regulations and charges from time to time, subject to the approval of His Excellency the Governor in Council.
