## IMPORTATION OF GRAPES, ETC., FROM QUEENSLAND.

WHEREAS the disease known as "Oidium" is prevalent in Queensland, in consequence of which the Parliament of New South Wales have judged it expedient to pass an Act prohibiting the importation of vines, &c.: And whereas it is desirable to prevent the introduction of the disease in question into this colony, merchants and others are hereby warned against importing grape-vines, grape-vine cuttings, or grapes from the colony of Queensland.

A copy of the New South Wales Act above referred to is attached for general information.

## ANNO TRICESIMO PRIMO VICTORIÆ REGINÆ. No. XIII.

*An Act to prohibit the Importation of Grape-vines Grape-vine cuttings and Grapes. [Assented to 23rd December, 1867.]*

*Preamble.*—Whereas it is desirable to prevent the disease known as Oidium. Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows:—

1. *Importation of grape-vines vine cuttings or grapes prohibited under a penalty.*—It shall not be lawful to import into the colony either by sea or land any grape-vines grape-vine cuttings or grapes and whosoever shall so import or attempt to import any such vines vine cuttings or grapes shall forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding Twenty pounds and all such vines vine cuttings or grapes imported or attempted to be imported contrary to the provisions of this section shall be forfeited and may be seized and destroyed by any officer of Customs or police officer. Provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor with the advice of

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the Executive Council by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* to exempt any place or places from the operation of this Act.

2. *Act not to apply to raisins or currants.*—Nothing herein contained shall apply to raisins or currants.

3. *Penalty on person wilfully obstructing constable.*—Whosoever shall wilfully obstruct any officer of Customs police officer or constable when acting in the execution of this Act shall forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding Ten pounds.

4. *Summary jurisdiction.*—All informations for offences against this Act may be heard and determined and all penalties under this Act may be imposed by any two justices of the peace in a summary way and may be recovered by distress and sale of the offender's goods. Provided however that every such information shall be laid within two months after the commission of the said offence.

5. *Appropriation of penalties.*—One moiety of any penalty imposed under the provisions of this Act shall go to the informer and the other moiety to the Colonial Treasurer to be by him carried over to the consolidated revenue fund.

6. *Short title and duration of Act.*—This Act shall come into operation on the first day of January One thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight and shall continue in force until the first day of January One thousand eight hundred and seventy and may be cited as the "Grape-vines and Grapes Importation Prohibition Act."

The value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule, will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c.

Security will be required in the amount of £20 for due fulfilment of the contract, either in Government debentures, bank deposit-receipt, or cash deposit, as the tenderer may elect.

Tenders must be accompanied by bank notes, or a bank draft in favor of the Chairman of the Tender Board, for ten per cent. of the amount of security required, which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers. Such deposit to be forfeited in the event of the successful tenderer failing to complete the security within the prescribed period.

The security must be completed within ten days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised, or another tender accepted.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders will be disqualified from tendering for Government supplies for a period of twelve months.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

Tenders, sealed and marked "Tender for Lamps, &c., for Victorian Railways," to be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Stores and Transport Office, King street, Melbourne.

#### CONDITIONS.

1. The whole of the articles required for the service of the Victorian Railways are to be in accordance with the samples and specifications, and in every respect to be of the very best description, quality, and manufacture, subject to the approval of the Engineer-in-Chief and the Traffic Superintendent. The goods will also have to prove satisfactory to the examination and tests of the Locomotive Superintendent, as the inspecting officer appointed by the Engineer-in-Chief; and should articles of any particular manufacture be ordered, the same are to be furnished at the rates set forth in the contract.

2. All orders for supplies under this contract must issue from the Secretary for Railways, and all goods must be delivered free of charge to the Railway Stores, Williamstown, unless otherwise directed by the secretary.

3. The contract entered into under this notice is not to be considered as being infringed or vitiated by the importation of stores for the Government service of the Victorian Railways, or by the purchase of articles manufactured in the penal establishments, or the manufacture of articles by the department.

4. The Government will not be bound to issue orders upon the contractor for all the articles enumerated in the schedule, but only for such articles, and such quantities of those articles as the Government may order from time to time; neither will the Government be bound to take from the contractor any larger supply of any of the articles than may be shown upon the orders which have been issued during the year, nor will they be bound to take any of the articles enumerated in the schedule for which orders have not been issued. Should the Government require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedule, the contractor will be bound to supply the same at the contract rate.

5. Delivery, as a rule, is to be of the full quantity ordered at one time; but all deliveries must be accompanied with detailed invoices or bills of parcels in duplicate, showing quantity, rate, and value, also the number of the order for the goods, otherwise the goods will not be received.

6. In the event of supplies ordered under this contract not being delivered within forty-eight hours, it will be competent for the Railway Storekeeper, on the order of the Secretary, to cancel the order and purchase the same, or such articles as may be suitable for the service, at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price will be deducted.

7. The contractor will be required to prepare his own account monthly, in the prescribed form, and render the same to the Railway Storekeeper for certification, previously to payment at the Treasury.

8. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the head of the department requiring the supply, as to the quality, the same is to be decided by a board of survey composed of persons named by the Government, and the decision of the board is to be considered final. Any expense incurred on account of the rejection of supplies by a board of survey will be charged to the contractor.

9. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense, if any, will be charged to the contractor.

10. The Railway Storekeeper will have power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior character, or not in accordance with the specification; it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected article and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense, if any, will be charged to him.

11. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or of delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Railway Storekeeper, to such mulct, not exceeding one-fourth the amount of the monthly account, as the Government may direct. It will also be in the power of the Government, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

12. It will be competent either for the contractor, on his own behalf, or for the Secretary for Railways on behalf of the Government, to terminate the contract, by giving a notice in writing, of three full calendar months to the opposite party, it being understood that such notice can be given only from the first day of a month, and within the period for which the contract is made.

13. In the event of any alteration in the Tariff affecting any of the items included in this Contract, the Government, or the Contractor, as may be the case, will make a proportionate allowance by way of deduction from, or increase of, the price of the item so affected.

14. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government.

Printed forms of tender and conditions of contract may be obtained from the Inspector of Stores, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge of police at each station, by whom also any information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

The tenders for each station will be accepted or rejected separately.

Tenders will be received for either oats, bran, hay, or straw; but if all be included in one tender, it may be accepted for one article only, if advisable.

Tenders must express the prices in words as well as in figures, and without alterations or erasures.

As much forage as the storage will accommodate will be ordered at a time for the convenience of contractors.

The price must be per ton for hay and straw, and per bushel of 40 lbs. for oats and 20 lbs for bran (net weight), including delivery at the stations and all charges; bags to be returned when empty.

Tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for one-third of the estimated amount of the contract, within ten days after the acceptance is notified. Two approved securities are required for contracts amounting to £150 and upwards, and one surety for contracts under £150.

6. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the board is to be considered final.

7. If the board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 5.

8. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue either to the public service or to the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 5.

9. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or of delay in delivering or replacing it when required will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct not exceeding £20, as the Government may direct. It will also be in the power of the Government, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

## BYE-LAW NO. 2.—FOR REGULATING THE ELECTION OF MANAGERS OF THE WANGARATTA TOWN COMMON.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1862*, section 69, and *The Amending Land Act 1865*, section 48, it is enacted that the Borough Council shall elect annually in such manner as they shall by bye-law prescribe three persons to be Managers of the Town Common: Now the Council of the Borough of Wangaratta, in pursuance of the powers aforesaid, do hereby, with the consent of His Excellency the Governor of the colony of Victoria in council, order and prescribe, That at the first meeting of the said council after the coming into operation of this bye-law the said council shall by a majority of votes of the councillors present elect three persons, being burgesses, to be Managers of the Wangaratta Town Common until the then next annual meeting of the said council. At each annual meeting of the said council the councillors shall in like manner elect three managers for the then ensuing year. And in case any one of such managers die, resign, or be ousted of his office of manager, then the office of such manager shall become and be vacant, and the councillors present at the meeting next after the occurrence of such vacancy shall in like manner elect some person being a Burgess as aforesaid to fill such vacancy, and the manager so elected shall continue in office so long only as the person in whose stead he was elected would have been entitled to continue manager.
