NEW ZEALAND DISEASED CATTLE ACT AMENDMENT ACT 1865.

THE following Proclamation, which has been extracted from the *New Zealand Government Gazette* of the 12th ultimo, is published for general information.

PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled *The Diseased Cattle Act Amendment Act 1865*, section four, the Governor may, by any Order in Council, from time to time annul, make void, or alter, or vary, and make anew any Orders in Council, regulations, appointments, or prohibitory or other declarations made and published by the Governor under the authority of *The Diseased Cattle Act 1861*, or of this Act, or by the Superintendent of any Province, under or in pursuance of any power delegated to him under any of the powers of delegation contained in the said Act: And whereas by section five of the said Amendment Act, "as to regulations, appointments, and prohibitory and other declarations made by Superintendents of Provinces, in pursuance of any powers delegated under the

powers of delegation contained in the said Act or this Act, the power of annulling, making void, or altering, or varying, or making anew any such regulations, appointments, or prohibitory or other declarations vested in the Governor by this Act, may from time to time be delegated by the Governor in Council by warrant under his hand to the Superintendent of any Province: And whereas the said Governor hath, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, delegated to William Rolleston, Esq., so long as he shall hold the office of Superintendent of the Province of Canterbury, all the powers which by the said fifth section of the said Amendment Act the Governor in Council is authorized to delegate: Now therefore I, the said William Rolleston, by virtue of such powers in me vested, do hereby proclaim and declare that after the date of the publication hereof in the *New Zealand Gazette* the several colonies of Australia (that is to say) the Colony of Victoria, of New South Wales, of Queensland, of South Australia, and Western Australia, as well as the Colony of Tasmania and the Colony of the Cape of Good Hope, shall be deemed to be infected districts within the meaning of the said Acts; and I do further proclaim and declare the following regulations for prohibiting the importation of cattle into the Province of Canterbury from such districts, and for the landing or driving of such cattle, and for the destroying of cattle imported, landed, or driven contrary to these regulations:—

1. If any person shall import any cattle from either or any of the said infected districts into the Province of Canterbury, unless upon quarantine ground, and after having obtained from an inspector of cattle a quarantine certificate, he shall be liable to a penalty of Fifty pounds for every head of cattle so imported into the Province of Canterbury.

2. If any person shall land or cause to be landed, or assist in landing, any cattle, coming from either of the said infected districts in or upon any part of the Province of Canterbury, unless upon a quarantine ground, and after having obtained a quarantine certificate, he shall be liable to a penalty of Fifty pounds for every head of cattle so landed.

3. It shall be lawful for and the duty of any inspector of cattle or police constable to destroy or cause to be destroyed any diseased cattle which shall be imported or landed contrary to these regulations.

4. If any person shall wilfully impede or obstruct any inspector of cattle or any police constable acting under the authority of these regulations, every person so offending may be taken before two Justices of the Peace, and shall be liable to a penalty of Fifty pounds.

5. These regulations shall take effect from and after the date of publication in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

TOWN AND VILLAGE SITES:—

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Amending Land Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council may from time to time, before or after the proclamation of any agricultural area, proclaim as a road or as a town or village any portion or portions of such area not selected, purchased, or leased, and not exceeding, if proclaimed as a town or village, six hundred and forty acres of the lands comprised in such area; and the lands in such town or village shall be sold by auction in the manner provided for the sale by public auction of lands not reserved for proclamation in such areas: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the respective areas of land hereinafter described as a town or village (as the case may be) within the meaning and in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

WOORNDOO (PARISH OF)—SITE FOR TOWN.—Six hundred and forty acres, more or less, county of Hampden, parish of Woornadoo: Commencing at the north-east angle of allotment 14 C, in the parish of Cobrakilluc, being a point on the right bank of Salt Creek; bounded thence by the north boundary of the said allotment, and by a line crossing the road from Hexham to Ararat, bearing west five chains eighty-four links to the east angle of allotment 40; thence by allotments 40, 33, and 37, bearing N. 25° 42' W. fifteen chains forty-three links, N. 72° 30' W. forty-four chains eighty-three links, and S. 72° 30' W. twenty-chains fifty-two links, to the north-east angle of allotment 36; thence by a line crossing the road from Chatsworth to Geelong, bearing north three chains four links, to the south-east angle of allotment 121, parish of Woornadoo; thence by that allotment bearing north seventy-four chains seven links; thence by a road one chain wide, bearing east eighty-five chains fifty links, more or less, to Salt Creek aforesaid; and thence by that creek, bearing southerly to the point of commencement.—(63 R. 4615.)

WHOROUPLY (PARISH OF) SITE FOR VILLAGE.—Thirty-six acres one rood thirty-seven perches, county unnamed, parish of Whorouply, being part of allotment 35: Commencing at the north-east angle of the said allotment; bounded thence by a

road bearing S. 2° 19' W. sixteen chains; thence by a line bearing N. 88° 48' W. twenty-two chains fifty links; thence by a line bearing N. 2° 19' E. sixteen chains forty-two links; and thence by a road bearing S. 87° 41' E. twenty-two chains fifty links to the point of commencement.—(68 Q. 5976.)

At a Meeting of the Council of the City of Melbourne, held in the Council Chamber, in the temporary Town Hall, in the Western Market, in the said city, on the 29th day of June, 1868, at which were present—The Right Worshipful the Mayor, Councillor James Stewart Butters (presiding); Alderman Edward Cohen, John Harbison, John Thomas Smith, and George Wragge, and Councillors Samuel Amess, Orlando Fenwick, Robert Flockhart, Abraham Linacre, Thomas Moubay, Alexander McBean, Thomas McPherson, Thomas Reed, Henry Sanders, Alexander Kennedy Smith, Joseph Story, John Walker, and William Williams, being more than one-third of the members of the said council, it was resolved and ordered, That whereas by an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of New South Wales, 14 Victoria No. 20, intituled *An Act for regulating the formation, drainage, and repair of Streets, Courts, and Alleys on private Property within the City of Melbourne*, it is amongst other things enacted that where any street, court, or alley, on private property in the city of Melbourne, shall not be or shall not have been sufficiently paved, flagged, macadamised, levelled, drained, and sewered, or otherwise completed and repaired to the satisfaction of the council of the said city, it shall be lawful for the said council at any time, and from time to time, by any order under the hand of the Mayor or Town Clerk of the said city for the time being respectively, to order that any such street, court, or alley, or any part thereof, shall be freed from obstruction, paved, flagged, macadamised, levelled, drained, and sewered, or otherwise completed or repaired, in such manner, and within such time as to the said council may appear expedient; and thereupon the owners of the tenements adjoining or abutting upon such street, court, or alley, on each side thereof, shall, in such manner and within such time as shall be expressed in such order, at their respective costs, charges, and expenses, remove all obstructions, and well and sufficiently pave, flag, macadamise, level, drain, and sewer, or otherwise complete or repair so much of the said street, court, or alley, to the centre thereof, as may be opposite to and co-extensive with their respective tenements, adjoining or abutting on such streets, courts, or alleys respectively:

And whereas by the Act of the Parliament of Victoria, No. 178, intituled *An Act to further alter and amend the Laws relating to the Corporations of the City of Melbourne and of the Town of Geelong respectively, and to extend and apply other existing Acts thereto*, it is amongst other things enacted that the words "tenements adjoining or abutting on such street, court, or alley," where used in the first hereinbefore recited Act, shall be held and taken to mean all tenements or premises actually abutting upon, and accessible from, and communicating with such street, court, or alley, whether the owners or occupiers thereof have or have not a right to use or do commonly use the same: And that the word "owner," used in the said Act, shall apply to and be held to include agent of an owner, but only in so far as to enable such agent to apply to the defrayal of expenses incurred in the formation, drainage, and repair of such street, court, or alley, under the authority hereof, moneys of his principal, of which he shall be in the receipt or possession, accruing from tenements lawfully chargeable for such expenses:

And that the said Act for regulating the formation, drainage and repair of streets, courts, and alleys on private property within the city of Melbourne, shall extend and apply to the entire limits of the said city:

And that the apportionment of the expenses incurred by the council of the city of Melbourne, in the formation, drainage, and repair of every such street, court, or alley, on private property, shall be made proportionate to the extent of the area of the land of each of the several owners which shall be so situated as to have or be capable of obtaining access to such street, court, or alley, at the time of or in consequence of the formation or repair of such street, court, or alley:

And whereas the streets, courts, or alleys enumerated in the

schedule to this order annexed, marked A, have not been sufficiently paved, flagged, macadamized, levelled, drained, and sewered, or otherwise completed or repaired to the satisfaction of the council of the city of Melbourne:

Be it now ordered by the council of the said city, that the streets, courts, or alleys enumerated in the schedule to this order annexed, marked A, shall, within ten days from the date of this order's coming into operation, be freed from obstruction, paved, flagged, macadamized, levelled, drained, and sewered in such manner as is expressed in the schedule to this order annexed and marked B. And it is hereby notified to the owners respectively of the tenements adjoining or abutting upon the streets, courts, or alleys enumerated in the schedule to this order annexed, marked A, that if they or any of them shall neglect or omit to remove the obstructions, and pave, flag, macadamise, level, drain, and sewer, or otherwise complete and repair the street, court, or alley on which their respective tenements adjoin or abut, in the manner and within the time expressed in this order, then the council of the said city will remove all obstructions in the said streets, courts, or alleys, and pave, flag,

SCHEDULE B.

Referred to in the foregoing Order.

Manner in which the streets, courts, and alleys enumerated in Schedule A, referred to in this Order, are ordered to be freed from obstruction, paved, kerbed, flagged, macadamised, levelled, drained, and sewered.

The natural soil is to be reduced or made up, as the case may require, so that the longitudinal section of the whole street, court, or alley, shall in no part have an inclination of less than one (1) in eighty (80), and where practicable, the entire length is to form one incline.

In laying on any stuff, it is to be spread in layers of not more than one foot thick.

The transverse section of the street, court or alley (where the water-channels are on the sides), is to show a roadway whose crown shall be one inch above the kerbs of the footways, and the fall from the crown to the water-channels shall not be less than one (1) in twenty-five (25).

Each street, court or alley shall have a bluestone pitched water-channel, either at each of its sides or in its centre, of sufficient capacity to meet the required drainage for the same, the width of said channel or channels in no instance to be less than two (2) feet.

The pitchers to be nine (9) inches wide, and from six (6) to nine (9) inches deep, and from nine (9) to fourteen (14) inches long, with upright sides, set in sand, and well rammed down to such section as the city surveyor may direct.

The bottom of the channel is to be seven (7) inches below the kerbstones of footpaths.

On either side of the roadway there is to be, where practicable, a footpath not more than three (3) feet wide, and these are to be separated from the roadway by a neatly dressed bluestone kerb from two (2) to four (4) feet long, six (6) inches wide, and fifteen (15) inches deep.

The footways are to be covered with a coat of gravel three (3) inches thick, and the surface is to fall towards the channel at the rate of one (1) in ten (10).

The roadway is to be covered with a coat of clean bluestone metal, 24 inch gauge, nine (9) inches deep in the centre, and six (6) inches deep on the sides, and this, when necessary, covered over with a coat of good loam two (2) inches thick, and rolled with a corporation iron roller.

Whenever private residences lead from the streets, courts, or alleys, they are to be paved to the full width (of building line) with bluestone pitchers similar to those used in the channels.

All entrances from adjoining streets shall be pitched and kerbed either with four (4) inch bluestone cubes or nine (9) inch pitchers, as the city surveyor may direct, the sides being well supported with eight (8) inch stone kerbing.

The whole of the work must be done under the inspection, and subject to the approval, of the city surveyor, who is authorized to order any deviation from these general principles which the peculiarities of any case may require.

KANGAROO GROUND FARMERS' COMMON. RULES AND REGULATIONS.

THAT every occupier of purchased land entitled to the use of the said Common shall be permitted to depasture one head of cattle for every Two Pounds (£2) value of property occupied by him or her, &c.

2. That the following assessment per annum be paid by commoners.

3. That every person resident on the common, and holding a miner's right for any present year (as may be), shall be entitled to depasture three (3) head of cattle.

4. That the assessment be paid half-yearly in advance, and that the half-year, in each case, shall terminate on 30th June and 31st December in each respectively. And any person failing to pay the said assessment or prescribed fees within one week after they become due shall be liable to have his or her cattle or horses, &c., impounded.

5. That a register of all cattle, horses, &c., be kept at the school-house, Kangaroo Ground, and the half-yearly assessment or fees be paid to the registrar at the time of registering; and all cattle, &c., must have the private brand of persons registering.

6. That no entire horses or bulls be allowed on the common over nine (9) months old without the permission of the managers, and that all foals or calves, if branded, or if attained the age of six (6) months, be chargeable with the aforesaid assessment or fees.

7. That any commoner be permitted to withdraw his or her cattle depasturing during any period of the half-year, and replace them by others.

8. Any person found depasturing more cattle than he or she has taken out a license for, the managers will have the power to cancel the license, and prevent such person the use of the common during that year, or be entitled to exact double fees for the excess.

9. That all cattle suspected to be diseased shall be removed by the owners after twenty-four (24) hours' notice in writing to such owners or persons whose private brand appears on the cattle, as entered in the register; and if not removed at the expiration of the said notice the managers will have the power to destroy the cattle forthwith.

10. That cattle (milking cows excepted) depasturing on the common are not to be disturbed without giving due notice to the herdsman.

11. That the managers are not to be held responsible for any neglect or irregularity of the herdsman; and the Road Board can alter or amend these rules when considered necessary.
