INCORPORATION OF THE INGLEWOOD HOSPITAL.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-seventh day of July, 1868.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor
Major-General Sir Trevor Chute, K.C.B. | Mr. G. P. Smith

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-seventh year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled *An Act for Hospitals and Charitable Institutions*, it is amongst other things enacted, that any institution established for the cure of disease,

or for the relief of diseased, aged, incurable, or destitute persons, and supported in whole or in part by the voluntary contributions of not less than fifty persons, each of whom shall have paid not less than One pound per annum or Twenty pounds in one donation, may be incorporated as thereafter mentioned, and all persons who shall have paid as aforesaid shall be deemed contributors within the meaning of the said Act; and it is also enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, on the receipt of a petition signed by not less than twenty-five of the said persons praying that such institution may be incorporated, to cause the substance or prayer of such petition to be published in the *Government Gazette*, and (if no counter-petition, signed by an equal or greater number of such persons, shall have been delivered at the office of the Chief Secretary within one month after the date of such publication) the Governor in Council may declare the contributors for the time being to such institution to be, and they shall thereupon become and continue, a body politic and corporate by the style and title named in the Order in Council, and shall have perpetual succession and a common seal: And whereas the Governor in Council has received a petition signed by not less than twenty-five contributors to the institution known as the Inglewood Hospital, within the Borough of Inglewood, praying that the said institution may be incorporated: And whereas the substance or prayer of the said petition has been published in the *Government Gazette*, and no counter-petition has been delivered at the office of the Chief Secretary within one month after the date of such publication: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order declare the contributors to the said institution to be a body politic and corporate in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, in manner following, that is to say:

The contributors for the time being to the institution called and known as the Inglewood Hospital, situate within the Borough of Inglewood, are hereby declared to be a body politic and corporate by the style and title of "The Inglewood Hospital."

And the Honorable James McCulloch, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

The mortality in June was higher than in the same month of any of the previous eight years, except 1866. The daily average of deaths was not, however, so high as in May. The mean temperature was within a fraction of the average.

Of the whole number who died, males were in the proportion of 51 per cent., and females of 49 per cent. Children under 5 were in the proportion of 45 per cent., against 51 per cent. in June, 1867; 41 per cent. in June, 1866; 43 per cent. in June, 1865; 45 per cent. in June, 1864; 31 per cent. in June, 1863; 43 per cent. in June, 1862; 51 per cent. in June, 1861; and 49 per cent. in June, 1860.

The 16th, 17th, and 25th, on each of which 16 deaths occurred, were the days of highest mortality. The day of lowest mortality was the 4th, for which only 3 deaths were recorded.

One male and 4 females over 75 years of age died during the month. The male was 83 years old, and died of old age. The females were, respectively, 77, 79, 81, and 85 years old. The first died of congestion of the lungs, and the others of old age.

Nine violent deaths took place, of which 8 resulted from accident and 1 from suicide. The accidental deaths occurred as follows:—An engraver, 17 years of age, died of concussion of the brain caused by an accidental fall; a male, aged 26, died of the effects of a fall from a horse; a laborer, aged 26, and another aged 36, died from injuries caused by earth falling on them; an accountant, aged 35, died from the effects of a fall in a water-channel; a gunner in the Royal Artillery, aged 28, was shot whilst on duty as a marker at the Williamstown butts; a child, 1½ years old, died of a scald; and an infant, aged 5 weeks, was suffocated in bed. The suicidal death was that of a female aged 38, who died of wounds in the throat and abdomen, self-inflicted whilst in a state of delirium tremens.

The deaths in public institutions numbered 73, or 23 per cent. of the whole. Of these 45 occurred in the Melbourne Hospital, 2 in the Lying-in Hospital, 1 in the Military Hospital, 8 in the Benevolent Asylum, 4 in the Immigrants' Home, 3 in the Industrial Schools, 1 in St. Vincent de Paul's Orphanage, 4 in the Yarra Bend and 1 in the Carlton Lunatic Asylum, 1 in the Melbourne Gaol, 2 in the Pentridge Stockade, and 1 in the Hulk *Success*.

* This calculation is made upon the population at the last census, instead of the present population, as there are no means of estimating the changes which have taken place in the different sub-districts since the census was taken. It is believed that the present population of the whole district of Melbourne and suburbs amounts to 170,000. If this be correct, the mortality of the month under review would indicate a proportion of 1.55 deaths to every 1,000 persons living.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 143, of which 63, or about 44 per cent., were of males, and 80, or nearly 56 per cent., were of females. Of those dying, 75 were under one year of age, 29 were between one and two years, 15 were between two and three, 14 were between three and four, and 10 were between four and five.

At a Meeting of the Council of the City of Melbourne, held in the Council Chamber, in the temporary Town Hall, in the Western Market, in the said city, on the 29th day of June, 1863, at which were present—The Right Worshipful the Mayor, Councillor James Stewart Butters (presiding); Alderman Edward Cohen, John Harbison, John Thomas Smith, and George Wragge, and Councillors Samuel Amess, Orlando Fenwick, Robert Flockhart, Abraham Linacre, Thomas Moubay, Alexander McBean, Thomas McPherson, Thomas Reed, Henry Sanders, Alexander Kennedy Smith, Joseph Story, John Walker, and William Williams, being more than one-third of the members of the said council, it was resolved and ordered, That whereas by an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of New South Wales, 14 Victoria No. 20, intituled *An Act for regulating the formation, drainage, and repair of Streets, Courts, and Alleys on private Property within the City of Melbourne*, it is amongst other things enacted that where any street, court, or alley, on private property in the city of Melbourne, shall not be or shall not have been sufficiently paved, flagged, macadamised, levelled, drained, and sewered, or otherwise completed and repaired to the satisfaction of the council of the said city, it shall be lawful for the said council at any time, and from time to time, by any order under the hand of the Mayor or Town Clerk of the said city for the time being respectively, to order that any such street, court, or alley, or any part thereof, shall be freed from obstruction, paved, flagged, macadamised, levelled, drained, and sewered, or otherwise completed or repaired, in such manner, and within such time as to the said council may appear expedient; and thereupon the owners of the tenements adjoining or abutting upon such street, court, or alley, on each side thereof, shall, in such manner and within such time as shall be expressed in such order, at their respective costs, charges, and expenses, remove all obstructions, and well and sufficiently pave, flag, macadamise, level, drain, and sewer, or otherwise complete or repair so much of the said street, court, or alley, to the centre thereof, as may be opposite to and co-extensive with their respective tenements, adjoining or abutting on such streets, courts, or alleys respectively:

And whereas by the Act of the Parliament of Victoria, No. 178, intituled *An Act to further alter and amend the Laws relating to the Corporations of the City of Melbourne and of the Town of Geelong respectively, and to extend and apply other existing Acts thereto*, it is amongst other things enacted that the words "tenements adjoining or abutting on such street, court, or alley," where used in the first hereinbefore recited Act, shall be held and taken to mean all tenements or premises actually abutting upon, and accessible from, and communicating with such street, court, or alley, whether the owners or occupiers thereof have or have not a right to use or do commonly use the same: And that the word "owner," used in the said Act, shall apply to and be held to include agent of an owner, but only in so far as to enable such agent to apply to the defrayal of expenses incurred in the formation, drainage, and repair of such street, court, or alley, under the authority hereof, moneys of his principal, of which he shall be in the receipt or possession, accruing from tenements lawfully chargeable for such expenses:

And that the said Act for regulating the formation, drainage and repair of streets, courts, and alleys on private property within the city of Melbourne, shall extend and apply to the entire limits of the said city:

And that the apportionment of the expenses incurred by the council of the city of Melbourne, in the formation, drainage, and repair of every such street, court, or alley, on private property, shall be made proportionate to the extent of the area of the land of each of the several owners which shall be so situated as to have or be capable of obtaining access to such street, court, or alley, at the time of or in consequence of the formation or repair of such street, court, or alley:

And whereas the streets, courts, or alleys enumerated in the

schedule to this order annexed, marked A, have not been sufficiently paved, flagged, macadamized, levelled, drained, and sewered, or otherwise completed or repaired to the satisfaction of the council of the city of Melbourne:

He it now ordered by the council of the said city, that the streets, courts, or alleys enumerated in the schedule to this order annexed, marked A, shall, within ten days from the date of this order's coming into operation, be freed from obstruction, paved, flagged, macadamised, levelled, drained, and sewered in such manner as is expressed in the schedule to this order annexed and marked B. And it is hereby notified to the owners respectively of the tenements adjoining or abutting upon the streets, courts, or alleys enumerated in the schedule to this order annexed, marked A, that if they or any of them shall neglect or omit to remove the obstructions, and pave, flag, macadamise, level, drain, and sewer, or otherwise complete and repair the street, court, or alley on which their respective tenements adjoin or abut, in the manner and within the time expressed in this order, then the council of the said city will remove all obstructions in the said streets, courts, or alleys, and pave, flag,

macadamise, level, drain, sewer, and otherwise complete or repair the same, or such parts thereof as shall not have been so done pursuant to this order; and will thereupon ascertain determine, and charge such respective owners with their several proportionate parts of the costs, charges, and expenses thereof, according to and co-extensive with their respective tenements adjoining or abutting on such street, court, or alley, proportionate to the extent of the area of the land of each of the several owners so situated as to have or be capable of obtaining access to such street, court, or alley, at the time of or in consequence of the formation or repair of such street, court, or alley, having regard in such apportionment to the state and condition in which the pavement, flagging, macadamising, levelling, draining and sewerage of such streets, courts, or alleys respectively, or any part thereof, shall or may be at the time of making this order.

SCHEDULE B.

Referred to in the foregoing Order.

Manner in which the streets, courts, and alleys enumerated in Schedule A, referred to in this Order, are ordered to be freed from obstruction, paved, kerbed, flagged, macadamised, levelled, drained, and sewered.

The natural soil is to be reduced or made up, as the case may require, so that the longitudinal section of the whole street, court, or alley, shall in no part have an inclination of less than one (1) in eighty (80), and where practicable, the entire length is to form one incline.

In laying on any stuff, it is to be spread in layers of not more than one foot thick.

The transverse section of the street, court or alley (where the water-channels are on the sides), is to show a roadway whose crown shall be one inch above the kerbs of the footways, and the fall from the crown to the water-channels shall not be less than one (1) in twenty-five (25).

Each street, court or alley shall have a bluestone pitched water-channel, either at each of its sides or in its centre, of sufficient capacity to meet the required drainage for the same, the width of said channel or channels in no instance to be less than two (2) feet.

The pitchers to be nine (9) inches wide, and from six (6) to nine (9) inches deep, and from nine (9) to fourteen (14) inches long, with upright sides, set in sand, and well rammed down to such section as the city surveyor may direct.

The bottom of the channel is to be seven (7) inches below the kerbstones of footpaths.

On either side of the roadway there is to be, where practicable, a footpath not more than three (3) feet wide, and these are to be separated from the roadway by a neatly dressed bluestone kerb from two (2) to four (4) feet long, six (6) inches wide, and fifteen (15) inches deep.

The footways are to be covered with a coat of gravel three (3) inches thick, and the surface is to fall towards the channel at the rate of one (1) in ten (10).

The roadway is to be covered with a coat of clean bluestone metal, 2½ inch gauge, nine (9) inches deep in the centre, and six (6) inches deep on the sides, and this, when necessary, covered over with a coat of good loam two (2) inches thick, and rolled with a corporation iron roller.

Whenever private residences lead from the streets, courts, or alleys, they are to be paved to the full width (of building line) with bluestone pitchers similar to those used in the channels.

All entrances from adjoining streets shall be pitched and kerbed either with four (4) inch bluestone cubes or nine (9) inch pitchers, as the city surveyor may direct, the sides being well supported with eight (8) inch stone kerbing.

The whole of the work must be done under the inspection, and subject to the approval, of the city surveyor, who is authorized to order any deviation from these general principles which the peculiarities of any case may require.
