BOROUGH OF BALLARAT.

BYE-LAW No. 2 A.—FOR LICENSING AND REGULATING HACKNEY CARRIAGES AND THE OWNERS AND DRIVERS THEREOF, PLYING FOR HIRE WITHIN THE BOROUGH OF BALLARAT.

WHEREAS by the second section of an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, No. 323, intituled *An Act to amend the Law relating to Boroughs, Shires, and Road Districts*, power is given to the council of every borough beyond the distance of eight miles from the corporate limits of the city of Melbourne or the town of Geelong, from time to time to make such bye-laws as they shall think fit for the licensing and regulating hackney carriages plying for hire within such borough, and the owners and drivers of such hackney carriages, and for fixing the situation and number of public stands for such hackney carriages, the number of persons to be carried in the same, and the amount of fares for time or distance to be paid for the use thereof.

And by the said recited Act it is enacted that the said section shall be read as part of the Act numbered 181.

And whereas it has been deemed expedient and necessary to make the following bye-law in reference to hackney carriages plying for hire within the borough of Ballarat.

Be it therefore ordered and directed by the council of the borough of Ballarat, as follows:—

HACKNEY CARRIAGES AND PROPRIETORS.

No Person to let to Hire a Hackney Carriage without a License.

1. No person shall let to hire or ply for hire with any hackney carriage at any place within the borough of Ballarat, unless such person shall have a license in force so to do under the provisions of this bye-law.

SCHEDULE I.—Every Person desiring a License for a Hackney Carriage to make a Requisition in Writing.

2. Every person desirous of obtaining a license to ply with or let to hire any hackney carriage as aforesaid must make a requisition to the council of the borough, in the form or to the effect contained in the first schedule hereto, in order that they may cause an inspection to be made of every carriage to be kept, used, or let to hire by virtue of such license; and every such requisition shall be signed by the proprietor or one of the proprietors of the carriage, in respect of which the license shall be applied for, or in the case of a body corporate or public company by an officer thereof, and therein shall be truly specified and set forth the description of carriage the license shall be required for, and whether to be drawn by one or more horses; and the christian name and surname of every person who shall be a proprietor or part proprietor of such carriage, or in the case of a body corporate or public company the proper title thereof, as also the name and places of residence or office of business of the proprietor or proprietors, body corporate, or public company.

SCHEDULE II.—And obtain a Certificate.

3. Upon receipt of such requisition the council shall cause an inspection to be made of every such carriage, and if the same shall be found to be in a fit and proper condition for public use, the inspecting officer of the borough council shall grant a certificate to that effect, and specify in such certificate the number of the carriage and the number of the persons to be carried in and by such carriage, in the form or to the effect in the second schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE III.—License to Issue.—Council may refuse, suspend, or revoke License.—Refusal, &c., to be endorsed on Requisition.

4. Upon production of such certificate at the office of the town clerk of the borough, a license in the form or to the effect in the third schedule hereto shall be granted, which shall be dated on the day on which the same shall be issued, and take effect from the date thereof until the first day of January thence next ensuing, or until the same shall be voluntarily surrendered by the party named therein or otherwise be determined, suspended, or revoked under the provisions hereinafter contained. Provided always that in regard of any such carriage the council of the borough may, if they think proper, refuse to grant any such license, or may suspend or revoke the same when granted in case it shall appear to such council, upon inspection or otherwise, that the carriage in respect of which such license shall be applied for or granted, or any horse or harness used with any such carriage is unserviceable or unsafe, or otherwise unfit for public accommodation or use, or that the person applying for or in possession of any license is an unfit person to hold the same by reason of his having been convicted of any felony or assault, or of drunkenness, or of any breach of the provisions of this or any other bye-law relating to hackney carriages, or by reason of the licenses having been issued upon a false requisition or representation, and in all cases of refusal, suspension, or revocation the council shall cause to be endorsed in writing upon the requisition for such license the ground for such refusal, suspension, or revocation.

Lamps to be placed on Carriages by Proprietors.

5. The proprietor of any licensed hackney carriage shall cause to be placed on such carriage, in such a position and manner as shall be satisfactory to the inspecting officer of the borough council, proper lamps, and the driver of such carriage shall keep the said lamps properly lighted whenever such carriage shall be used at any time between sunset and sunrise.

Particulars to be Painted on Hackney Carriages.

6. The proprietor of every licensed hackney carriage shall keep distinctly painted on the same, in some conspicuous place or places as the council may from time to time direct, and in large legible characters, the name of the borough, the number of the carriage, and the number of persons to be carried thereby as specified in the license; and the driver of any such hackney

carriage shall, if required by the hirer thereof, carry in and by such carriage the number of persons specified thereon, or any less number of persons.

The Council may cause Hackney Carriages to be inspected, and if not in a fit Condition may suspend License.

7. The borough council shall, as often as they may deem it necessary, cause an inspection to be made of all licensed hackney carriages, and of the harness and horse or horses used in drawing the same; and to that end require that all licensed carriages, harness, and horses to be inspected shall be produced before them, or before such persons as they shall appoint, at such times and places within the borough as they shall direct; and if any such carriage, harness, horse or horses shall at any time be in a condition unfit for public use, the council shall give notice (in writing) accordingly to the proprietor thereof, which notice shall be personally served upon such proprietor, or delivered at his usual place of residence; and if, after notice as aforesaid, any proprietor shall let to hire or ply for hire with such hackney carriage, harness, horse or horses whilst in a condition unfit for public use, the council may suspend, for such time as they shall deem proper, the license of the proprietor of such carriage.

Upon Death of a Person licensed to keep a Hackney Carriage the License may be transferred to the Widow or Child, and also to the Husband of a Woman deceased or on Marriage.

8. Whenever any person to whom any such license shall have been granted shall die during the continuance of such license, and shall leave a widow or child; and also whenever any woman to whom any such license shall have been granted shall marry during the continuance of such license, and such surviving widow, or the said child, or the husband of such woman shall continue to carry on the business of such deceased person, or of such woman respectively, the council may, upon the application of any such woman, child, or husband (as the case may be), and in the case of such deceased person, with the consent of his or her executors or administrators (if any), transfer by indorsement or otherwise as the council shall direct the said license to such widow, child, or husband respectively; and thereupon such widow, child, or husband shall be liable to all the provisions, regulations and penalties contained in this or any other bye-law relating to hackney carriages in the same manner as if such widow, child, or husband were the person to whom such license had been originally granted.

DRIVERS.

To be Licensed.

9. No person shall act as driver of any hackney carriage at any place within the Borough of Ballarat, unless such person shall have a license so to do granted to him under the authority of this bye-law.

SCHEDULE IV.—To make a Requisition in Writing.

10. Every person desirous of obtaining a license as a driver of any hackney carriage as aforesaid shall make a requisition in writing to the Borough Council in the form or to the effect in the fourth schedule hereto, accompanied by satisfactory certificates of good character, fitness for such situation, and of ability to drive, and every such requisition shall be signed by the person by whom such license is required, and in every such requisition there shall be truly specified and set forth the proper name and surname, and place of abode, and age of the person applying for such license, with all such further particulars as the council may require.

SCHEDULE V.—License to issue on Council being satisfied of the Character of the Applicant.—Council may refuse, suspend, or revoke License.

11. Upon receipt of such requisition, and the council being satisfied of the character of the applicant, a license in the form or to the effect of the 5th schedule hereto to act as a driver shall issue to the applicant, which shall take effect from the date thereof, and bear a distinctive number, and be dated on the day on which it shall be issued, and shall thence continue in force until voluntarily surrendered by the person named therein, or until otherwise determined, suspended, or revoked under the provisions herein contained; provided always that it shall and may be lawful for the council to refuse to grant any such license, or to suspend or revoke the same when granted in case it shall appear that the person applying for, or in possession of such license, is an unfit person to hold the same by reason of incapacity or of his having been convicted of any felony or assault, or of drunkenness, or of any offence against the provisions of this bye-law, or by reason of its having been issued on a false requisition or representation. But in all cases of refusal, suspension, or revocation, the council shall cause to be indorsed upon the requisition for such license the grounds of such refusal, suspension, or revocation.

Driver to deliver Ticket of Carriage.

12. The driver of every hackney carriage shall on each occasion when such carriage shall be hired, deliver to the hirer thereof a card, on which shall be printed, in legible letters and figures, the words "Borough of Ballarat," the driver's name, and the number of his license; and on the reverse side of the said card, in such form as the council may direct, a statement of the fares for the time being in force.

SCHEDULE VII.—Quantity of Luggage to be carried.

13. The driver of every licensed hackney carriage shall carry in or upon such carriage a reasonable quantity of luggage for every person hiring such carriage without any additional charge, except as provided by the seventh schedule hereto.

14. The driver of every hackney carriage shall at all times during his employment keep painted on some conspicuous place thereon, as the council may from time to time direct, his name and the number of his driver's license.

Driver to be in constant Attendance.

15. The driver of every hackney carriage shall be constantly attendant on the same when plying or engaged for hire.

Persons not to act as Drivers without consent of Proprietor.

16. The driver of any hackney carriage shall not suffer any other person to act as driver of such hackney carriage without the consent of the proprietor thereof; and no person, whether licensed or not, shall act as driver or conductor of any such carriage without the consent of the proprietor. But nothing herein contained shall prevent any proprietor from employing any unlicensed person to act as such driver as aforesaid for any time not exceeding twenty-four hours, in case of unavoidable necessity.

*CHANGE OF ABODE OF PROPRIETORS AND DRIVERS.**Notice to be given by Proprietors and Drivers of change of Abode.*

17. If any person named in any license as the proprietor or one of the proprietors of any hackney carriage, or if any driver of such carriage shall change his place of abode, he shall within two days after such change give notice thereof in writing, signed by him, to the town clerk of the borough, specifying in such notice his new place of abode, and shall at the same time produce his license to the said town clerk, who shall indorse thereon a memorandum specifying the particulars of such change.

*LICENSES AND TICKETS.**Licenses to be on Parchment with Columns.*

18. Every license of a driver shall be on parchment with proper columns, in which every proprietor employing the driver named in such license shall enter his own name and address, and the day on which such driver shall enter and shall quit his service respectively; and in case any of the particulars entered or endorsed upon any license in pursuance of this bye-law shall be erased or defaced, every such license shall be wholly void and of none effect.

At the Time of granting any License, an Abstract of Laws to be given.

19. At the time of issuing any license to any driver, there shall be delivered to him, by the person issuing the same, a copy of this bye-law, and of every other bye-law hereafter to be in force relating to the same subject.

Renewal of Licenses.

20. Every license to keep, use, and let to hire any hackney carriage shall be renewed from year to year, and such renewed license shall bear date on the day next after the expiration of the former license, but if subsequently applied for shall bear date on the day of the application.

Particulars of Licenses to be entered in Books at Council Office.

21. The particulars of every license which shall be granted under this bye-law shall be entered in books to be kept at the office of the borough council.

Licenses to be delivered up on discontinuance.

22. Upon the expiration or revocation of any license granted under this bye-law, the person to whom such license shall have been granted shall deliver such license, at the office of the borough council, to the town clerk.

Proprietor to retain the License of Driver employed by him.

23. Every proprietor of a hackney carriage who shall permit or employ any licensed person to act as the driver thereof, shall require to be delivered to him and shall retain in his possession the license of such driver, while such driver shall remain in his service. And when such licensed driver shall leave the service of such proprietor, he shall upon demand thereof return to such driver his license.

*STANDINGS.**SCHEDULE VI.—Appointed.*

24. The places mentioned in the sixth schedule to this bye-law shall be public stands for hackney carriages to the number of such carriages specified in the said schedule; and all such carriages shall take their stations on the several stands in the order of their arrival at the same; and when any carriage shall be called, or drive off any stand, the carriage immediately behind shall draw to the place vacated, and any other carriage behind in the like order. Provided that at every fourth carriage on each stand there shall be left a space of at least eight feet for passengers to pass through.

*RATES, FARES, AND DISTANCES.**SCHEDULE VII.—Tables of Fares to be painted on Carriages.*

25. The proprietor or driver of any hackney carriage shall be entitled to demand, and to take for the hire of such carriage the fares set forth in the seventh schedule hereto.

26. The proprietor of any hackney carriage shall put up and at all times keep distinctly painted thereon in some conspicuous place, as the council may from time to time direct, the amount of fare according to distance and time which may be legally demanded, and taken from the hirer of such carriage.

Hackney Carriages standing in any Street shall be deemed to be plying for Hire.

27. Every hackney carriage which shall be found standing in any street or place having a horse harnessed thereto, and being equipped for use, shall, unless actually hired, or unless such driver have a reasonable excuse, be deemed to be plying for hire, although such hackney carriage shall not be on any standing, or place usually appropriated for the purpose of

hackney carriages standing or plying for hire; and the driver of every such hackney carriage which shall not be actually hired shall be obliged and compellable to go with any person desirous of using such hackney carriage to any place within the borough or for any time not exceeding one hour.

Agreement to pay more than Legal Fare not binding.

28. No agreement whatever, made with the proprietor or driver of any hackney carriage for the payment of more than his proper fare, shall be binding or held to authorize any overcharge whatever.

SCHEDULE VII.—Speed on hiring by Time.

29. When any hackney carriage shall have been hired by time, the driver thereof may be required to drive at any rate not exceeding six miles within one hour, and if the driver of such carriage shall be required to drive more than six miles within an hour, then in every such case the driver thereof shall be entitled to demand, in addition to the fare regulated by time in the seventh schedule hereto, for every mile, or any part thereof exceeding six miles, the fare regulated by distance as set forth in the same schedule.

*PENALTIES.**For Offences.*

30. Every person who shall offend against this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds for each such offence.

Fraud in obtaining License.

31. No person applying for or attempting to procure any license under this bye-law shall make or cause to be made any false representation in any requisition to the council, or shall endeavor to obtain a license by any forged recommendation, or shall untruly answer any question which shall be demanded of him in relation to such application for a license.

Retaining License or using Forged Tickets.

32. No person licensed under this bye-law shall, after the expiration or revocation of such license, wilfully retain the same in his possession for three days, or shall use any ticket without having a license in force relating to such ticket, or shall, for the purpose of deception, use or have any ticket resembling or intending to resemble any ticket in use under the authority of this bye-law.

Not giving Notice of change of Place of Abode.

33. No person licensed under this bye-law shall change his place of abode, and neglect for two days to give notice of such change to the council of the borough, and to produce his license in order that a memorandum of such change may be endorsed thereon.

Smoking.

34. No person shall persist in smoking tobacco or opium in any hackney carriage after being warned by the driver or any passenger to desist.

Parting with License.

35. No person to whom a license shall have been granted shall transfer, except in compliance with this bye-law, or lend such license to any other person.

Plying for hire with Carriage, &c., unfit for use.

36. No person shall ply for hire with any hackney carriage, horse, or harness, which shall be at the time unfit for public use.

Acting as Driver without a License.

37. No person shall act as a driver of any hackney carriage whether such person shall or shall not be the proprietor thereof, without in each case having a driver's license in force as required by this bye-law.

38. No proprietor of a hackney carriage who shall act as driver thereof shall refuse or neglect to produce to any person who may wish to inspect it, his driver's license.

Not complying with Directions for production of Licensed Carriage.

39. No person shall refuse or neglect to produce any licensed carriage, horse, or harness before any person, to be duly appointed for that purpose, at the time and place directed.

Proprietors permitting unlicensed Persons to drive.

40. No proprietor of a hackney carriage shall knowingly suffer any person not duly licensed under the authority of this bye-law to act as driver of any hackney carriage of which he shall be the proprietor or part proprietor.

Not keeping Particulars painted on Carriage.

41. No proprietor of a hackney carriage shall omit to keep distinctly painted on the same in the manner required by this bye-law the particulars herein required to be so painted thereon.

Withdrawing Carriage from hire.

42. No proprietor of a hackney carriage shall withdraw his carriage from hire for two consecutive days, or for any two days in one week without just cause, unless with the consent of the council.

Not placing Lamps on Carriages.

43. No proprietor of a hackney carriage shall omit to place upon the same proper lamps as and in manner herein required.

Proprietor not obtaining Possession of Driver's License.

44. No proprietor of a hackney carriage shall neglect to require to be delivered to him, or to retain in his possession the license of any driver during such period as such driver shall remain in his service, or shall neglect or refuse to produce such license before a justice of the peace when called upon, if such driver shall be in his service at the time of being so called upon, or shall not upon demand deliver to any driver, when leaving his service, such driver's license.

Plying on Streets.

45. No driver of a hackney carriage shall ply for hire in any street, except at some stand appointed by this bye-law; or by loitering or any wilful misbehaviour shall cause any obstruction in or upon any street or thoroughfare, and shall not when driving over any crossing proceed at a greater pace than at the rate of four miles within the hour.

Demanding more than Legal Fare.

46. No driver of a hackney carriage shall demand more than the legal fare for any passenger.

Carrying more Passengers than allowed.

47. No driver of a hackney carriage shall carry in any such carriage a greater number of passengers than allowed by law.

Driver Smoking.

48. No driver of a hackney carriage shall, against the will of any passenger, smoke tobacco or opium whilst acting in such capacity.

Driver stopping Carriage at Crossing.

49. No driver of a hackney carriage for the purpose of taking up or setting down a passenger (except in case of accident or other unavoidable necessity) shall stop such carriage opposite to the end of any street, or upon any place where foot passengers unusually cross the carriage-way.

Not carrying full complement of Passengers.

50. No driver of a hackney carriage shall refuse to admit or carry in his hackney carriage the number of persons specified on such carriage.

Not keeping Lamps light between Sunset and Sunrise.

51. No driver of a hackney carriage, when the same is in use, between sunset and sunrise shall omit to keep the lamps of the same properly lighted.

Drunkenness and Insulting Behaviour of Drivers.

52. No driver of a hackney carriage shall, during his employment, be drunk or make use of any insulting or abusive language, or be guilty of any insulting gesture or any misbehaviour.

Not carrying reasonable Quantity of Luggage.

53. No driver of a hackney carriage shall refuse to carry by his carriage a reasonable quantity of luggage for any person hiring or intending to hire the same.

Refusing Hire.

54. No driver after tender or payment of his proper fare shall refuse to drive any hackney carriage to any place within the borough to which he shall be required to drive any person hiring or intending to hire such carriage, or between six o'clock in the morning and eight o'clock in the evening, shall refuse to drive any such carriage for any time not exceeding one hour if so required by any person hiring or intending to hire such carriage.

Omitting to deliver Ticket.

55. No driver of a hackney carriage shall refuse or neglect to deliver to the hirer of his hackney carriage a card with his name and the number of his license, and a statement of the fares he is authorized to charge printed thereon.

Taking Number or giving wrong Number.

56. No driver of a hackney carriage shall prevent any person from taking and noting the number of the same, or of the driver thereof, or shall by word of mouth give or declare to any person a wrong number as or for the number of such carriage, or of the driver thereof.

Permitting Persons to Ride.

57. No driver of a hackney carriage shall permit or suffer any person to ride, or be carried in, upon, or about such hackney carriage, without the consent of the person hiring the same.

Feeding Horses.

58. No driver of a hackney carriage shall feed the horse or horses of or belonging to any hackney carriage in any street, road, or common passage, save only with corn or chaff out of a nose-bag, and shall not remove such horses' blinkers during the time of feeding.

Obstructing other Carriages, &c.

59. No driver of a hackney carriage shall refuse to give way if he conveniently can to any private carriage or vehicle, or shall obstruct or hinder the driver of any other hackney carriage in taking up or setting down any person into or from such other hackney carriage.

Driver leaving Carriage unattended.

60. No driver of a hackney carriage shall leave the same unattended in any street, road, or at any place of public resort or entertainment, whether such carriage shall be hired or not.

Carrying Intoxicated Persons, Coffins, Dead Bodies, &c.

61. No driver of any hackney carriage shall—against the will of any passenger—carry, or permit to be carried in or upon such carriage, any person in a state of intoxication, or any coffin or dead body.

STANDS FOR HACKNEY CARRIAGES.

1. *Buninyong Hackney Carriage Stand.*

On the east side of Lydiard street, from Sturt street to Mair street, facing south, the first hackney carriage to draw out and load in Sturt street, at the Post Office corner.

2. *General Hackney Carriage Stand.*

In the centre of Lydiard street, commencing 100 feet from the south side of Bath street towards Dana street, facing north, for ten hackney carriages only.

3. *General Hackney Carriage Stand.*

In the centre of Sturt street, from Lydiard street, towards Armstrong street, for a double row of hackney carriages, facing east, commencing at a point fifty feet west of Lydiard street, nine hackney carriages on the north and nine on the south.

4. *Sebastopol Hackney Carriage Stand.*

In the centre of Sturt street, extending from Armstrong street towards Lydiard street, 150 feet; the hackney carriages to face west, the first hackney carriage to draw out and load at the east side of Armstrong street, 12 feet from the line of the kerb, on the south side of Sturt street.

5. *Stand for Hackney Carriages plying as Omnibus Cars to the Botanical Gardens, via Sturt street, Alfred street, and Wendouree parade.*

On the north side of the centre of Sturt street, extending from Doveton street towards Armstrong street, facing west, for six hackney carriages only, the first carriage to draw out and load up on the north side of Sturt street, twelve feet east of Doveton street.

6. *Stand for Hackney Carriages plying as Omnibus Cars to the Cattle Yards, via Doveton street, Eyre street, Pleasant street, and Market street.*

On the south side of the centre of Sturt street, extending from Doveton street towards Armstrong street, facing west, for six carriages only, the first carriage to draw out and load up on the west side of Doveton street, twelve feet south of Sturt street.

SEVENTH SCHEDULE.

And for every hackney carriage drawn by two horses, one-third above the rates and fares hereinbefore mentioned.

After Ten o'clock at night and before Six o'clock in the morning, an additional charge of one-half the above fares. In driving on any unmade road from 1st May to 31st October in any year, an additional charge of one-half the above fares for the distance driven.

The above fares to be paid according to distance or time, at the option of the hirer, to be expressed at the commencement of the hiring. If not otherwise expressed, the fare to be according to distance.

Provided that no driver shall be compellable to hire his carriage for a fare to be paid according to time at any time after eight o'clock in the evening and before six o'clock in the morning: Provided further, that when the driver of any hackney carriage to be paid a fare calculated according to the distance shall be required by the hirer thereof to stop such carriage for five minutes or for any longer time, it shall be lawful for the driver to demand and receive from the hirer so requiring him to stop a further sum above the fare to which he shall be entitled, calculated according to the distance, of twopence for every five minutes completed that he shall have been so stopped. And no driver shall demand or receive over and above the said fare any sum for or by way of back fare for the return of such carriage from the place at which such carriage shall be discharged: Provided further, that it shall be lawful for the driver of a hackney carriage required to drive beyond the distance of six miles from the place where the same shall have been hired, to charge one shilling per mile additional for every mile so driven: And provided further, that if any carriage engaged by time shall be discharged at a greater distance than one mile from a general cab-stand, the hirer thereof shall pay the sum of sixpence for every mile or portion of a mile beyond one mile at which such carriage shall be discharged.

When more than one person shall be conveyed by any hackney carriage drawn by one horse, a sum of sixpence for each additional person shall be paid for the whole hiring, in addition to the above fare. No child under seven years of age shall be counted as a passenger unless there be more than one such child, in which case two such children shall be counted as one adult. Children at the breast are not to be counted in any case.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable SIR JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1862* it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon or within five miles of any gold-field, or in or within five miles of any town not contained in any municipal district, or within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land to be a municipal common, or a gold-fields common, or a town common, or a farmers' common respectively, as the case may be; and it is also enacted that the Governor in Council may at any time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common proclaimed before or after the passing of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby increase the commons hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the above-recited provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

DIGBY TOWN COMMON.—The Digby Town Common, described in a Proclamation bearing date the 18th day of February, 1861, is hereby increased by adding thereto 3200 acres, more or less, being the unappropriated Crown lands within the town of Digby, and the land comprised within the boundaries described as follow, viz.:—Commencing on the south-western side of the road from Casterton to Digby, at the point where it is intersected by the north boundary of the existing common, the said point bearing west three chains thirty links from the north-west angle of the town of Digby; thence by the said road bearing north-westerly one hundred and thirty-four chains, more or less, to a point bearing south from the south angle of allotment 1 of section 9, parish of Digby; thence crossing the said road by a line bearing north to the said angle of that allotment; thence by the west boundary of allotment 2, bearing north ninety-four chains seven links; thence by a road bearing west one hundred and twenty-one chains fifty links to the west angle of allotment 1; thence by a line bearing south one hundred and eighty chains, more or less, to a point bearing west from the point of commencement; and thence to that point by a line and the north boundary of the existing common, bearing east two hundred and twelve chains, more or less; as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(68.R.7178.)
