THE ORDER OF ST. MICHAEL AND ST. GEORGE.

THE Governor has directed to be published the subjoined Despatch intimating that the Queen has been pleased to sanction such a modification of the Statutes of the Order of St. Michael and St. George as will render it available as a reward of distinguished merit in any part of Her Majesty's Colonial Possessions, and also the Extract from the Statutes of the Order referred to in the Despatch.

SIR.—The Queen has had occasion to observe that the constant progress of the British Empire in population, wealth and enterprise, and the increased opportunities thus happily afforded to Her subjects of rendering effective services to their Sovereign and their country, have in some respects outgrown Her Majesty's means of recognizing those services in a fitting manner. You are aware that with the object of supplying that deficiency it was found requisite in the year 1847 to enlarge and modify the ancient Order of the Bath, and more recently that Her Majesty has been pleased to create a new Order of Knighthood—the Star of India—for the reward of services rendered in relation to Her Indian Empire. The sphere of usefulness and eminence which is now open in the British colonies is so varied and extensive as to render it, in Her Majesty's judgment, advisable that to them, as to India, a special form of distinction should be appropriated.

For this purpose Her Majesty has been graciously pleased to sanction such a modification of the statutes of the Order of St. Michael and St. George, originally instituted by King George III. in connection with His Majesty's Mediterranean possessions, and now presided over by a Prince of the Blood Royal, together with such an enlargement of its numbers as will render it available as a reward of distinguished merit or service in any part of Her Majesty's colonial possessions.

[Annex (4th December, 1868), for publication in the colony under your Government, copies of so much of the new statutes as prescribes the qualifications for admission into the Order and the number of the Knights.

The Queen is confident that this measure will be received by Her subjects as an evidence of the importance which Her Majesty attaches to Her colonial dominions as integral parts of the British empire, of her constant interest in their progress, and of Her desire that services of which they are the scene or the occasion may not pass without adequate and appropriate recognition.

EXTRACT from the Statutes of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and St. George, dated the 4th December, 1868.

Order to contain three classes of Knights Grand Cross, Knights Commanders, and Companions.—It is ordained, that this Most Distinguished Order shall contain three classes, as in No. 12.—FEBRUARY 26, 1869.—1.

Our said Letters-Patent mentioned, to be styled and designated respectively—

KNIGHTS GRAND CROSS,
KNIGHTS COMMANDERS, and
COMPANIONS.

First class to comprise [25] Knights Grand Cross.—It is ordained, that the first class, or Knights Grand Cross, shall not exceed twenty-five in number.

Second class to comprise [60] Knights Commanders.—It is ordained, that the second class, or Knights Commanders, shall not exceed sixty in number.

Third class to comprise [100] Companions.—It is ordained, that the third class, or Companions, shall not exceed one hundred in number.

Qualifications of persons eligible for admission into the Order.—It is ordained, that the persons to be admitted into this Most Distinguished Order, shall be such natural-born subjects of Our Crown of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, as may have held, or shall hereafter hold, high and confidential offices within any of Our Colonial Possessions, or such other natural-born subjects of Our Crown of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, as may have held, or shall hereafter hold, high and confidential offices, or may render extraordinary and important services to Us as Sovereign of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, in relation to any of Our Colonial Possessions, or who may become eminent distinguished therein by their talents, merits, virtues, loyalty, or services, or who now are, or hereafter may be, appointed Officers of this Most Distinguished Order.

INSTRUCTIONS TO OFFICERS IN BRITISH POSSESSIONS ABROAD.

SALVAGE OF LIFE.

With reference to Paragraphs 142, 144, &c. By the 458th and 459th sections of the "Merchant Shipping Act 1854," it is enacted as follows:—

"458. Salvage in respect of services rendered in the United Kingdom.—In the following cases, that is to say—

- "Whenever any ship or boat is stranded, or otherwise in distress on the shore of any sea or tidal water situate within the limits of the United Kingdom, and services are rendered by any person:
- "(1) In assisting such ship or boat;
 - "(2) In saving the lives of the persons belonging to such ship or boat;

"(3) In saving the cargo or apparel of such ship or boat or any portion thereof;

"And whenever any wreck is saved by any person other than a receiver within the United Kingdom;

There shall be payable by the owners of such ship or boat, cargo, apparel, or wreck, to the person by whom such services or any of them are rendered, or by whom such wreck is saved, a reasonable amount of salvage, together with all expenses properly incurred by him in the performance of such services or the saving of such wreck, the amount of such salvage and expenses (which expenses are hereinafter included under the term 'salvage') to be determined in case of dispute in manner hereinafter mentioned.

"459. *Salvage for life may be paid by Board of Trade out of Mercantile Marine Fund.*—Salvage in respect of the preservation of the life or lives of any person or persons belonging to any such ship or boat as aforesaid shall be payable by the owners of the ship or boat in priority to all other claims for salvage; and in cases where such ship or boat is destroyed or where the value thereof is insufficient, after payment of the actual expenses incurred, to pay the amount of salvage due in respect of any life or lives, the Board of Trade may in its discretion award to the salvors of such life or lives out of the Mercantile Marine Fund such sum or sums as it deems fit in whole or part satisfaction of any amount of salvage so left unpaid in respect of such life or lives."

By the 9th section of the "Admiralty Court Act 1861."

"*Extending 17 & 18 Vict. c. 104, as to claims for salvage of life.*—All the provisions of the 'Merchant Shipping Act 1854' in regard to salvage of life from any ship or boat within the limits of the United Kingdom shall be extended to the salvage of life from any British ship or boat wheresoever the services may have been rendered, and from any foreign ship or boat where the services have been rendered either wholly or in part in British waters."

The principle that claims in respect of salvage of life take priority of all salvage claims against wrecked property saved is thus extended to British ships wrecked abroad, and it will be the duty of the officer, as far as possible, to see that this principle is fully carried out in all cases in which property or life is saved within the limits of his district.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1863*, it is amongst other things enacted that at any time after the first annual election or general election, as the case may be, or first appointment of members of the district board for any original or proclaimed district (hereinafter sometimes called "single district") the Governor in Council, if it seem fit, may, and if he shall have received a petition to that effect signed by twenty persons liable to be rated under the said Act in respect of rateable property in the said district, shall, within three months after the receipt of the same, divide the district into two, or, if the Governor in Council shall see fit, into three separate electoral subdivisions (hereinafter called subdivisions), by such names as shall by such Order in Council be assigned to the same, and in and by such Order in Council be assigned the boundaries of the subdivisions shall be set forth; provided that no such division shall be made within three months before any day appointed for holding any election of members of the district board in or for such district: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the twenty-fifth day of November, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, a road district was proclaimed under the designation of "The Woodend, Newham, and Rochford Road District;" and the boundaries of the said road district were altered by other Proclamations bearing date respectively the twenty-second day of February, 1864, and the twenty-first day of August, 1865: And whereas the Governor in Council has received a petition signed by not less than twenty persons liable to be rated under the said Act in respect of rateable property in the said road district, praying for the division of the same into subdivisions: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth, by this present Order, divide the Woodend, Newham, and Rochford Road District into three separate electoral subdivisions in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, by the names hereinafter assigned to the same respectively, and doth hereby set forth the boundaries of the said several subdivisions in manner following, that is to say:—

THE EASTERN SUBDIVISION.—Commencing at the intersection of Monument Creek with the north boundary of the Gisborne Road District; thence eastwardly, southwardly, and eastwardly by that boundary to the south-east angle of the parish of Rochford; thence by the east boundary of said parish and a direct line northwardly to the boundary of the Dalhousie Electoral District; thence by that boundary westwardly to a point true north of the junction of Monument Creek with the Saltwater River; thence south to that junction; thence southwardly by the Monument Creek to the commencing point.

THE CENTRAL SUBDIVISION.—Commencing at the intersection of Monument Creek with the north boundary of the Gisborne Road District; thence northwardly by that creek to its junction with the Saltwater River; thence true north to the boundary of the Electoral District of Dalhousie; thence by the said Electoral District boundary south-westwardly and south-eastwardly to the northern boundary of the Gisborne Road District at the south-west angle of portion 1, parish of Newham; thence eastwardly by the said Road District boundary to the commencing point.

THE WESTERN SUBDIVISION.—Commencing at the intersection of the boundary of the Electoral District of Dalhousie with the north boundary of the Gisborne Road District at the south-west angle of portion 1, parish of Newham; thence northwardly by said electoral boundary to the north boundary of the parish of Newham; thence westwardly and southwardly by part of the north and west boundaries of parish of Newham to the north-east angle of the parish of Woodend; thence west by the north, south by the west, and east by the south boundaries of the parish of Woodend to the south-west angle of Woodend Township Reserve; thence true south to the boundary of the Dalhousie Electoral District; thence by the said Electoral District boundary north-eastwardly to the commencing point excluding the Borough of Woodend.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1862* it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon or within five miles of any gold-field, or in or within five miles of any town not contained in any municipal district, or within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land to be a municipal common, or a gold-fields common, or a town common, or a farmers' common respectively, as the case may be: And whereas by *The Amending Land Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common theretofore or thereafter to be proclaimed or proclaimed, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of *The Land Act 1862* and the now recited Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim, increase, alter, or abolish (as the case may be) the commons hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Acts, that is to say:—

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE RAYWOOD PUBLIC CEMETERY.

ALL charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.

2. By *The Cemeteries Statute 1864* any person making a vault or erecting and placing a monument in the cemetery, by and with the permission of the trustees, and upon payment of the charges therein mentioned, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep a vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the tenor of such permission, to and for the sole and separate use of such person or persons and his or their representatives for ever.

3. Applications for such permission to be made at the office of the secretary. A certificate of permission will be granted to the party applying on payment of the proper charges.

4. Orders for interment to be given to the secretary on the previous day, between the hours of Nine o'clock a.m. and Five o'clock p.m.

5. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, but parties wanting brick graves or vaults will be required to construct them under the direction of the surveyor; and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault the consent (in writing) of the party entitled thereto must be left with the order.

6. The time fixed for the funeral to be the time when the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.

7. Until otherwise ordered, the usual hour fixed for the performance of funerals will be from Ten o'clock a.m. to Six o'clock p.m. in the months of September to April inclusive, and from Ten o'clock a.m. to Four o'clock p.m. throughout the rest of the year.

8. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones, to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.

9. Every coffin in a vault or bricked grave to be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of freestone, slate, or iron.

10. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and plan of every monument or tablet proposed to be erected, to be submitted to the trustees for approval, who are required to determine and fix the position of any unobjectionable monument, according to the description and character thereof, having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the said cemetery in an appropriate manner. In the erection of tablets copper cramps must be used.

11. No catacomb, or any wooden fencing, allowed without first submitting a plan for the approval of the trustees.

12. No servant, or other person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees, will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.

13. The ground will be open daily to the public from sunrise to sunset.

14. A plan of the cemetery, showing the situation of the purchased and other graves, is kept at the office and may be inspected, and registers of all grants are kept by the secretary.

15. Any person who shall wantonly or wilfully destroy, or do, or cause to be done, any damage to any monument, vault, tombstone, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant, will be proceeded against as directed by the said statute.

16. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these rules and regulations.
