A COUNTY COURT TO BE HOLDEN AT MANSFIELD.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the first day of March, 1869.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria passed in the twenty-eighth year of Her Majesty's reign, numbered 261, and intitled, *An Act for the Consolidation of the Law relating to County Courts*, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to direct that county courts shall be holden for the recovery of debts and demands under the said Act, and with the advice aforesaid; to alter the place of holding any such court or to direct that the holding of any such court be discontinued, and from time to time, with the advice aforesaid, to direct in what towns and places a county court shall be holden; and it is also enacted that the judge of each county court shall attend and hold such court at the place where the Governor in Council shall have directed that such court shall be holden, at such times as such judge shall appoint for that purpose, so that a court shall be holden in such place once at least in such interval as the Governor in Council shall in each case direct: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order direct that a County Court shall be holden for the recovery of debts and demands under the said Act, at the town and within the interval hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

At MANSFIELD, once at least in every six calendar months.

And the Honorable James Joseph Casey, Her Majesty's Minister of Justice for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

THE SUBDIVISIONS OF THE GARDINER ROAD DISTRICT.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-second day of February, 1869.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1863*, it is amongst other things enacted that at any time after the first annual election or general election, as the case may be, or first appointment of members of the district board for any original or proclaimed district (hereinafter sometimes called "single district,") the Governor in Council, if it seem fit, may, and if he shall have received a petition to that effect signed by twenty persons liable to be rated under the said Act in respect of rateable property in the said district, shall, within three months after the receipt of the same, divide the district into two, or, if the Governor in Council shall see fit, into three separate electoral subdivisions (hereinafter called subdivisions), by such names as shall by such Order in Council be assigned to the same; and in and by such Order in Council the boundaries of the subdivisions shall be set forth; provided that no such division shall be made within three months before any day appointed for holding any election of members of the district board in or for such district: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the sixth day of October, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-six, a road district was proclaimed under the designation of "The Gardiner Road District." And whereas the Governor in Council has received a petition signed by not less than twenty persons liable to be rated under the said Act in respect of rateable property in the said road district, praying for the division of the same into three subdivisions: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth, by this present Order, divide the Gardiner Road District into three separate electoral subdivisions in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, by the names hereinafter assigned to the same respectively, and doth hereby set forth the boundaries of the said several subdivisions in manner following, that is to say:—

THE WEST SUBDIVISION.—Commencing at the junction of the west boundary road with the Main Dandenong road, and proceeding along the centre of the latter road to the boundary line between sections 61 and 64; thence north along the continuation of said line to High street; thence north along the east side of reserve road to Commercial road (Malvern road proper); thence east along the south side of said road to the east side of Elizabeth street; thence north along the east side of Elizabeth street to the Toorak road; thence east by the south side of Toorak road to the Gardiner's Creek; thence north-westwardly by the said creek to its junction with the River Yarra at the north end of the west boundary road; thence south along the centre of the west boundary road to the commencing point.

THE CENTRE SUBDIVISION.—Commencing at the south-east angle of the west subdivision, and proceeding south-eastwardly along the centre of the Main Dandenong road to its junction with Charleville road; thence north along the east side of the

said road to the Gardiner's Creek; thence north-westwardly to the junction of the said creek with the Toorak road; thence west along the south side of the said road to Elizabeth street; thence south along the line described for the eastern boundary of the west subdivision to the commencing point.

THE EAST SUBDIVISION.—Commencing at the south-east angle of the centre subdivision, and proceeding eastwardly along the centre of the Main Dandenong road to the east boundary road; thence north along the centre of the said east boundary road to the Gardiner's Creek; thence westwardly along the said creek to its junction with Charleville road; thence south along the east side of the said road (being the line described for the east boundary of the centre subdivision) to the commencing point.

And the Honorable Charles Edwin Jones, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Railways and Roads for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

BOARD OF EDUCATION.
GENERAL REGULATIONS.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to approve of the following General Regulations, in accordance with the provisions of section VIII. of *The Common Schools Act No. 149.*

THE following General Regulations relative to Allowances to Schools have been framed by the Board of Education, and will take effect from 1st January, 1869, from which date Regulations 16—27, approved by the Governor in Council on 25th January, 1864, will be rescinded.

ALLOWANCES TO SCHOOLS.

16. In addition to the above payments the following allowances for *results* will be made to schools.

17. To each school such proportion of a sum hereinafter called the maximum increment, as may be gained by it under the conditions specified in Rule 18.

18. The maximum increment shall be 45 per cent. of a salary assumed in the case of each school, according to the allotment of teachers, as shown in the following table:—

Infant schools not being departments of other schools, two-thirds of the above.

19. Every scholar who has attended during any part of the five weeks preceding the inspector's visit shall be liable to examination, and if presented by the teacher shall be examined in the class with which he is taught and on the roll of which his name and correct age have been entered.

20. Every scholar below seven (7) years of age presented in class I. shall receive three (3) marks, subject to reduction or forfeiture should the class fail to satisfy the requirements of the examination specified on the programme.

21. Every other scholar presented shall receive one (1) mark for each subject in which he has passed the examination specified in the programme, and an additional mark shall be given for arithmetic in all classes above the second.

22. One-twelfth (1-12) of the marks gained by any class shall be deducted from each month by which the average age of the scholars (liable to examination) composing it exceeds the age specified in the programme.

23. The sum to which each school shall be entitled as payment for results, shall bear the same ratio to the maximum increment as the total number of marks actually gained bears to the number which might have been obtained if all the children liable to examination had gained their full number, and one-twelfth (1-12) of this sum shall be paid monthly, commencing at the first day of the month following the day of examination.

24. If at any time the attendance necessitate a change in the allotment of teachers, the monthly allowance for results shall from the date of such change be calculated upon the maximum increment corresponding to the new allotment.

25. The amount gained under results is to be calculated by the Inspector in the school, and a record left by him in the Inspector's register, and any appeal against the Inspector's examination must be forwarded to the Board within one week, or the same will not be entertained.

26. At the end of the year 1869, the balance, if any, of the amount appropriated by the Board for the payment of results, which may remain unexpended under the preceding rule, may at the discretion of the Board be distributed amongst all the schools, such distribution to be in the same proportion as the amounts which shall have been already expended.

27. It shall be lawful for the Board at the commencement of any year, subject to the approval of the Governor in Council, to raise or reduce the percentage of the allotment which is to form the maximum increment, or to modify the average age of the classes shown in the programme, as the interests of education may require, or the amount voted by Parliament for payment under results may render necessary.

28. After one month's notice the grant may be reduced or withdrawn upon the Inspector's report for faults of organization, instruction, or discipline on the part of the teacher, or for failure on the part of the local committee to remedy any such defect in the school premises as seriously interferes with the efficiency of the school, or to provide proper furniture, books, maps, or other apparatus of elementary instruction.

29. Any local committee objecting to the Inspector's report upon the building, organization, instruction or discipline, may appeal to the Board of Education, and every such appeal must

be made within twenty-one days from the receipt by the local committee of notice of such report, and must state fully the grounds of appeal.

30. No grant will be made in respect of any teacher or teachers who shall at any time knowingly and wilfully present for examination, or make any claim on behalf of any scholar who shall be by these rules disqualified from such presentation or claim, or who shall make a false entry respecting any child liable to examination, knowing the same to be false, or not knowing the same through gross negligence, and such disability shall continue for the period of five (5) years from the date of the discovery of such false entry.

EVENING SCHOOLS.

31. No scholar shall be entered on the rolls of an evening school whose age is below 12 years, or who shall be in attendance at, or employed as a teacher or pupil-teacher in any ordinary common school.

32. The maximum increment for an evening school having an average attendance below 20 shall be less than that allowed for an ordinary school of from 20 to 24, and in the same ratio as the average attendance of said evening school is less than 20.

33. The maximum increment for evening schools having an average attendance above 20 shall be the same as would follow the allotment in ordinary schools having the same average attendance.

34. Rules 20 and 23 shall not apply to evening schools, but no scholar may be twice presented for examination in the same class, and the classification of each scholar at his first examination must be approved by the inspector.

35. The other regulations relative to payment of results in ordinary common schools shall apply to evening schools.
