WHEREAS by The Local Government Act 1863, it is
amongst other things enacted that at any time after
the first annual election or general election, as the case may be,
or first appointment of members of the district board for any
original or proclaimed district (thereinafter sometimes called
"single district"), the Governor in Council, if it seem fit, may,
and if he shall have received a petition to that effect signed by
twenty persons liable to be rated under the said Act in respect
of rateable property in the said district, shall, within three
months after the receipt of the same, divide the district into two,

Whereas information has been received by the Government that the disease called the Small-pox is prevalent at or in the vicinity of Melbourne, in the Colony of Victoria: Now, therefore, I, the Governor aforesaid, in pursuance of the powers in me vested by the Act twenty-seven Victoria, number nine, do, with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby notify and proclaim that portions of the said Colony of Victoria are infected with the said disease, and that it is pressible that such disease may be brought therefrom to this colony; and, with the advice aforesaid, I do order and direct that no person or persons arriving in the colony by any ships or vessels (whether by steamships or vessels propelled by sails only) from, or having touched at any port in the said Colony of Victoria, shull be permitted to land from such ship or vessel in the ports of Moreton Bay, Maryborough, Gladstone, Rockhampton, Mackay, Bowen, and Townsville, until the permission of the Health Officer, or other person duly authorised to act in his behalf, shall have been obtained. And I do further order and direct that no steamer or vessel as aforesaid arriving from the ports of Sydney and Newcastle shall be allowed to pass the Water Police Hulk, in Moreton Bay, at the mouth of the Brisbane River, or be brought alongside the wharves at Maryborough, Gladstone, Rockhampton, Mackay, Bowen, and Townsville, without having previously been boarded by the Health Officer or other person duly authorised to act in his behalf, who shall cause a printed form, containing certain questions, to be placed in the hands of the master or officer in command of such steamer, or vessel as aforesaid, and the said master or officer in command shall be required to answer all such questions as shall be put to him by the Health Officer touching the health of the crew and passengers and the cause or causes of the death of any

The mortality of the month of January during the past ten years has ranged from a minimum of 324 in 1864 to a maximum of 637 in 1867. In the month under review it was much below the average.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at the Melbourne Observatory during the month was 99°5 on the 27th, and the lowest was 46° on the 16th. The mean temperature of the month (65°5) was slightly below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (45°) took place on the 13th, viz. —from a maximum of 92° to a minimum of 47°. The least range (9°1) was on the 1st, viz. —from a maximum of 66°3 to a minimum of 57°7.

Of the deaths which occurred, 54 per cent, were of males and 46 per cent, were of females. Fifty-eight per cent, were of children under five against 62 per cent, in January, 1868; 57 per cent, in January, 1865; 654 per cent, in January, 1866; 75 per cent, in January, 1865; 64 per cent, in January, 1866.

Four persons over 75 years of age died during the month, viz. —a male aged 77 of dysentery, another at the same age of paralysis, a male aged 90 of old age, and a female aged 80 of old age.

Fifteen violent deaths took place during the. month. The following are the particulars:—A carter aged 44, died from the effects of an accidental gurshot wound; a female aged 16, of burns. A boy aged 63, another aged 113, a ship's cook aged 26, and a master mariner aged 44, were accidentally drowned, and a commission agent aged 65, was found drowned; an infant aged 2 months, was suffocated by bed-clothers; a gold miner aged 47, died of a fractured skull (verdict manslaughter); a bookseller aged 37 (insane), committed suicide by shooting; a contractor aged 50 (insane), committed suicide by poisoning with opium; a waiter aged 23 and a female aged 26, or about 17 per cent. of the whole viz. —38 in the Melbourne Hospital, 5 in the Benevolent Asylum, 1 in the Millitary Hospital, and 6 in the Melbourne Gaol.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 217, of which 115, or nearly 58 per cent.,

Zymotic diseases caused 147 deaths, or 40 per cent. of the whole, against 129 deaths, or 37 per cent., in December. The most fatal complaints in both months were diarrhon and dysentery, which caused 105 deaths in January and 68 in December. Deaths from scarlatina and diphtheria fell from 24 in December to 10 in January. No fatal case of smallpox occurred in January against 2 cases in December. Under the class "Developmental Diseases," those complaints placed under the head of atrophy and debility caused 37 deaths in the former month against 33 in the latter.

THE following Rules and Regulations were passed at a Meeting of Contributors held on the 22nd February,

MANAGEMENT.

1. The institution is for the purpose of affording surgical and medical aid in cases of accident and disease.

2. The affairs of the institute shall be directed by a committee,—consisting of president, vice-president, treasurer, and seven (7) other subscribers.

seven (7) other subscribers.

3. The annual general meeting shall elect two subscribers, not members of the board, as auditors for that year.

4. Should vacancies occur in any of the offices under the second rule the board shall supply such vacancies according to the provisions of Act No. 220; and should vacancies occur in the office of auditors, a special meeting of contributors shall be called before the end of the year to supply such vacancies. Any member of committee failing to attend three consecutive monthly meetings of the board may be requested to resign his seat.

monthly meetings of the board may be requested to resign missest.

5. The board of management shall include all the officers named in the second rule. It shall direct the collection and distribution of funds, appoint and dismiss all paid officers and servants, frame regulations for the management of the hospital, the same not being repugnant to the general rules, present a report to the annual general meeting, and manage the affairs of the hospital generally, and may from among themselves from time to time appoint house and other committees, give the same power to perform such duties as may not be contrary to the Act of Incorporation, and may also from time to time alter or discontinue such committees.

MERTINGS AND QUORUM.

6. The board shall meet for general business on the first Monday in each month, and adjourn such or any meeting as may be deemed expedient. Special meetings of the board shall be called, upon the requisition of any three members of the said board to the president or vice-president, such requisitions to state the objects of such meeting, and no other business but that stated shall be entertained. Other contributors shall be entitled to nominate one patient for every pound of their contribution within the year of such contribution; provided that the funds and accommodation of the hospital will admit of the recoption and treatment of such patients. The board of management shall also have power to add te the list of life governors such persons as by their eminent services may have added within one year the sum of Twenty pounds to the funds of the hospital; and members of the board are not to be limited in the number of patients they may recommend.

MINING COMPANIES.

10. Where mining companies pay sixpence per week for each man employed to the hospital funds, they shall have the privilege of nominating one patient for the year of such subscription for each pound received.

All patients will be expected to pay towards the actual expense of their maintenance, so far as their circumstances may enable them; and all property found on patients who may die in the hospital will be appropriated to defray the expenses of their maintenance and burial, the residue, if any, to be handed over to their legal representatives.

12. The board of management shall appoint a sub-committee to judge as to the ability of patients to pay, which sub-committee (with the concurrence of the surgeon) shall have power to discharge any patient, in case of his refusal to pay, and shall have the further power to require (if necessary) patients to make a declaration before a justice as to their means.

1. That the sittings of this council shall be open to the public, but a majority of the council may require the withdrawal of strangers.

2. At every regular meeting of the council the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting for confirmation the minutes of any preceding meetings, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon, except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings.

3. If the mayor of the borough be not present one-quarterof-an-hour after the time appointed for the meeting of the
council, a councillor shall be elected chairman for the time

- council, a councillor shall be elected communities, the order of business shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable; but for the greater convenience of the council at any particular meeting thereof, it may be altered by resolution to that effect—

 1. Reading copies of letters sent by authority of the council.

 4. Reading and ordering on reports of permanent committees.

6. Reading and ordering on reports of deputations.

9. Order of the day, including subjects arising from proceedings of former meetings.
10. Any other matter not hereinbefore classified.
11. Motions of which previous notice has been given.
12. Notices of motion.
5. All communications by letter intended for the council shall be made and addressed to the town clerk, and all petitions and memorials shall be addressed to the mayor and council under cover to the town clerk.
6. No motion shall be decided on at any meeting of council unless notice in writing, signed by the councillor proposing, shall have been given at the previous meeting of council, nor shall any report of committee be decided on unless similar notice be given, unless in committee of the whole council or the whole council be present.
7. The order of the day shall include all business of which due notice has been given, and all matters arising out of all former meetings of the council.
8. No motion shall be proceeded with unless the councillor giving notice, or any one of the council authorized by him, in writing, be present to proceed with the same when called upon.

9. Any councillor proposing a motion, amendment, or disy. Any councilor proposing a motion, amendment, or discussing any matter, must rise and address the chairman; and no councillor shall be interrupted unless by a call to order, whon he shall sit down, the councillor calling to order shall be heard, and the question of order decided before the subject is resumed, or any other business.

10. Any councillor proposing a motion or amendment, must state the nature of it before addressing the council.

11. No question once brought before the council shall be withdrawn without leave of the council, nor shall any motion be entertained by the council until the same be seconded.

12. No councillor shall speak twice on the same question 12. No councilor shall speak twice on the same question, unless by way of explanation merely, or in reply as the mover of an original motion or upon any amendment; and after such explanation or reply the question shall forthwith be put to the vote; but councillors merely seconding any motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

13. If more than one councillor rise at one time, the chairman for the time being shall decide which is entitled to pre-audience.

14. No councillor shall digress from the subject under discussion, or impute motives; and all personal reflections shall be considered highly disorderly.

15. The chairman when called upon to decide a point of order or practice, shall state the rule or precedent applicable to the case, without argument or comment, and his decision as to what is order or explanation shall be final.

16. The chairman shall rise when addressing the council in discussion of any question.

17. Any councillor may demand the production of any documents of the council relating to the subject under discussion.

18. Only one amendment shall be discussed at one time, and, upon the adoption of any amendment, the original motion shall be deemed rejected, and the amendment so carried shall be acted upon as an original motion.

19. The chairman shall, in taking the sense of the council, put the question first in the affirmative and then in the negative, and the votes of all the councillors shall be entered in the minutes.

20. The council shall vote by show of hands, except in cases

21. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion of adjournment; but if the question be negatived, the next motion or order of the day shall be considered before the question of adjournment shall be again entertained. Provided the motion be carried, any business left undecided shall take precedence at the next meeting of the council.

22. Any councillor may record his protest against any decision of the council, provided the same be in writing, before the next meeting of council, and be couched in respectful language, and be consistent with truth. Notice of such intention, however, must be given on the adoption of the resolution.

23. No motion, the effect of which if carried, would be to rescind any motion which has already passed the council, shall be entertained during the same municipal year, unless a call of the whole council be made for that purpose; and no such motion for rescinding any resolution of the council, which shall have been negatived by the council, shall be again entertained during the same municipal year.

24. Any councillor who shall use expressions capable of being offensively applied to any other councillor shall, if required by the council, withdraw such expressions, and make a satisfactory apology to the council.

25. Any councillor may require the clerk of the council to take down any particular expressions immediately on their being used.

Elections.

26. No election to any office at the disposal of the council shall take place until three clear days' notice shall have been given in one or more of the local newspapers, inviting applications or tenders for the same.

27. The clerk shall have the charge of the common seal of the corporation, and shall be responsible for the safe outsody and proper use of the same, each impression thereof being duly verified by the signature of that officer.

23. Any one or more of the standing orders of the council, except No. 23, may be suspended pro tempore in case of emergency, provided that the majority present deem it necessary.

29. The mayor of the begrouph, when appointed on committees, shall be chairman thereof, and the standing orders of the council shall be observed in all committees, except as to the number of times limited for speaking.
