## JURY LIST TO BE PREPARED FOR THE JURY DISTRICT OF BAIRNSDALE.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-second day of March, 1869.

### PRESENT:

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-eighth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, called *The Juries Statute 1865*, it is amongst other things enacted, that in case any assizes, or any county court or court of general sessions of the peace, shall hereafter be lawfully directed or appointed to be holden at any town other than those at which the same are now holden, the clerk of petty sessions at such court town, and the clerk of petty sessions at every other town or place within the jury district of such court town, and all justices, constables, officers of police, and sheriffs, shall within such time as the Governor in Council shall order for that occasion only, do and perform all such acts, matters, and things in and towards preparing, collecting, allowing, sending, and delivering the lists of men qualified and liable to serve as aforesaid, and making out the jury books for every such jury district as are thereinbefore required to be ordinarily done at a different time or period; and all such last-mentioned jury books shall be brought into use, and the persons whose names shall be therein set down shall be liable to serve immediately after the same shall have been made out by the sheriff; and the said last-mentioned books shall be used until new books shall have been prepared under the provisions thereinbefore contained: And whereas by an Order in Council made on the first day of February, 1869, it was ordered that a county court should be holden at Bairnsdale, the same being a place at which a county court has not previously been holden: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order direct that a jury list shall be prepared for the jury district of Bairnsdale, and that the several acts required by law be done within the times hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

The Clerk of Petty Sessions at Bairnsdale shall issue his warrant to prepare and make out the jury list for the jury district of Bairnsdale, on or before Tuesday the sixth day of April, 1869; such list shall be prepared forthwith, and the notice prescribed by *The Juries Statute 1865*, section 9, shall be affixed as provided by that Act on Sundays the second and ninth days of May, 1869, respectively; the court of petty sessions at Bairnsdale shall revise such list on Tuesday the twenty-fifth day of

May; such list shall be sent to the sheriff on or before Wednesday the twenty-sixth day of May aforesaid; and the jury book shall be prepared and brought into use on or before Monday the seventh day of June, 1869.

And the Honorable James Joseph Casey, Her Majesty's Minister of Justice for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

## DISTRICT FOR BEER LICENSES.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight-Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Wines, Beer, and Spirit Sale Statute* 1864, it is amongst other things enacted that a beer license shall authorize the licensee to sell and dispose of, not earlier than Six o'clock in the morning nor later than Eight o'clock in the evening, any ale or beer to be drunk in the house or on the premises described in such license, except in the city of Melbourne or town of Geelong, or in any borough; and if the premises described in such license be subsequently to the granting of such license brought within any borough, such license shall expire at the end of the then current year; provided that upon the application by the council of any borough, the Governor in Council may by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare the whole or any part of such borough a district wherein beer licenses may be granted; and may on a like application, revoke any such proclamation: And whereas by a Proclamation under the Hand of the Governor and the Seal of the colony, bearing date the first day of April, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, a portion of the Borough of Malmesbury therein described was declared a district wherein Beer Licenses might be granted: And whereas the Council of the said Borough has made application that a further portion of the said Borough may be added to the portion already proclaimed as aforesaid: Now, therefore, I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power conferred by the above-recited Act, do by this my Proclamation declare that the portion of the Borough of Malmesbury lying beyond three quarters of a mile of the present Post Office in the said Borough shall in addition to the portion thereof described in the Proclamation hereinbefore mentioned, be a district wherein Beer Licenses may be granted.

exercise of the power conferred by *The Local Government  
Act* 1863, has by Orders severally made on the 22nd day of  
March, 1869, directed that the undermentioned Shire Councils  
and District Road Boards shall, within the times by the said  
respective Orders appointed, execute the works on Main Roads
