CAUTION RESPECTING THE GOLD DISCOVERIES IN AFRICA.

THE subjoined notification, which has been received from the Government of Natal, is published for general information.

GOVERNMENT NOTICE, No. 23, 1869.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor directs it to be notified that two vessels have arrived in the Harbor of Port Natal from Australia, conveying a number of passengers, who have informed certain officers of this Government, at Durban, that they have come to Natal under a misapprehension which is widely spread in Australia, that what are there termed "payable gold-fields" exist, either in Natal, or the country of the Chief Moselikatse, at a distance of upwards of eight hundred miles in the interior of Africa, and beyond the territories of the Transvaal, or South African Republic.

The Lieutenant-Governor therefore deems it advisable to inform the public generally, both in Natal and elsewhere, that this Government is not in possession of evidence of the existence of gold in remunerative quantities, either in Natal or in the territories referred to, although auriferous spots have been discovered in both.

The Lieutenant-Governor deems it expedient also to caution persons at a distance against being misled by individual impressions of imperfect information, and against supposing that there exists at present in Natal such a demand for labor as would supply by its profits, to persons without capital, the means of proceeding into the interior.

JURY LISTS TO BE PREPARED FOR THE JURY DISTRICTS OF MANSFIELD AND WALHALLA.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the fifth day of April, 1869.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-eighth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, called *The Juriers Statute 1865*, it is amongst other things enacted, that in case any assizes, or any county court or court of general sessions of the peace, shall hereafter be lawfully directed or appointed to be holden at any town other than those at which the same are now holden, the clerk of petty sessions at such court town, and the clerk of petty sessions at every other town or place within the jury district of such court town, and all justices, constables, officers of police, and sheriffs, shall within such time as the Governor in Council shall order for that occasion only, do and perform all such acts, matters, and things in and towards preparing, collecting, allowing, sending, and delivering the lists of men qualified and liable to serve as aforesaid, and making out the jury books for every such jury district as are thereinbefore required to be ordinarily done at a different time or period; and all such last-mentioned jury books shall be brought into use, and the persons whose names shall be therein set down shall be

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liable to serve immediately after the same shall have been made out by the sheriff; and the said last-mentioned books shall be used until new books shall have been prepared under the provisions thereinbefore contained: And whereas by an Order of the Governor in Council, made on the first day of March, 1869, a County Court was directed to be holden at Mansfield: And whereas by another Order of the Governor in Council made on the fifteenth day of March, 1869, a County Court was directed, to be holden at Walhalla: And whereas Mansfield and Walhalla are places at which County Courts have not previously been holden: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order direct that jury lists shall be prepared for the jury districts of Mansfield and Walhalla respectively, and that the several acts required by law be done within the times hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

The Clerks of Petty Sessions shall issue their warrants to prepare and make out the jury lists on or before Monday the nineteenth day of April instant; such lists shall be prepared forthwith, and the notices prescribed by *The Juriers Statute 1865*, section 9, shall be affixed as provided by that Act on Sundays the sixteenth and twenty-third days respectively of May next ensuing; the courts of petty sessions at Mansfield and Stringer's Creek shall revise the respective lists on Friday, the fourth day of June in the present year; the lists shall be sent to the sheriff on or before Monday the seventh day of June aforesaid, and the jury books shall be prepared and brought into use on or before Monday the fourteenth day of June, 1869.

And the Honorable James Joseph Casey, Her Majesty's Minister of Justice for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE SHELFORD PUBLIC CEMETERY.

ALL charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the vault or ground is opened.

2. Any person or persons making a vault or erecting or placing a monument in the cemetery, by and with the permission of the trustees, under these rules, and upon the payment of the proper charges, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep a vault monument, or tombstone according to the tenor of such permission, to and for the sole use of such person, and his or their representatives for ever.

3. Application for such permission to be made at the office of the trustees. A certificate of permission in the form set forth in Schedule B, will be granted to the party applying for such permission on payment of the proper charges.

4. Orders for interment to be given at the office of the trustees on the previous day, between Eight o'clock a.m. and Five o'clock p.m.

5. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, but persons requiring brick graves or vaults, must construct them under the direction of the surveyor to the trustees, or any other person appointed by them for that purpose; and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent (in writing) of the party entitled thereto must be left with the order. The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death, must be stated at the time of giving the order.

6. The hour fixed for the funeral to be the time when the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually attended to.

7. Until otherwise ordered, the usual hours fixed for the performance of funerals will be from Ten o'clock a.m. till Six o'clock p.m. in the months of September to April inclusive; and from Four o'clock p.m. throughout the rest of the year.

8. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones, to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.

9. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of free-stone, slate, or iron.

10. No catacombs or any wooden fencing allowed without first submitting a plan for the approval of the trustees.

11. A plan of the cemetery, showing the situation of the purchased and other graves, is kept at the office. Registers of all permissions are to be kept by the secretary.

12. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these rules.

MINING OPERATIONS AUTHORIZED ON EXCEPTED LAND AT CASTLEMAINE.

THE Governor in Council has authorized Patrick Furlong to occupy for mining purposes, under miner's right, for a period not exceeding three months from the date hereof, all that piece or parcel of land containing two roads and two perches, more or less, being part of the volunteer drill ground at Castlemaine, which is described as follows: Commencing at the junction of the western side of Gingell street with the northern side of Caroline street; bounded thence by Caroline street bearing west one chain thirty-six links; thence by a line bearing north three chains fifty links to Barker's Creek; thence easterly by that creek to Gingell street; and thence by the western side of Gingell street bearing south four chains to the point of commencement. Subject to the following conditions, namely:—

1. The surface of the ground shall not be occupied for the purpose of residence, nor shall any tents or huts be erected thereon.

2. Only one block of ground, the extent of which shall not exceed fifteen feet by twelve feet, shall be mined upon at any one time; and each such block shall be properly filled in and levelled to the satisfaction of the warden before mining operations shall be commenced upon in any other block.

On the discontinuance of mining operations on the said land, if the above conditions shall have been fulfilled, one half of such deposit shall be returned to the depositor upon his applying for the same; and if, during a further period of six months, all depressions in the surface of the ground mined upon, which may have from time to time occurred, shall be satisfactorily filled in and levelled, and the surface of the ground left in as good a condition as before the commencement of mining operations, the remaining half of the said deposit shall be also returned to the depositor, but if any of the conditions be not fulfilled, of which the warden shall be the sole judge, the whole

or any part of the said deposit may be forfeited, and the cost of repairing any damage done to the reserve shall be defrayed out of the moneys so deposited, not as a penalty, but by way of liquidated damages.

6. In case any person mining under the authority of this order shall in any way violate the above conditions, it shall not be lawful for him any longer to mine upon or within the said lands.

**BYE-LAWS OF THE WOOLSTHORPE TOWN
COMMON.**

All persons entitled to depasture cattle on the Woolsthorpe Town Common, in respect of their right as resident householders, shall be allowed to run twelve head of cows with their calves, upon complying with the provisions as to registration and fees hereinafter mentioned.

2. Every foal or calf on arriving at the age of twelve months will be chargeable with the assessment or fees.

3. All persons entitled to depasture as above will be allowed to run six head of horses or mares.

4. All cows and calves to be branded with the common brand.

5. All goats and sheep to be charged two shillings; all cows or dry cattle to be charged four shillings; all horses or mares to be charged six shillings per head per annum; and to be paid for half-yearly in advance, at the time of registering them.

6. All persons entitled to commonage shall at the time of registering their horned cattle sign a declaration that such cattle are his or her *bona fide* property.

7. The managers reserve to themselves the right to add to, or diminish, the number of cattle at any time depasturing on the common, if grass is not sufficient, from fire or any other cause.

8. Travellers allowed to stop twenty-four hours only at one time.

9. The managers will not be responsible for any cattle, such as may be driven off the common, stolen, or strayed.

10. All strange cattle will be impounded by the herd.

11. All persons entitled to commonage earning their living by carrying on the roads, will be entitled to one head of horses instead of two head of horned cattle.
