And whereas the Governor in Council has received a petition signed by not less than twenty persons liable to be rated under the said Act in respect of rateable property in the said road district, praying for the division of the same into subdivisions: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order, divide the Lancefield Road District into three separate electoral subdivisions in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, by the names hereinafter assigned to the same respectively, and doth hereby set forth the boundaries of the said several subdivisions in manner following, that is to say:—

THE LANCEFIELD SUBDIVISION.—Commencing at a point in the western boundary of the road district, being the centre of a road dividing allotments 31, 32, 34, 37, 26, and 25 on the north, from allotments 42, 41, 40, and 38 on the south, and continuing along the centre of the said road to the eastern boundary of the road district; thence north, west, and south by the boundaries of the road district to the commencing point.

bearing date the first day of September, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, a road district was proclaimed under the designation of "The Upper Plenty or Morang Road District;" and the boundaries of the said road district were altered by a subsequent Proclamation bearing date the twenty-fourth day of August, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-three: And whereas the Governor in Council has received a petition signed by not less than twenty persons liable to be rated under the said Act in respect of rateable property in the said road district, praying for the division of the same into subdivisions: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth, by this present Order, divide the Upper Plenty or Morang Road District into three separate electoral subdivisions in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, by the names hereinafter assigned to the same respectively, and doth hereby set forth the boundaries of the said several subdivisions in manner following, that is to say:—

THE NORTHERN SUBDIVISION.—Commencing at a point in the centre of the River Plenty, at the intersection of the centre of a road forming the north boundary of section XI, parish of Yan Yean; thence southward by the centre of the said river to its intersection by the north boundary of section IV, in the said parish; thence east by the said boundary and a line east therefrom to Arthur's Creek; thence southward by this creek to a point due east from the north-west angle of section XV, parish of Morang; thence west to the said angle; thence due north to the centre of the road bounding section X, parish of Yan Yean, and east by the centre of said road to the commencing point.

THE NORTHERN SUBDIVISION.—Commencing at the junction of Mollison's Creek with the Sugarloaf Creek; thence

* This calculation is made upon the population at the last census, instead of the present population, as there are no means of estimating the changes which have taken place in the different sub-districts since the census was taken. It is believed that the present population of the whole district of Melbourne and suburbs amounts to 170,000. If this be correct, the mortality of the month under review would indicate a proportion of 2.21 deaths to every 1,000 persons living.

The mortality of Melbourne and suburbs, together with the mean temperature in the shade and the mean atmospheric pressure, during the month of March, for the last ten years, were as follow:—

Deaths in March were slightly above the average of ten years, but not more so than might be expected from the increase of population during the period. The mortality was greater than that of the same month in the first six years of the decenniad, but not so great as that during the remaining three.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at the Melbourne Observatory during the month was 89°·1 on the 27th; and the lowest was 42° on the 19th. The mean temperature (62°·7) was a degree and a half below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (42°·9) took place on the 2nd, viz.:—from a maximum of 86°·9 to a minimum of 44°. The least range (6°·6) was on the 30th, viz.:—from a maximum of 59°·8 to a minimum of 53°·2.

Males contributed 52 per cent. and females 48 per cent. to the total mortality. Children under five years of age contributed 48 per cent. against 61 per cent. in March, 1868; 63 per cent. in March, 1867; 67 per cent. in March, 1866; 59 per cent. in March, 1865; 58 per cent. in March, 1864; 57 per cent. in March, 1863; 58 per cent. in March, 1862; 65 per cent. in March, 1861; and 61 per cent. in March, 1860. It will be observed that during the past ten years children under five have uniformly contributed more than half to the mortality of the month of March, except in the case of the month under review.

A male aged ninety-two years died of congestion of the brain, and a female of eighty-three died of old age. These are the oldest persons whose deaths were recorded as occurring during the month.

Twenty-one violent deaths occurred during the month of which 15 were recorded as accidental, 5 as suicidal, and 1 as a judicial execution. The accidental deaths were those of a farm laborer aged 17 who died of a ruptured liver caused by being knocked down by a dray, of a laborer aged 25 who died from the effects of a kick of a horse in the abdomen, of a female aged 32 who died of a fractured leg received whilst in a state of delirium tremens, of a brickmaker aged 35 who died of a ruptured bladder caused by external violence, of a drayman aged 41 who died of a fractured leg caused by a cask falling on him, of a drayman aged 42 who died of injuries caused by a fall from a dray, of a boy aged 14 who died of a wounded artery, of an infant aged 3 months and of an infant aged 31, and of a seaman aged 32 who were drowned, and of a shoemaker aged 30 who died of lead-poisoning. The suicidal deaths were those of a builder aged 40 who died from the effects of a wound inflicted by himself whilst laboring under temporary insanity, of a dealer aged 56 who cut his throat, of a female aged 54 who drowned herself, of a female aged 49 who hanged herself whilst laboring under temporary insanity resulting from the effects of drink, and of a carpenter aged 62 who hanged himself. The execution was that of a police trooper aged 37, and took place in the Melbourne Gaol.

Seventy-four deaths or 20 per cent. of the whole occurred in public institutions, viz.:—45 in the Melbourne Hospital, 2 in the Lying-in Hospital, 2 in the Small-pox Hospital, Royal Park, 3 in the Benevolent Asylum, 4 in the Immigrants' Home, 7 in the Industrial Schools, 8 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 1 in the Carlton Lunatic Asylum, 1 in the Melbourne Gaol, and 1 in the Penridge Stockade.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 181, of which 88, or nearly 49 per cent., were of males, and 93, or about 51 per cent., were of females. Of those dying, 120 were under one year of age, 37 were between one and two years, 12 were between two and three, 8 were between three and four, and 4 were between four and five.

The persons dying at a more advanced age than five years numbered 194, of which 108, or nearly 56 per cent., were males, and 86, or about 44 per cent., were females; 14 were between five and ten, 7 were between ten and fifteen, 9 were between fifteen and twenty, 13 were between twenty and twenty-five, 18 were between twenty-five and thirty, 20 were between thirty and thirty-five, 31 were between thirty-five and forty, 22 were between forty and forty-five, 16 were between forty-five and fifty, 13 were between fifty and fifty-five, 8 were between fifty-five and sixty, 14 were between sixty and sixty-five, 3 were between sixty-five and seventy, 3 were between seventy and seventy-five, 2 were eighty and upwards, and 1 was of age unspecified.

About an equal number of deaths occurred from local and from zymotic diseases. Of the former, 4 resulted from small-pox, which are the first since December; 27 resulted from scarlatina and diphtheria, against 19 in February; 50 from diarrhoea and dysentery, against 77 in February; 11 from typhoid and infantile fever, against 7 in February; and 6 from whooping-cough, against the same number in February. An unusually large number of violent deaths occurred during the month under review.

The deaths during the past quarter numbered 42 less than the average of the corresponding quarter of the last ten years including the present year. The mean temperature of the quarter was seven-tenths of a degree lower than an average extending over the same period.

RULES FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE MEREDITH TOWN COMMON.

ALL resident householders by law entitled to use the said Common will be allowed to depasture thereon their *bona fide* cattle, sheep, and goats, to the extent of and on payment of the fees set forth in the annexed schedules, one and two, and subject to the following regulations—

2. All persons taking cattle to the common must deliver them into the charge of the herdsman, by putting the cattle into the common's stock yard, produce their license for the herdsman's inspection, also a written description of the age, sex, color, and owners' visible firebrands, and, if possible, stating where bred or purchased, in order to be copied by the herdsman in the book of register, the herdsman to sign and return the said written description; after which the persons bringing the cattle will have to sign the book of registry. Should any cattle, sheep, goats, or horses, be lost by the herdsman, he shall be responsible to the amount of half their value, the managers to stop the amount out of the said herdsman's wages, if the said managers have any funds belonging to the said herdsman in their possession. The lost cattle to be valued as follows:—By the valuers, one to be chosen by the owner, and one by the herdsman, the value not to exceed five pounds each for cattle, ten pounds for horses, and ten shillings for sheep and goats each. Should the valuers not agree, the managers to decide, and the decision of any two of them to be final. But the herdsman not to incur such liability if by no neglect on his part, and that the owners be apprised of their being missing within fifteen hours.

5. It will not be competent for any householder to replace any cattle, horses, sheep, or goats, except on the regular mustering days, viz., 26th November, 26th February, 26th May, and 26th August, when all are branded with the letter M, paid for in advance, and then placed on the common.
