Deaths in March were slightly above the average of ten years, but not more so than might be expected from the increase of population during the period. The mortality was greater than that of the same month in the first six years of the decenniad, but not so great as that during the remaining three.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at the Melbourne Observatory during the month was 89°1 on the 27th; and the lowest was 42° on the 19th. The mean temperature (62°7) was a degree and a half below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (42°0) took place on the 2nd, viz.:—from a maximum of 86°9 to a minimum of 44°. The least range (6°6) was on the 30th, viz.:—from a maximum of 59°8 to a minimum of 53°2.

Males contributed 52 per cent. and females 48 per cent. to the total mortality. The lost cattle to be valued as follows:—By the valuators, one to be chosen by the swiner, and one by the herdsman, the value not to exceed five pounds each for cattle, ten pounds for horses, and ten shillings for sheep and goats each. Should the valuators not agree, the managers to decide, and the decision of any two of them to be final. But the herdsman not to incur such libbility if by no neglect on his part, and that the owners be apprised of their being missing within fitteen hours.
