# THE SUBDIVISIONS OF THE SPRINGFIELD ROAD DISTRICT.

*At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the third day of May, 1869.*

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1863*, it is amongst other things enacted that at any time after the first annual election or general election, as the case may be, or first appointment of members of the district board for any original or proclaimed district (hereinafter sometimes called "single district"), the Governor in Council, if it seem fit, may, and if he shall have received a petition to that effect signed by twenty persons liable to be rated under the said Act in respect of rateable property in the said district, shall, within three months after the receipt of the same, divide the district into two, or, if the Governor in Council shall see fit, into three separate electoral subdivisions (hereinafter called subdivisions), by such names as shall by such Order in Council be assigned to the same, and in and by such Order in Council the boundaries of the subdivisions shall be set forth; provided that no such division shall be made within three months before any day appointed for holding any election of members of the district board in or for such district: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the twenty-ninth day of July, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, a road district was proclaimed under the designation of "The Springfield Road District." And whereas the Governor in Council has received a petition signed by not less than twenty persons liable to be rated under the said Act in respect of rateable property in the said road district, praying for the division of the same into subdivisions: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth, by this present Order, divide the Springfield Road District into two separate electoral subdivisions in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, by the names hereinafter assigned to the same respectively, and doth hereby set forth the boundaries of the said several subdivisions in manner following, that is to say:—

**THE NORTHERN SUBDIVISION.**—Commencing at the Deep Creek, at the south-west angle of section 23, parish of Forbes; thence due east to the south-east angle of section 87; thence northwardly by the centre of the road dividing section 87 from section 84 to the south-west angle of section 88; thence due east to the south-east angle of section 88; thence northwardly, westwardly, and southwardly by the boundaries of the Road District to the commencing point.

**THE SOUTHERN SUBDIVISION.**—Commencing at the Deep Creek, at the north-west angle of allotment 1, parish of Chintin; thence due east to the south-east angle of section 87; thence northwardly by the centre of the road dividing sections 87 and 84 to the north-west angle of section 84; thence due east to the north-east angle of section 84; thence southwardly, westwardly, and northwardly by the boundaries of the Road District to the commencing point.

And the Honorable James Forrester Sullivan, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Railways and Roads for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable SIR JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1863* it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time, if it shall seem fit, to add to any district not divided into subdivisions, or to any subdivision, or separately to two or more subdivisions of a district so divided, any portion of the colony actually adjoining to such district or subdivision, as the case may be, and not lying within the limits of the city of Melbourne or town of Geelong, or of any municipal or road district; and every such portion so added shall thereupon become and be part of such first-mentioned district to all intents and purposes, and of the subdivision, if any, to which the same shall have been added: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the twenty-second day of June, 1868, a road district was proclaimed under the designation of "The Alexandra Road District." And whereas it has seemed fit to the Governor in Council to add to the said road district the area of territory lying south-eastward of and adjoining to such district, and not lying within the limits of the above-mentioned city and town, or any municipal or road district: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby add to the Alexandra Road District a portion of the colony adjoining to such district (such portion not lying within the city or town above-mentioned, or any municipal or road district), in accordance with the above-

recited provisions of the said Act; and do re-define the whole of the said road district added to as aforesaid, in manner following, that is to say:—

THE ALEXANDRA ROAD DISTRICT.—Commencing at the junction of the House Creek with the Goulburn River; thence due north to Anglesey county boundary; thence north-eastward and south-eastward by the said county boundary to the Goulburn River; thence north-eastward and southward by this river to the south-east corner of Dorohat run; thence due south to the watershed between the Goulburn and Big rivers; thence southward by the said watershed to the Hind Hill; thence westward to Mount Arnold; thence north-westward to the northern angle of the parish of Buxton; thence south-westward by the boundary of this parish to the Acheron River; thence northward by this river to the south-east corner of Riversdale No. 1 run; thence north-westward by the boundaries of Riversdale 1 and 2, Whanegarwen runs, to the Goulburn River; thence eastward and northward by said river to the commencing point.

# WOOD'S POINT PUBLIC CEMETERY.

THE following Rules were adopted by the Wood's Point Borough Council (the Trustees of the Wood's Point General Cemetery) at Meeting of Council held 18th November, 1868.

*Rules and Regulations made by the Trustees of the Wood's Point General Cemetery (the Wood's Point Borough Council).*

The following are the Rules and Regulations of this Cemetery:—

1. Applications for permission to inter in the cemetery can be obtained at the office of the trustees, from the officer appointed by them, on production of the proper certificates; and when permission is granted it must be in writing, and delivered to the keeper of the cemetery before the funeral enters the gate.
2. At the time of making the application for permission to inter, the information required in and by Schedule A to these rules must be given, and the proper fees paid.
3. Applications for permission to build a vault or erect a monument must be made at the office of the trustees, when a certificate of permission will be granted to the person applying, on payment of the proper charges.
4. The trustees will not undertake to cause graves to be dug, but parties digging or re-opening graves or vaults, will be required to do so at their own expense, under the direction of an officer appointed by the trustees.
5. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and a plan of every monument, must be submitted to the trustees for their approval.
6. The trustees, if required, will cause all ordinary graves to be dug at an extra expense of Fifteen shillings.
7. All monuments, vaults, graves, gravestones, and fences, to be kept in repair and in proper condition at the expense of the owner.
8. Wooden fences allowed, but if not kept in proper repair, will be removed by order of the trustees, without notice to the owner.
9. A plan of the cemetery and register will be kept at the office of the trustees.
10. The charges will be remitted for the burial of any person, on evidence being produced to the trustees or the person appointed by them to receive such evidence, that the relatives or friends of such person are unable to pay the costs and charges.
11. It is notified that any person wantonly or wilfully destroying, or doing or causing to be done, any damage to any monument, vault, or tombstone, building, erection, paling, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant in the cemetery, will be prosecuted as the law directs.
12. The hours appointed for interment are from Eight o'clock a.m. until Six o'clock p.m. from the 1st of September to 30th of April, and from Eight o'clock a.m. until Four o'clock p.m. during the remaining months of the year.
13. No discharge of fireworks will be allowed to take place within the precincts of the cemetery.
14. No dogs will be allowed to enter the cemetery.
15. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in the charges and regulations.

# TYABB PUBLIC CEMETERY.

THE RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE TYABB PUBLIC CEMETERY.

ALL charges to be paid when orders are given and before the ground is opened.

2. Any person making a vault, or erecting and placing a monument in the cemetery, by and with permission of the trustees under these rules, and upon payment of the proper charges, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep up such vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the terms of such permission, to and for the sole and separate use of such person and his representatives for ever.
3. Application for such permission must be made at the office of the trustees, when a certificate will be granted on payment of the proper charges.
4. The charges to be remitted on the burial of any poor person in the cemetery, on the certificate of a minister of religion or other satisfactory evidence to the trustees that such person was a pauper, or that the relations and friends of the deceased were unable to pay the costs and charges.
5. Orders for interment must be given at the office of the trustees eight working hours prior to the hour fixed for the funeral, if not an extra charge will be made. No free interment will be allowed without the above notice.
6. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but parties wanting brick graves or vaults will be required to construct them under the direction of the trustees; and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault the consent, in writing, of the party entitled thereto must be left with the order.
7. The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death must be stated at the time of giving the order.
8. The time fixed for the funeral must be the time when the procession is at the cemetery, and must be punctually observed.
9. Until otherwise ordered the usual hours fixed for the performance of funerals will be from Eight o'clock a.m. to Five o'clock p.m.
10. All monuments, vaults, grave and gravestones must be kept in repair and proper condition by and at the expense of the owner.
11. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave must be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron.
12. A drawing of every tombstone, tomb, pedestal, and a plan of every monument or tablet proposed to be erected, and of every epitaph or inscription must be submitted to the trustees, according to the requirements of the statute.
13. A plan of the cemetery showing the situation of the graves is kept at the office, and may be inspected; and registers of all grants is kept by the clerk.
14. The keeper has orders to turn out or take into custody any person who shall commit any trespass, or injury to any of the trees, flowers, or erections, or otherwise infringe the acts relating to the cemetery or the regulations for the protection of the same will be proceeded against according to law.
15. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations they may think proper, from time to time, in the charges and in the regulations of the cemetery.

4. All assessments to be paid half-yearly, in advance; the half-year to commence on the first day of January and the first day of July in each year.
5. The owners of stock depasturing on the aforesaid common will be required to muster them in their own yards, or some more convenient place, as often as may be found necessary, to be branded with the common brand in pitch, upon notice being given them by the herdsman or manager; all unbranded stock to be considered as straying, and to be impounded forthwith.

Should any manager vacate his office during the currency of any year, the Board will appoint another in his stead, who shall continue in office so long only as the manager, in whose stead he was appointed, would have continued in office.
14. The managers shall elect a secretary from among themselves, who shall keep the common account, issue licenses, receive and disburse monies connected with the common, subject to the consent and approval of the other managers, and shall pay to the secretary of the Road Board the balance (if any) after defraying the working expenses of the common.
