TYABB PUBLIC CEMETERY.

THE RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE TYABB PUBLIC CEMETERY.

A LL charges to be paid when orders are given and before the ground is opened.

2. Any person making a vault, or erecting and placing a monument in the cemetery, by and with permission of the trustees under these rules, and upon payment of the proper charges, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep up such vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the terms of such pormission, to and for the sole and separate use of such preson and his representatives for ever.

Application for such permission must be made at the office of the trustees, when a certificate will be granted on payment of the proper charges.

4. The charges to be remitted on the burial of any poor person in the cemetery, on the certificate of a minister of religion or other satisfactory evidence to the trustees that such person was a pauper, or that the relations and friends of the deceased were unable to pay the costs and charges.

5. Orders for interment must be given at the office of the trustees eight working hours prior to the hour fixed for the funeral, if not an extra charge will be made. No free interment will be allowed without the above notice.

6. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but parties wanting brick graves or vaults will be required to construct them under the direction of the trustees; and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault the consent, in writing, of the party entatled thereto must be left with the order.

7. The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death must be stated at the time of giving the order.

8. The time fixed for the funeral must be the time when the procession is at the cemetery, and must be punctually observed.

9. Until otherwise ordered the usual hours fixed for the per-formance of funerals will be from Eight o'clock a.m. to Five

9. Until otherwise ordered the usual nours inset for the performance of funerals will be from Eight o'clock a.m. to Five o'clock p.m.

10. All monuments, vaults, grave and gravestones must be kept in repair and proper condition by and at the expense of the owner.

11. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave must be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron.

12. A drawing of every tombstone, tomb, pedestal, and a plan of every monument or tablet proposed to be erected, and of every epitagh or inscription must be submitted to the trustees, according to the requirements of the statute.

13. A plan of the cemetery showing the situation of the graves is kept at the office, and may be inspected; and registers of all grants is kept by the clerk.

14. The keeper has orders to turn out or take into custody any person who shall commit any trequest, or injury to any of the trees, flowers, or erections, or otherwise infringe the acts relating to the 'cemetery or the regulations for the protection of the same will be proceeded against according to law.

15. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations they may think proper, from time to time, in the charges and in the regulations of the cemetery.
