PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable SIR JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Justices of the Peace Statute 1865*, it is amongst other things enacted that Courts of General Sessions of the Peace shall be holden in and for such places or districts within Victoria as the Governor in Council appoints; and the Governor in Council may from time to time define and appoint the limits and boundaries of the places or districts within which all such courts shall have jurisdiction respectively, and the places and times at which such courts shall be holden: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby appoint the Courts of General Sessions of the Peace at the under-mentioned places, to be holden on the days hereinafter mentioned, for and in lieu of certain days appointed by a former Proclamation for the holding of the said courts, that is to say:—

At Palmerston, on Friday the third day of September, in lieu of the seventh of August, 1869.

At Sale, on Monday the thirtieth day of August, in lieu of the eleventh of August, 1869.

AGRICULTURAL AREA COMMON.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable SIR JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Amending Land Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected under *The Land Act 1862*, or selected or leased under the now reciting Act, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land a farmers' common; when one-eighth part of any agricultural area has been selected under *The Land Act 1862*, or selected or leased under the now reciting Act, the Governor in Council may proclaim any unselected and unleased portion of such agricultural area, not exceeding twice the quantity so selected and leased, to be a temporary common for the use of such selectors and lessees: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the common hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Act, that is to say:—

WARRABKOOK AGRICULTURAL AREA COMMON.—Allotment 4 of section 10, in the parish of Warrabkook, containing an area of three hundred and fifty-seven acres and thirty-nine perches, shall be and constitute a temporary common for the use of selectors and lessees in the agricultural area of Warrabkook.—(68.L.11819.)

TOWN COMMONS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable SIR JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1862* it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon or within five miles of any gold-field, or in or within five miles of any town not contained in any municipal district, or within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land to be a municipal common, or a gold-fields common, or a town common, or a farmers' common respectively, as the case may be; and it is also enacted, that the Governor in Council may at any time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim or increase (as the case may be) the commons hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

CASTLE DONNINGTON TOWN COMMON.—The Castle Donnington Town Common, described in a Proclamation bearing date the 1st day of October, 1866, is hereby increased by adding thereto the unappropriated Crown lands comprised within the boundaries described as follow, viz.:—Commencing at the north-east angle of the town of Castle Donnington, being a point on the left bank of the Murray River; bounded thence by that river bearing northerly to the north-east angle of suburban section 1; thence by a line bearing west one hundred and nineteen chains sixty-three links; thence by a line bearing south one hundred and fifty-six chains fifty links to a point bearing west from the south-west angle of the cemetery reserve; thence by a line bearing east one hundred and forty-three chains, more or less, to an anabranch of the aforesaid river; thence by that anabranch bearing northerly and westerly to the south-east angle of the aforesaid town; and thence by the south, west, and north boundaries of that town bearing respectively west, north, and east to the point of commencement. Area added to common, about 950 acres.—(69 S.5841.)

MIAMI TOWN COMMON.—The unappropriated Crown land in the town of Miami, comprising an area of 580 acres, more or less, shall be and constitute a Town Common for the use of all householders of that town.—(69 U.5088.)
