be a municipal common, or a gold-fields common, or a town common, or a farmers' common respectively, as the case may be; and it is also enacted, that the Governor in Council may at any time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby alter the common hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

LITTLE RIVER AND DUCK PONDS UNITED FARMERS' COMMON.—The United Farmers' Common of Little River and Duck Ponds, described in a Proclamation bearing date the 26th day of January, 1863, and diminished by a Proclamation bearing date the 26th day of April, 1869, is hereby altered by adding thereto the unappropriated Crown lands in the parish of Wurd Youang, and deducting therefrom the unappropriated Crown lands in the parishes of Woornyalook and Moranghurk.—(69.P.5255.)
