SPECIAL NOTICE TO HOLDERS OF ELECTORS' RIGHTS.

IT is hereby notified that holders of Electors' Rights, issued on or before the 1st day of September, 1868, must obtain renewed rights in lieu thereof, in order to have their names placed upon the General Lists to be made up on the 1st day of September next.

Neglect of this precaution will result in the omission of the names of the persons so neglecting from the new lists to be made up as aforesaid.

The old right must in every case be delivered up to the registrar, but the renewed right will bear the same number and will be in the like form and tenor as that in lieu of which it is issued, and will be equally available for any election that may take place before the completion of the new roll in October next.

No Elector whose name is on a Roll of Ratepaying Electors for any province or district is entitled to a renewed Elector's Right for such province or district.—*Vide* section 21 of Act 334, and sections 61 and 62 of *The Electoral Act 1865*.

BALLARAT MINING DISTRICT.

BYE-LAW NO. VII. OF THE MINING BOARD OF THE MINING DISTRICT OF BALLARAT. [12th May, 1869.]

AT a Meeting of the Mining Board of the Mining District of Ballarat, begun and holden at Ballarat, in the said district, on the twelfth day of May, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, it is ordained by the said Board as follows, that is to say:—

1. *Repealing clause.*—That the several clauses numbered 1 to 14 both inclusive, and clause 56 of, and the schedules numbered respectively I. and X. to the bye-law, of the mining board of the mining district of Ballarat, numbered III., published in the *Government Gazette* on the seventeenth day of August, 1866; and the clauses numbered respectively 4, 5, 7, and 8 of, and the schedule numbered II. to the bye-law of the mining board of the mining district of Ballarat, numbered IV., published in the *Government Gazette* on the second day of November, 1866; and the bye-law of the mining board of the mining district of Ballarat numbered VI., published in the *Government Gazette* on the twenty-third day of October, 1868, shall be and the same are hereby repealed, always saving and excepting the rights of persons thereunder existing prior to and at the time of this bye-law coming into operation.

2. *Definition of claims.*—A claim shall be such a parcel of land as may in accordance with the provisions of any mining board bye-law in force in this district be taken possession of by or for any holder of a miner's right, or by or for any number of persons each being the holder of a miner's right, acting in conjunction, or any number of such parcels as shall be lawfully amalgamated, or any divided portion or sub-division of a claim which shall have been transferred from the claimholders to other persons; and for the purposes of fixing and defining the dimensions and boundaries thereof, and the position with respect to any reef or lead, claims shall be divided into two classes, namely, alluvial claims and quartz claims, and alluvial claims shall be subdivided into registered alluvial claims and unregistered alluvial claims.

3. *Mode of determining extent of registered alluvial claims.*—The extent of a registered alluvial claim shall depend upon and be determined by the depth of the lead below the surface of such claim, and the number of persons by or for whom the claim is taken possession of and held, and for the purpose of determining the dimensions of a claim the depth of the lead shall be ascertained or computed from the most reliable data obtainable; provided always that the extent of a claim shall not, after the boundaries thereof have been adjusted and registered, be varied by reason of the depth of the lead being subsequently found to be greater or less than was computed at the time of fixing the extent and boundaries of such claim.

4. *Extent of registered alluvial claims.*—The size of a registered alluvial claim shall be in accordance with the schedule hereto numbered I., having regard to the depth of the lead within such claim and the number of persons holders of miners' rights by or for whom such claim shall have been taken possession of.

5. *Size of unregistered alluvial claims.*—The size of an unregistered alluvial claim shall depend solely upon the number of persons by or for whom possession thereof is taken.

6. *Size of unregistered alluvial claims.*—The maximum extent of ground which may be taken possession of, and be held by one person as an unregistered claim, shall be 5000 superficial feet; the maximum extent of ground which may be taken possession of and be held as an unregistered claim by two persons shall be 10000 superficial feet; and so on in like proportion (that is to say, in the proportion of 5000 superficial feet for each person) for any number of persons who shall take possession of and hold conjointly.

7. *Boundaries of unregistered claim when to be defined.*—The boundaries of an unregistered claim shall be completely and accurately defined at the time of taking possession thereof, and for the purpose of taking possession a post not less than three inches in diameter and not less than three feet in height shall be fixed, and a V trench not less than six inches deep and six feet long shall be cut at each corner or at each angle of the claim, and such posts and trenches shall be maintained by the holders of the claim during their occupancy. The person or persons who shall have so taken possession of an unregistered claim shall, during the continuance in force of his miners' right or their respective miners' rights, subject to the provisions of any mining board bye-law in force in this district, be entitled (except as against Her Majesty and except as against any person or persons who shall have previously taken and be in possession of the ground comprised in such claim) to all gold in and upon such claim.

8. *Amalgamation of unregistered claims.*—Adjacent unregistered claims may by consent of their respective owners be amalgamated.

9. *Extent of quartz claims.*—The width of a quartz claim shall not exceed seven hundred and fifty (750) feet, by such length along the course or supposed course of a quartz reef or lode as shall be equal to or shall not exceed one hundred (100) feet per man; that is to say, a quartz claim for one person being the holder of a miner's right shall not exceed 100 feet in length by 750 feet in width; a quartz claim for two persons being each the holder of a miner's right shall not exceed 200 feet in length by 750 feet in width; and so on in the proportion of 100 feet or less in length along the course or supposed course of any quartz reef or lode for each and every of the persons who shall conjointly take possession thereof, by a width of 750 feet or less, shall be a quartz claim.

10. *Plurality of claims.*—Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in any bye-law of any mining board in force in this district, any one person being the holder of a miner's right shall, by himself alone or in conjunction with other persons, each being the holder of a miner's right, subject to the provisions contained in any such bye-law as aforesaid, relating to the mode of taking possession of claims and the mode of pro-

ceeding to obtain registration of such claims, be entitled to take possession of any number of claims not exceeding fifty (50).

11. *Mode of taking possession of claims.*—Any person being the holder of a miner's right, or any number of persons each being the holder of a miner's right and acting in conjunction, may take possession of a claim by fixing in the ground firmly at each corner, or at a point as nearly as practicable to each corner of the claim, a post projecting above the surface not less than three feet, and in all cases where any portion of the areas included within such posts shall, previous to the fixing thereof, have been exempted or excepted from occupation for mining purposes within the meaning of *The Mining Statute* 1865, or in case any such area shall be intersected by any land so exempted or excepted the fixing of the posts as aforesaid shall, as far as respects the ground within (or intended to be included within) such area which shall not have been so exempted or excepted as aforesaid, be deemed as valid and sufficient for all purposes of possession under this bye-law, as if the land so exempted or excepted had not been included within such area, and provided the person or persons taking possession of a claim as aforesaid shall, within forty-eight hours (Sundays and public holidays excepted) after taking possession, make application therefor in the form in the schedule hereto numbered II. to the mining registrar, and produce to the registrar a miner's right in the name of the applicant, or in the names of each of the applicants, and thereafter proceed in the manner prescribed by the mining board bye-laws in force in this district to obtain survey and registration of such claim; such possession as aforesaid shall be deemed a good, sufficient, and valid title to such claim within the meaning of *The Mining Statute* 1865, except as against any person or persons previously and at the time in occupation of the whole or any portion of the land comprised in the claim so taken possession of until such claim shall have been surveyed and registered, or until the mining registrar shall have refused, in accordance with any mining board bye-law in force in this district, to make registration thereof.

12. *Time for fixing boundaries of claims.*—It shall not be necessary at the time of taking possession of a registered claim to mark or define the boundaries thereof accurately and completely, but at the time of making survey the boundaries shall be adjusted so as to include the land taken possession of (or intended to be taken possession of) and which shall have been applied for; and the boundaries of every claim shall, before registration thereof, be completely and accurately defined and delineated upon a plan.

13. *Claimholders entitled to gold.*—The person or persons being lawfully the registered holder, or holders of any claim shall, during the continuance in force of any miner's right in the name of such person, or of each such person connected in the register with such claim, and subject to the provisions of any mining board bye-law in force in this district, be deemed in law to be possessed (except as against Her Majesty only) of the parcel or parcels of land comprised in such claim, and the property therein, and every share or interest which may be created therein shall be deemed a chattel interest, and during such continuance and subject as aforesaid all gold then being in and upon any such parcel or parcels of land shall (except as against Her Majesty) be the absolute property of the person or persons for the time being in lawful occupation of such parcel or parcels of land.

14. *Creation of shares.*—The person or persons who shall have taken possession of and shall have applied for, any claim shall, when registration is made of such claim, be registered as the holders thereof, and such person or persons may at any time thereafter create any number of shares or interests in such claim, and may appropriate such shares or any portion thereof, and for the purpose of registering the shares so created the registered holder or holders of any claim may, in the form in the schedule hereto numbered III., notify the mining registrar of the creation and appropriation of shares therein, and the persons to whom the shares so created have been appropriated may, in the form in the schedule hereto numbered IV., require the mining registrar to make registration of such shares, in accordance with the terms of the notice of the creation and appropriation thereof.

15. *Transfers of claims or shares created in claims.*—The registered holder or holders of any claim or other mining tenement, or the registered holder of any lien upon any claim or other mining tenement, may, in the form in the schedule hereto numbered V., and the holders of any share created in any claim or other mining tenement, or any interest therein, may, in the form in the schedule numbered XI. to the bye-law of the mining board of the district of Ballarat numbered III., assign or transfer such claim or other mining tenement, share, interest, or lien, or any portion thereof, or interest therein, to any other person or persons being the holder of a miner's right, or holders of miners' rights: Provided that every such transfer shall be signed by the parties thereto in the presence of some person or persons who shall attest the signatures to such transfer; and upon the completion of such transfer and delivery to the registrar of the certificate, transfer, or lien-ticket, and miner's right, or miners' rights, under which such claim or other mining tenement, share, interest, or lien shall have been held, the registrar shall record upon the register relating to the claim or other mining tenement, share, interest, or lien so transferred, the date on which such transfer shall have been made, and the name of the transferee, together with such other particulars relating to such transfer as to such registrar shall appear necessary, and shall issue to the transferee a duplicate of the transfer. The registrar shall retain and file the certificate, transfer, or lien-ticket delivered to him as aforesaid, and, in the event of the transferor having transferred only an undivided interest in the share held by him under such certificate, transfer, or lien-ticket, the registrar shall issue to the transferor a certificate in the form in the schedule numbered XII. to the bye-law of the mining board of the mining district of Ballarat numbered III., describing accurately the interest retained by the said transferor: Provided always that if a sufficient number of

miners' rights in force, or a sufficient consolidated miner's right in force, shall be held by, or on behalf of the holders in respect of any claim or other mining tenement, the transferor or the transferee of any lien upon, or any share or interest created in such claim or other mining tenement, shall not for the purposes of transfer be required to produce any miner's right; and further, provided that the miners' rights or consolidated miner's right under which the claim or other mining tenement, share, interest, or lien had been held, may, with the consent of all the parties interested, be transferred with such claim or other mining tenement, share, interest, or lien, to the transferee; and if required so to do, the registrar shall endorse such transfer upon such miner's right, or consolidated miner's right.

16. *Transfer of subdivisions of claims.*—In the event of a claim or other mining tenement being subdivided, and a divided portion or subdivision being transferred from the registered holders of such claim or other tenement to another or other persons, plans shall be produced to the registrar showing respectively the divided portion or subdivision of the claim or mining tenement to be transferred, and the divided portion or subdivision of such claim or other mining tenement to be retained, and the plan of such first-mentioned portion or subdivision shall be referred to in the tickets upon which such transfers are made, and when the transfers shall have been completed the registrar shall make registration (under the date of the original registration) of the divided portion or subdivision of the claim or other mining tenement retained by the persons who were at the date of the subdivision, the registered holders of the entire claim or other mining tenement, and shall make a separate registration of the divided portion or subdivision of such claim or other mining tenement which shall have been transferred, and upon the face of the register of the entire claim or other mining tenement, the registrar shall make a minute of such subdivision and transfer.

17. *Number of shares may be transferred on one ticket.*—Any person holding two or more undivided shares in any one claim or other mining tenement may transfer the whole of such shares upon one transfer ticket.

18. *Lien.*—The holder or holders of any registered claim or other mining tenement may, in the form in the schedule hereto numbered VI, and the holder of any share or interest created in any claim or other mining tenement may, in the form in the schedule hereto numbered VII, grant a lien upon the same to any other person or persons as security for the due payment of any debt or liability, and upon production to the registrar of the transfer-ticket or certificate under which the intending lienor holds the claim, or other mining tenement, share, or interest intended to be made the subject of a lien, and of the miner's right of the intending lienee, and upon the execution of a lien-ticket by the lienor and lienee, in the form aforesaid, duly attested, the registrar shall register a lien upon the aforesaid claim or other mining tenement, share, or interest, and after having made such registration, the registrar shall issue to the lienee a duplicate of the lien-ticket as aforesaid, and shall retain and file the transfer-ticket or certificate of the lienor until such lien shall have been satisfied and the subject thereof released; and every such lien, granted and duly registered as aforesaid, shall be a specific charge upon the claim or other mining tenement or interest which shall have been so made the subject of such lien, until the debt or liability shall have been discharged in full, and registered liens shall take precedence according to the dates of their respective registrations by the registrar; and every transfer of any claim or other mining tenement, share, or interest, held under lien, shall be made subject to every registered lien thereon: Whenever the sum secured under any lien shall have been paid, and all lawful demands in respect thereof satisfied, the lienee shall fill up and sign in the presence of a witness who shall attest his signature thereto, the form of release at the back of the lien-ticket, and upon receipt by the registrar of the lien-ticket, with the form of release duly filled up and signed, he shall record such release in the register, and return to the lienor the transfer-ticket or certificate retained and filed as aforesaid.

19. *Portions of claims may be abandoned.*—The holder or all the holders of any claim may at any time, provided such claim be not the subject of a lien duly registered in the books of the mining registrar, abandon any portion of such claim, by lodging with mining registrar a notice signed by all the registered holders of the claim, stating that they have abandoned such portion of the claim as shall be described and delineated upon a plan attached to such notice, and thenceforth the land comprised in the portion of the claim delineated upon such plan shall be deemed absolutely abandoned, and may at any time thereafter be taken possession of by the holder of a miner's right, or by the holders of miners' rights in the same manner as land which had not been previously held and occupied for mining purposes, and the abandonment of a portion of a claim shall not in any way prejudicially affect the title to the remaining portion of such claim.

20. *Interpretation clause.*—Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in any bye-law of any mining board in force in this district, the words "a sufficient miner's right" and the words "sufficient miners' rights" wherever they occur in any bye-law aforesaid, shall for all purposes under such bye-laws and under this bye-law have and bear the following meaning and interpretation and none other, that is to say:—the words "a sufficient miner's right" shall mean and be interpreted to mean any current or unexpired miner's right of the applicant or applicants for, or the holder or holders of any mining tenement; and the words "sufficient miners' rights" shall mean and be interpreted to mean any current or unexpired miners' rights of the applicant or applicants for, or the holder or holders of any mining tenement; the words "in the form in the schedule hereto" shall mean and be interpreted to mean in the form of or to the like effect as the schedule referred to; the words "a registered claim" or "a registered alluvial claim" shall mean and be interpreted to mean a claim or an alluvial claim which is to be or which shall be registered.

And so on, in like proportion, according to the number of persons; that is to say, a claim for a number of persons who take possession conjointly may be any size, provided the dimensions thereof do not exceed such an area as would be equal to one acre of land for each and every of the persons taking possession of such claim.

Where the depth of sinking exceeds 100 feet and does not exceed 150 feet—

A claim for one person shall be any area not exceeding two acres.

A claim for two persons shall be any area not exceeding four acres.

A claim for three persons shall be any area not exceeding six acres.

And so on, in like proportion, according to the number of persons; that is to say, a claim for a number of persons who take possession conjointly may be any size, provided the dimensions thereof do not exceed such an area as would be equal to two acres of land for each and every of the persons taking possession of such claim.

Where the depth of sinking exceeds 150 feet and does not exceed 200 feet—

A claim for one person shall be any area not exceeding five acres.

A claim for two persons shall be any area not exceeding ten acres.

A claim for three persons shall be any area not exceeding fifteen acres.

And so on, in like proportion, according to the number of persons; that is to say, a claim for a number of persons who take possession conjointly may be any size, provided the dimensions thereof do not exceed such an area as would be equal to five acres of land for each and every of the persons taking possession of such claim.

BELFAST PUBLIC CEMETERY (OLD).

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE BELFAST GENERAL CEMETERY (OLD).

ALL charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.

2. Any person or persons making a vault, or erecting or placing a monument in the cemetery, by and with the permission of the trustees under these rules, and upon the payment of the proper charges, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep a vault, monument, or tombstone according to the tenor of such permission to and for the sole and separate use of such person and his representatives for ever.

3. Applications for such permission to be made at the office of the trustees. A certificate of permission, in the form set out in the Schedule A, will be granted to the party applying for such permission on payment of the proper charges.

4. Orders for interment to be given either to the keeper at the lodge, or at the office of the trustees, on the previous day between the hours of 8 a.m. and 5 p.m.

5. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, but parties requiring brick graves or vaults must construct them under the direction of the surveyor to the trustees, or any other person appointed by them for that purpose; and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent of the party (in writing) entitled thereto must be left with the order.

6. The time fixed for the funeral to be the time when the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.

7. Until otherwise ordered the usual hours fixed for the performance of funerals will be from 8 o'clock a.m. to 6 o'clock p.m. in the months of September to April inclusive, and from 9 o'clock a.m. to 4 o'clock p.m. throughout the rest of the year.

8. All monuments, vaults, graves, and graves stones to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.

9. Wooden fences to be allowed, but if not kept in proper repair will be removed by order of the trustees without notice to the owner.

10. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of freestone, slate, or iron.

11. No catacombs or any wooden fencing allowed without first submitting a plan for the approval of the trustees.

12. No servant or other person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity in the discharge thereof.

13. No dogs will be allowed to enter the cemetery.

14. The ground will be opened daily to the public from sunrise to sunset.

15. A plan of the cemetery, showing the situation of the purchased and other graves, is kept at the office, and registers of all permissions are kept by the secretary.
