### WORKS ON MAIN ROADS.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in exercise of the power conferred by *The Local Government Act 1863*, has, by Orders severally made on the 5th day of January, 1869, directed that the undermentioned Shire Councils shall, within the times by the said respective Orders appointed, execute the works on Main Roads hereinafter named and described, as provided by the 220th section of the said Act, according to plans deposited with the Board of Land and Works, that is to say:—

The Council of the Shire of Creswick shall, within twelve months from the 5th of January aforesaid, drain, form, and metal twenty chains of the Creswick to Daylesford Main Road.

The Council of the Shire of Creswick shall, within twelve months from the 5th of January aforesaid, drain, form, and metal forty-two chains and fifty links of the Ballarat to Creswick and Clunes Main Road.

The Council of the Shire of Colac shall, within twelve months from the 5th of January aforesaid, drain, form, and metal three miles and seventy-two chains of the Lower Western Main Road.

### FIRES AT BUSHY PARK AND TOPP PLAINS STATIONS, GIPPSLAND.

ONE HUNDRED AND FIFTY POUNDS REWARD.—FREE PARDON  
TO AN ACCOMPLISH.

WHEREAS about Nine o'clock in the evening of Thursday, the 24th of December last, about Four hundred acres of grass at Bushy Park Station, Stratford, Gippsland, were maliciously set on fire in seven different places; and shortly after the discovery of the fire a horseman was seen about six hundred yards, from the homestead in the act of throwing down a match, and being pursued escaped along the Upper Maffra road: And whereas the fire kindled in manner aforesaid extended on the following day to the station Thomas Seely, Topp Plains, destroying three stacks containing 1200 or 1300 bushels of wheat, half a mile of fencing, and two hundred and twenty acres of grass: And whereas the damage caused at Bushy Park Station is estimated at £250 and at Topp Plains Station at £600, and the owner of the first-named station, George Butchart (through his agent Charles Henderson), and Thomas Seely, of Topp Plains Station, respectively offer Rewards of Fifty pounds each for the detection of the author of the conflagration: Notice is hereby given that a Reward of Fifty pounds (supplemental to the two Rewards of Fifty pounds each above-mentioned) will be paid by the Government for such information as will lead to the conviction of the person or persons who originated this fire.

The Governor will also extend Her Majesty's Free Pardon to any person implicated in causing this conflagration (not being the actual kindler thereof) who will give the necessary information to procure conviction.
