\* This calculation is made upon the population at the last census, instead of the present population, as there are no means of estimating the changes which have taken place in the different sub-districts since the census was taken. It is believed that the present population of the whole district of Melbourne and suburbs amounts to 170,000. If this be correct, the mortality of the month under review would indicate a proportion of 1.88 deaths to every 1,000 persons living.

The mortality of the month under review was about equal to the average of May during ten years. It would however be found to be relatively much lower than that average, if the increase of population during the period were taken into consideration. The May of 1865 was that on which the greatest mortality prevailed, and the May of 1862 was that of the least mortality. In the one, the deaths numbered 86 more, and in the other 80 less than in the month under review.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at the Melbourne Observatory was 67°·3 on the 14th and the lowest was 38°·8 on the 13th. The mean temperature of the month (51°·7) was about 1½ degrees below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (25°·5) took place on the 13th, viz.:—from a maximum of 64°·3 to a minimum of 38°·8. The least range (7°·8) was on the 28th, viz.:—from a maximum of 52°·8 to a minimum of 45°.

Fifty-eight per cent. of the deaths were of males, and 42 per cent. were of females. About 43 per cent. were of children under five against 45 per cent. in May, 1863; 48 per cent. in May, 1867; 47 per cent. in May, 1866; 56 per cent. in May, 1865; 58 per cent. in May, 1864; 52 per cent. in May, 1863; 54 per cent. in May, 1862; 53 per cent. in May, 1861; and 56 per cent. in May, 1860. It is to be remarked that in the first 6 years of the decennial the mortality of children under 5 during the month of May was greater, and in the last four years it was less than that of persons beyond that age, and that in the month under notice the mortality at the younger period of life was relatively lower than it was in the same month of any previous year.

Two males and two females died during the month at the advanced ages of 75 years and upwards, viz.:—a male aged 75 of bronchitis; and a male aged 82 of old age; a female aged 80 of old age; and a female aged 81 of disease of the liver.

Thirteen deaths resulted from external causes during the month, of which 9 were set down to accident, 3 to homicide, and 1 to suicide. The accidental deaths were those of a boy aged 14 who died of a fractured spine, of a boy aged 14 who died of extravasation of blood on the brain arising from a fall, of a female aged 36 who died of concussion of the brain, of a dentist aged 50 who died of a fractured skull caused by a fall, of a male aged 40 who was found drowned, of a boy aged 5½ who was poisoned by

eating fungus, and of three infants aged respectively 4 days, 17 days, and 5 months, who were suffocated, the first whilst being suckled, the second by being fed improperly, and the third in bed. The homicidal deaths were those of a new-born infant who was smothered by earth, of a female aged 40 who was murdered by throttling, and of a Wesleyan minister aged 45 who was murdered by a prisoner in the penal establishment at Pentridge. The suicidal death was that of a female aged 45 who drowned herself in the River Yarra.

Sixty-seven deaths or 21 per cent. of the whole occurred in public institutions, viz.:—37 in the Melbourne Hospital, 2 in the Lying-in-Hospital, 3 in the Benevolent Asylum, 7 in the Immigrants' Home, 9 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 2 in the Carlton Lunatic Asylum, 1 in the Melbourne Orphan Asylum, 2 in the Industrial Schools, 2 in the Melbourne Gaol, and 2 in the Pentridge Stockade.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 138, of which 77, or nearly 56 per cent., were of males, and 61 or about 44 per cent., were of females. Of those dying, 86 were under one year of age, 30 were between one and two years, 9 were between two and three, 6 were between three and four, and 7 were between four and five.

The persons dying at a more advanced age than five years numbered 182, of which 109, or nearly 60 per cent., were males and 73, or about 40 per cent., were females; 9 were between five and ten, 5 were between ten and fifteen, 3 were between fifteen and twenty, 9 were between twenty and twenty-five, 25 were between twenty-five and thirty, 15 were between thirty and thirty-five, 21 were between thirty-five and forty, 22 were between forty and forty-five, 16 were between forty-five and fifty, 11 were between fifty and fifty-five, 14 were between fifty-five and sixty, 13 were between sixty and sixty-five, 11 were between sixty-five and seventy, 4 were between seventy and seventy-five, 1 was between seventy-five and eighty, and 3 were eighty and upwards.

The most fatal class of diseases during the month was the local, which caused 129 deaths, whilst diseases of the zymotic type caused only 73. The most prevalent local diseases were those of the nervous system which occasioned 53 deaths, those of the respiratory system which occasioned 29, those of the digestive organs which occasioned 25, and those of the organs of circulation which occasioned 16. Of zymotic diseases, scarlatina and diphtheria caused 13 deaths against 14 in April, and diarrhoea and dysentery caused 23 deaths against 46. Small-pox caused 1 death in May but no death in April.

DOWLING FOREST CEMETERY.  
RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE DOWLING FOREST CEMETERY.

ALL charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.

2. By *The Cemeteries Statute of 1864*—Any person making a vault, grave, or tombstone, or erecting and placing a monument in the cemetery, by and with the permission of the trustees, under these rules, and upon the payment of the proper charges, is entitled to have maintained and kept up such vault, grave, monument, or tombstone according to the terms of such permission to and for the sole and separate use of such person or persons and his representatives for ever.

3. Application for such permission to be made at the office of the trustees. A certificate of permission, in the form set out in the Schedule, will be granted to the party applying for such permission on payment of the proper charges.

4. The charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such cemetery, on a certificate of a minister of religion or other evidence proving, to the satisfaction of the trustees, that such person was a pauper, or that the relations and friends of the deceased are unable to pay the costs and charges.

5. Orders for interment to be given at the office of the trustees; such notice to be given between the hours of 10 a.m. and 3 p.m. the previous day.

6. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, but parties wanting brick graves or vaults will be required to construct them under the direction of the surveyor; and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent of the party (in writing) entitled thereto must be left with the order.

7. The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death of the deceased, must be stated at the time of giving the order.

8. The time fixed for the funeral to be the time when the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.

9. Until otherwise ordered the usual hours fixed for the performance of funerals will be from 10 a.m. to 6 o'clock p.m. in

the months of September to April inclusive, and from 10 a.m. to 4 o'clock p.m. in the other four months.

10. All monuments, vaults, graves, and grave stones to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.

11. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, and covered by a slab of freestone, slate, or iron.

12. A plan of every monument and tombstone proposed to be erected and placed shall be exhibited to the said trustees before permission for the erection thereof is given, and the said trustees shall be at liberty to withhold such permission, and prevent the erection of any monument or tombstone which shall appear to them inappropriate or unbecoming; and shall determine and fix the position of any monument or tombstone which may be proposed to be erected according to the description, size, and character thereof, having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the said cemetery in an appropriate manner.

13. No servant or other person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.

14. The ground will be opened daily to the public from sunrise to sunset.

15. A plan of the cemetery, showing the situation of the purchased and other graves, is kept at the office, and registers of all grants are kept by the secretary.

16. It is hereby notified that any person who shall wantonly and wilfully destroy, or do, or cause to be done any damage to any monument, vault, tombstone, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant in the said cemetery, will be guilty of a misdemeanor, and being convicted thereof, will be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding £20, or, at the discretion of the justices, to imprisonment for any period not exceeding three months; and any person who shall do, or cause to be done, any injury to any such monument, vault, tombstone, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant, whether the same be done wilfully or wantonly, or otherwise howsoever, shall be liable to pay a reasonable sum of money by way of damages and compensation, which said sum of

money shall be recoverable in any court of competent jurisdiction in the colony by the trustees of the said cemetery, or any person injured by such damage.

17. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these regulations.

#### BEECHWORTH MINING DISTRICT.

##### BYE-LAWS.—[19th January, 1869.]

**A**T a Meeting of the Mining Board of the Mining District of Beechworth, begun and holden at Beechworth, in the said district, on the 19th day of January, 1869, it is ordained by the said Board as follows, that is to say:—

##### BYE-LAW No. 44.—PROTECTION FROM FORFEITURE.

1. The registered lawful holder of a mining tenement, who shall have worked or used, or caused to be worked or used, such mining tenement, for a period of four weeks from the date of his registration thereof, and who has employed a person to represent him on or in connexion with such mining tenement, either by contract or on tribute, or for wages, or on any other terms, shall not forfeit any of his rights or interest in and to the same through any neglect, absence, or omission of such employee. Provided the said lawful holder shall have such mining tenement duly represented as aforesaid, within seven days from the date of his being served with a notice, in the form of Schedule S, personally or at his place of residence, or by its being advertised in a local newspaper.

2. When the registered lawful holder of a mining tenement has given a lien thereon under these bye-laws, such mining tenement shall not be forfeited during the existence of such lien through the neglect or omission of the said holder to comply with the conditions under which the subject of the said lien shall be held, unless the licensee shall fail to cause the aforesaid conditions to be complied with, or take legal process to enforce forfeiture of the said subject of lien within seven days from the date of his being served with a notice in the form and manner prescribed in the foregoing clause.

3. In the case of the death, lunacy, or insolvency of the registered lawful holder of any mining tenement, his property or interest in such tenement shall not be forfeited, provided his heirs, executors, administrators, or assigns, guardian in lunacy, or assignee in insolvency, shall register their possession of the same within sixty days from the date of such holder's death, lawfully certified lunacy, or assignment in insolvency, and shall pay all the expenses which shall have accrued thereon from the aforesaid date.

4. When any mining tenement shall be adjudged forfeited, the person on whose complaint such forfeiture shall have been adjudged shall be entitled to obtain possession of the same, provided he shall, as a condition precedent to his being put in possession thereof, pay to the person who shall have forfeited the same, or to his agent, such sum of money as shall be awarded by a warden's or other competent court, within such time as the court shall determine, as compensation for the outlay made upon the erection or construction of any necessary mining

appliances on or in connection therewith, and for any substance containing gold the produce of such mining tenement, and for mining material which shall be deposited thereon, and which may be deemed beneficial or necessary for the proper and efficient working of the same, having regard to the marketable value of such things at the time of such mining tenement being adjudged forfeited.

##### BYE-LAW No. 45.—LIENS UPON AND FORFEITURE OF BUSINESS OR RESIDENCE SITES.

Any residence or business site may be made the subject of a lien, and the provisions of these bye-laws relating to the granting, registration, transfer, or release of liens on mining tenements, shall be held and taken to apply to residence or business sites.

When any residence or business site shall be forfeitable, it shall be competent for the court before which application shall be made to adjudge the forfeiture of the same, to inflict, in lieu of forfeiture, a penalty not exceeding ten pounds sterling.
