Masters of vessels must therefore exercise the greatest caution in entering; they must pay close attention to the steering signals from the Pilot Station, and must keep the lead going constantly.

No stranger, or any one not thoroughly acquainted with the local signals, should attempt to cross the Bar.

## REGULATION AS TO TENDERS FOR ROAD AND BRIDGE WORKS.

THE Board of Land and Works has approved of and caused its common seal to be attached to the following regulation (in lieu of that of 30th October, 1868) relative to the receipt of tenders for Road and Bridge Works, viz.:

Contractors tendering for works under this Department are requested to be in attendance personally, or by agent, at the Board Room, La Trobe street west, at the time of opening the tenders.

All persons residing in or near Melbourne must be prepared—when called upon in the Board-room—to pay a deposit in bank notes, bank draft, or post office order, equivalent to ten per cent. on the amount of their tenders. Persons residing in the country districts who cannot conveniently be present, or represented, may enclose similar remittances (at their risk) in their tenders. No tender will be entertained unless such deposit be paid.

Cheques, marked or unmarked, will not under any circumstances be accepted.

The attention of Contractors is at the same time drawn to the General Regulations of the Board of Land and Works dated 13th May, 1858, respecting contracts.

## REGULATIONS UNDER THE "WATER WORKS ACT 1865."

THE Governor in Council, in pursuance of the provisions contained in the 7th section of the Act No. 238, called the *Water Works Act 1865*, and in exercise of the powers thereby conferred, has made the following regulations, viz.:

1. Applications for the supply of water from the Huntly Aqueduct are to be made to the Receiver and Paymaster at Sandhurst, who will, on receiving from the applicant the amount chargeable for one week's supply, give him a receipt for same, and also an order for the reservoir keeper, stating the quantity of water to be supplied. The reservoir keeper, upon receipt of such order, will take immediate steps to supply the quantity mentioned therein.

2. The Receiver and Paymaster at Sandhurst shall forward monthly, to the Secretary for Mines, a statement of the sums of money received from the sale of water.

3. The rates to be charged for the water shall be as under:—

- I. For water supplied continuously for a period of not less than two weeks, and used only once by the consumer, and in quantities of not less than 5000 gallons per diem,—One penny per 1000 gallons.
- II. For any quantity less than 5000 gallons per diem,—Two pence per 1000 gallons.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable SIR JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1863* it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time, if it shall seem fit, to add to any district not divided into subdivisions, or to any subdivision, or separately to two or more subdivisions of a district so divided, any portion of the colony actually adjoining to such district or subdivision, as the case may be, and not lying within the limits of the city of Melbourne or town of Geelong, or of any municipal or road district; and every such portion so added shall thereupon become and be part of such first-mentioned district to all intents and purposes, and of the subdivision, if any, to which the same shall have been added: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the twenty-second day of February, 1864, a road district was proclaimed under the designation of "The Bylands and Glenburnie Road District." And whereas by an Order of the Governor in Council made on the third day of April, 1863, the said road district was divided into three separate electoral subdivisions: And whereas it has seemed fit to the Governor in Council to add to the Northern subdivision a portion of the colony lying north-west of and adjoining to such subdivision, and not lying within the limits of the above-mentioned city and town, or any municipal or road district: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby add to the Northern subdivision of the said Bylands and Glenburnie Road District a portion of the colony adjoining to such subdivision (such portion not lying within the city or town above-mentioned, or any municipal or road district), in accordance with the above-recited provisions of the said Act; and do re-define the said subdivision added to as aforesaid, in manner following, that is to say:—
