COMMON IN AN AGRICULTURAL AREA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable SIR JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Amending Land Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected under *The Land Act 1862*, or selected or leased under the now reciting Act, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land a farmers' common; when one-eighth part of any agricultural area has been selected under *The Land Act 1862*, or selected or leased under the now reciting Act, the Governor in Council may proclaim any unselected and unleased portion of such agricultural area, not exceeding twice the quantity so selected and leased, to be a temporary common for the use of such selectors and lessees; and it is also enacted, that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common theretofore or hereafter to be proclaimed or re-proclaimed, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of *The Land Act 1862* and the now reciting Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the Common hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

BEALANBARRY AGRICULTURAL AREA TEMPORARY COMMON.—The allotments of land hereinafter enumerated and comprising an area of four hundred and five acres two roods thirty perches, shall be and constitute a Temporary Common for the use of selectors and lessees in the Agricultural Area of Bealanbarry, viz., parish of Gritjurk, allotments 5 and 6 of section 5; allotment 2a of section 7; allotment 1a of section 8; and allotments 2, 5, and 8 of section 10.—(69.T.5933.)

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable SIR JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1862* it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon or within five miles of any gold-field, or in or within five miles of any town not contained in any municipal district, or within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land to be a municipal common, or a gold-fields common, or a town common, or a farmers' common, respectively, as the case may be; and it is also enacted that the Governor in Council may at any time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common proclaimed before or after the passing of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby increase the Commons hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the above-recited provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

BUNINYONG AND CLARENDON FARMERS' COMMON.—The Buninyong near Clarendon Farmers' Common, described in a Proclamation bearing date the 4th day of April, 1861, is hereby increased by adding thereto the unappropriated Crown land within the boundaries described as follow, viz.:—Commencing at the point of intersection of the right bank of Williamson's Creek by the western side of the road from Geelong to Ballarat; thence by that road bearing north-westerly twenty chains, more or less, to the south-east angle of the existing common; thence by the south boundary of that common bearing west four miles and one-quarter, more or less, to the south-west angle thereof; thence by a line bearing south-easterly three miles, more or less, to a point on the aforesaid creek distant in a direct line northerly fifteen chains from the south-west angle of allotment 35 in the parish of Narmbool; and thence by that creek bearing northerly and easterly to the point of commencement; as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne. Area, about 1300 acres.—(69.T.10268.)

COSTERFIELD GOLD-FIELD COMMON.—The Costerfield Gold-field Common, described in a Proclamation bearing date the 25th day of January, 1864, is hereby increased by adding thereto the two portions of land the respective boundaries of which are described as follow, viz.:—Commencing at the point of intersection of the southern boundary of the existing common by the western side of the road from Heathcote to Redcastle; thence by that road bearing S. 15° 24' W. fifty-two chains, more or less, to a point bearing N. 74° 36' W. two chains from the north angle of the land at Costerfield licensed under the 42nd section of *The Amending Land Act 1865* to Robert Jones; thence by lines bearing respectively N. 74° 35' W. twenty

chains and N. 15° 24' E. seventy chains, more or less, to the western boundary of the existing common; and thence by the western and southern boundaries thereof bearing respectively S. 17° 10' E. twenty-seven chains, more or less, and N. 72° 50' E. six chains, more or less, to the point of commencement. Area, about 112 acres, and

Commencing at the point of intersection of the eastern boundary of the existing common by the north-eastern boundary of the land licensed under the 42nd section of *The Amending Land Act 1865* to Charles Phipps at Costerfield; thence by that land bearing S. 71° 2' E. forty chains, more or less; thence by the land licensed under the said section and Act to John McNichol, and by a line bearing N. 58° 30' E. three chains eighteen links; thence by a road bearing S. 31° 30' E. eleven chains forty links; thence by the land licensed to Samuel Bacchus, bearing N. 58° 30' E. sixteen chains, S. 31° 30' E. two chains, and N. 53° 30' E. seventeen chains eighty-nine links; thence by the land licensed to James Herd, and by a line bearing N. 31° 30' W. forty-five chains, more or less, to a point bearing N. 58° 30' E. from the point of commencement; and thence to that point by a line bearing S. 53° 30' W. sixty-five chains, more or less. Area, about 200 acres.—(69.T.6199.)

* This calculation is made upon the population at the last census, instead of the present population, as there are no means of estimating the changes which have taken place in the different sub-districts since the census was taken. It is believed that the present population of the whole district of Melbourne and suburbs amounts to 175,000. If this be correct, the mortality of the month under review would indicate a proportion of 1.61 deaths to every 1,000 persons living.

The mortality of June was much below the average and was exceeded in the same month of five out of the previous nine years. The greatest mortality was in June 1866, and the least in June 1862. In the one, the deaths were more numerous by 76, and in the other they were fewer by 31 than in the month under review.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at the Melbourne Observatory was 68°6 on the 4th and the lowest was 31° on the 16th. The mean temperature of the month (49°9) was a fraction above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (24°6) took place on the 16th, viz.:—from a maximum of 55°6 to a minimum of 31°. The lowest range (8°1) was on the 8th, viz.:—from a maximum of 59°9 to a minimum of 51°8.

Males contributed 56 per cent. and females 44 per cent. to the total mortality. Children who had not attained their fifth year contributed 40 per cent. against 45 per cent. in June, 1868; 51 per cent. in June, 1867; 41 per cent. in June, 1866; 48 per cent. in June, 1865; 45 per cent. in June, 1864; 31 per cent. in June, 1863; 43 per cent. in June, 1862; 51 per cent. in June, 1861; and 49 per cent. in June, 1860.

Six males and one female of 75 years old and upwards died during the month, viz.:—a male aged 75 of brain disease; a male aged 77 of cancer; a male aged 79 of fever; a male aged 80 of apoplexy; a male aged 80 of old age; and a female aged 77 of apoplexy.

The violent deaths which occurred—numbered 18, all of which were referred to accident. The following are the particulars: An infant, 5 months old, was killed by being thrown from a buggy; a boy, aged 9, by being passed over by an omnibus; and a boy, aged 16, by a fall against a water-pipe, causing fatal injuries to the abdominal viscera; a boy, aged 34, a girl, aged 5, and a woman, aged 30, died of burns; and an infant, aged 10 months, of scalds; a boy, aged 14, was drowned in a waterhole; a boy, aged 5, was drowned in a well; a seaman, aged 30, and a laborer, aged 48, were drowned in the Yarra; and a carrier, aged 35, was found drowned in the Sandridge lagoon; a sailmaker, aged 56, died from an overdose of narcotic poison; 5 infants of ages ranging from 17 days to 40 weeks were suffocated, 3 of them by being overlain.

Fifty-eight deaths or 22 per cent. of the whole occurred in public institutions, viz.:—30 in the Melbourne Hospital, 2 in the Lying-in-Hospital, 6 in the Benevolent Asylum, 5 in the Immigrants' Home, 8 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 1 in the Asylum at Carlton, 3 in the Industrial Schools, 2 in the Melbourne Gaol, and 1 in the female prison at Pentridge.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 107, of which 63, or nearly 59 per cent., were of males, and 44, or about 41 per cent., were of females. Of those dying, 65 were under one year of age, 20 were between one and two years, 7 were between two and three, 11 were between three and four, and 4 were between four and five.

The persons dying at a more advanced age than five years numbered 158, of which 85, or nearly 54 per cent., were males and 73, or about 46 per cent., were females; 14 were between five and ten, 6 were between ten and fifteen, 3 were between fifteen and twenty, 9 were between twenty and twenty-five, 9 were between twenty-five and thirty, 17 were between thirty and thirty-five, 24 were between thirty-five and forty, 17 were between forty and forty-five, 13 were between forty-five and fifty, 10 were between fifty and fifty-five, 5 were between fifty-five and sixty, 10 were between sixty and sixty-five, 9 were between sixty-five and seventy, 5 were between seventy and seventy-five, 5 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 2 were eighty and upwards.

CONDITIONS.

1. The whole of the articles required for the service of the Victorian Railways are to be in accordance with the samples and specifications, and in every respect to be of the very best description, quality, and manufacture, subject to the approval of the Engineer-in-Chief and the Traffic Manager. The goods will also have to prove satisfactory to the examination and tests of the Locomotive Superintendent, as the inspecting officer appointed by the Engineer-in-Chief; and should articles of any particular manufacture be ordered, the same are to be furnished at the rates set forth in the contract.

2. All orders for supplies under these contracts must issue from the Secretary for Railways, and all goods must be delivered free of charge to the Railway Stores, Williamstown, unless otherwise directed by the Secretary.

3. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being infringed or vitiated by the importation of stores for the Government service of the Victorian Railways, or by the exercise of the right to purchase, reserved in the specification or the special conditions to any of the schedules, or by the purchase of articles manufactured in the penal or other Government establishments, or the manufacture of articles by the department.

4. The Government will not be bound to issue orders upon the contractors for all the articles enumerated in the schedules, but only for such articles, and such quantities of those articles, as the Government may order from time to time; neither will the Government be bound to take from the contractors any larger supply of any of the articles than may be shown upon the orders which have been issued during the year, nor will they be bound to take any of the articles enumerated in the schedules for which orders have not been issued. Should the Government require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedules, the contractor will be bound to supply the same at the contract rate.

5. Delivery, as a rule, is to be of the full quantity ordered at one time; but all deliveries must be accompanied with detailed invoices or bills of parcels in duplicate, showing quantity, rate,

and value, also the number of the order for the goods, otherwise the goods will not be received.

6. In the event of supplies ordered under these contracts not being delivered within forty-eight hours, it will be competent for the Railway Storekeeper, on the order of the Secretary, to cancel the order and purchase, at the same, or such articles as may be suitable for the service, at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price will be deducted.

7. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account monthly, in the prescribed form, and render the same to the Railway Storekeeper for certification, previously to payment at the Treasury.

8. The Railway Storekeeper will have power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior character, or not in accordance with the specification, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected article and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense, if any, will be charged to him.

9. All rejected goods must be removed by the contractor within twenty-four hours after notice has been given of such rejection, and, if not so removed, the Railway Storekeeper is hereby empowered to send same to Melbourne, there to be stored at the contractor's risk and expense.

10. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the head of the department requiring the supply, as to the quality, the same is to be decided by a board of survey composed of persons named by the Government, and the decision of the board is to be considered final. Any expense incurred on account of the rejection of supplies by a board of survey will be charged to the contractor.

11. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense, if any, will be charged to the contractor.

12. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or of delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Railway Storekeeper, to such mulct, not exceeding one-fourth the amount of the monthly account, as the Government may direct. It will also be in the power of the Government upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

13. It will be competent either for the contractor, on his own behalf, or for the Secretary for Railways on behalf of the Government, to terminate the contract, by giving a notice in writing of three full calendar months to the opposite party, it being understood that such notice can be given only from the first day of a month, and within the period for which the contract is made.

14. In the event of any alteration in the Tariff affecting any of the items included in these contracts, the Government, or the contractor, as may be the case, will make a proportionate allowance by way of deduction from, or increase of, the price of the item so affected.
