FEE TO BE CHARGED FOR LICENSES ISSUED UNDER THE 42ND SECTION OF "THE AMENDING LAND ACT 1865."

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the eleventh day
of January, 1869.

WHEREAS by the 70th section of *The Amending Land Act 1865*, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make and alter, or rescind rules and regulations and orders for imposing any reasonable charge or fee for any Crown Grant or other document issued under the authority of this Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order make the rule or regulation hereto subjoined, prescribing the fee to be charged for every license issued under the provisions of the 42nd section of *The Amending Land Act 1865*—

For every license to occupy any portion of land under the before-mentioned section bearing date on or after the 1st January, 1869, Two shillings and sixpence 2s. 6d.

And the Honorable James Macpherson Grant, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Crown Lands and Survey for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WARDS OF THE BOROUGH OF SALE.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the sixteenth
day of November, 1868.

WHEREAS by *The Municipal Corporations Act 1863*, it is amongst other things enacted, that at any time after the first annual election or general election, as the case may be, or first appointment of councillors for any original or proclaimed borough (hereinafter sometimes called in common "single borough") the Governor in Council, if it seem fit, may, if he shall have received a petition to that effect signed by one-fourth of the number of persons liable to be rated under the said Act in respect of rateable property in such borough, within three months after the receipt of the same, divide the borough into three separate wards by such names as shall by such Order

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in Council be assigned to the same, and in and by such Order in Council the boundaries of such wards shall be set forth; provided that no such division shall be made upon or within thirty days before any day appointed for holding any annual election of councillors in or for such borough: And whereas the Governor has received a petition signed by not less than one-fourth of the number of persons liable to be rated under the said Act in respect of rateable property in the borough of Sale, praying that the said borough may be divided into three wards: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, by this present Order divide the said borough of Sale into three separate wards, by the names hereby assigned to the same respectively and with the several boundaries hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

EAST WARD.—Commencing at a point in the Flooding Creek, opposite the centre of York street, along the centre of York street northerly to Stratford road, along Stratford road to north boundary of the borough; thence by the north boundary to the east boundary; thence by the east boundary southerly to Flooding Creek; and by Flooding Creek to point of commencement.

NORTH WARD.—Commencing at a point in Flooding Creek, opposite the centre of Cuninghame street, along the centre of Cuninghame street eastwardly to its intersection with York street; thence along the centre of York street to Stratford road, along Stratford road to north boundary of the borough, by the north boundary to the west boundary, by the west boundary to Flooding Creek, and by Flooding Creek to point of commencement.

SOUTH WARD.—Commencing at a point in Flooding Creek, opposite the centre of Cuninghame street, along the centre of Cuninghame street eastwardly to the intersection of York street; thence along the centre of York street to Flooding Creek, and by Flooding Creek to point of commencement.

And the Honorable James McCulloch, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1862* it is amongst other things enacted, that notwithstanding anything thereinbefore contained the Governor in Council may by Proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut or remove live or dead timber or bark, or stone or gravel, from such portions of Crown lands as are named in such Proclamation, or shall exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any license granted under the authority of the third part of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, do, with the advice of the Executive Council, declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut or remove timber on or from any unappropriated Crown Land within a distance of one mile from high-water line on Phillip Island.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1862* it is amongst other things enacted that when any Crown land remains unsold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon or within five miles of any gold-field, or in or within five miles of any town not contained in any municipal district, or within any agricultural area of which at least one fourth part has been selected, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land to be a municipal common, or a gold-fields common, or a town common, or a farmers' common, respectively, as the case may be: And whereas by *The Amending Land Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold

within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected under *The Land Act 1862*, or selected or leased under the now reciting Act, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land a farmers' common; when one-eighth part of any agricultural area has been selected under *The Land Act 1862*, or selected or leased under the now reciting Act, the Governor in Council may proclaim any unselected and unleased portion of such agricultural area, not exceeding twice the quantity so selected and leased, to be a temporary common for the use of such selectors and lessees; and it is also enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common theretofore or thereafter to be proclaimed or reclaimed, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of *The Land Act 1862* and the now reciting Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim or increase (as the case may be) the commons hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, that is to say:—
