## TIPARA REEF, SPENCER'S GULF.

A black and red checkered buoy has been placed outside a rocky patch, having only twelve and a half (12½) feet on it at low water spring tides. The buoy lies in four (4) fathoms at low water, and on the following bearings:—Smelting Works chimney, Wallaroo, N.E. ½ E.; Tipara Light Vessel, S.E. by E. ½ E.

Masters of vessels are cautioned to pay attention to the sailing directions, and not to approach the reef under seven (7) fathoms, as the nature of the ground in the neighborhood of the reef, and for some considerable distance around, is very uneven.

## NOTICE TO MASTERS OF VESSELS BOUND TO THE PORT OF INVERCARGILL.

A flagstaff, with a semaphore arm under the cross-tree, has been erected at New River Heads, on a point of land (locally known as Carolina Point), about three-quarters (¾) of a mile inside Point Island, and about one-quarter (¼) of a mile below the Pilot Station. It is open to seaward from W. ½ S., round westerly and northerly, magt.

The Bar and Tidal Signals in use are the same as at all New Zealand ports.

High water on the bar, full and change, at 12 hours 30 minute, rise and fall from 5 to 10 feet, according to the wind and state of the tides—westerly winds setting the tides up.

Vessels should not run down for the Port during the ebb, nor when blowing hard from the westward, but in the latter case should take shelter under Stewart's Island till the weather moderates.

When the wind is south-westerly, vessels should run down to open the flagstaff with a good offing, so that, in event of the bar being impassable at the time, they may be able to haul off the land.

When the bar is passable, the same will be indicated by the proper ball signal, and the vessel piloted in by the semaphore arm.

Should the pilot not put off when abreast of the Pilot Station, the vessel must be kept on as directed by the semaphore, and brought to an anchor between the first white buoy and the northern shore, in from 4 to 5 fathoms good holding ground, and cable veered in accordance with the state of the weather; should the master be acquainted with the upper part of the river, he may of course continue on instead of anchoring. Should it be considered necessary to anchor in any part of the channel below the white buoy, No. 8 of Marryat's code will be hoisted at the mast-head as a signal to prepare to anchor; when it is hauled down, anchor immediately. When at anchor at any part of the channel, the pilot will either put off in one of his own boats, or will make a signal for one from the vessel.

The depth of water on the bar at present is eight (8) feet at low water spring tides; but the channel being very changeable, both in direction and depth, it is not considered advisable to give special directions for any particular time.

For the guidance of the pilot, vessels should show their draft of water by Marryat's, with numeral pendant over, as soon as they sight the flagstaff.

Only one of the leading beacons formerly used is now standing (the inner one), but is not meant to be used as a mark for entering.

A green buoy is placed on the wreck of the "Oscar," which lies nearly abreast of the Pilot Station, and over which there is but three (3) feet at low water.

A barrel beacon, twelve (12) feet high, painted white, is placed on the Bombay Rock. This rock is one and a half (1½) miles inside the bar, and is four (4) feet above high water. About a mile above this is the anchorage before described. Strangers should not attempt to go further in than this without a pilot.

## SOUTH ENTRANCE—MORETON BAY.

In consequence of the growth southwards of the North Spit, and the opening out of what is, at present, a shoal channel through the North Bank, the action of the tidal streams has been so far altered as to have caused the bar to shoal to a depth of thirteen feet at low water.

Masters of vessels must, therefore, exercise increased caution in taking this passage, when there is any swell on the coast.

The directions to be followed, at present, are those published on the 14th ultimo, care being taken not to cross the bar to the southward of the line of beacons.

## THE SUBDIVISIONS OF THE SHIRE OF NORTH OVENS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the sixteenth day of August, 1869.

## PRESENT:

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1863*, it is amongst other things enacted that at any time after the first annual election of general election, as the case may be, or first appointment of members of the district board for any original or proclaimed district (hereinafter sometimes called "single district"), the Governor in Council, if it seem fit, may, and if he shall have received a petition to that effect signed by twenty persons liable to be rated under the said Act in respect of rateable property in the said district, shall, within three months after the receipt of the same, divide the district into two, or, if the Governor in Council shall see fit, into three separate electoral subdivisions (hereinafter called subdivisions), by such names as shall by such Order in Council be assigned to the same, and in and by such Order in Council the boundaries of the subdivisions shall be set forth; provided that no such division shall be made within three months before any day appointed for holding any election of members of the district board in or for such district; and it is also enacted that every shire shall after the proclamation thereof as such be and be deemed to be and have been such and the same district as such shire was at the time of such proclamation, and save as aforesaid and save where therein otherwise expressly provided, all the provisions of the said Act relating to districts shall continue and be of full force and effect with regard to such shire and be read accordingly: And whereas by an Order of the Governor in Council made on the ninth day of September, 1867, the Shire of North Ovens was constituted: And whereas the Governor in Council has received a petition signed by not less than twenty persons liable to be rated under the said Act in respect of rateable property in the said shire, praying for the division of the same into three subdivisions: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth, by this present Order, divide the Shire of North Ovens into three separate electoral subdivisions in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, by the names hereinafter assigned to the same respectively, and doth hereby set forth the boundaries of the said several subdivisions in manner following, that is to say:—

THE TARRAWINGEE RIDING.—Commencing at the junction of the western boundary of the Beechworth Shire with the Ovens River and extending northwards to the centre of the road from Wangaratta to Eldorado; thence by the centre of that road south-westerly to a branch road between allotment 5 and allotment 1 of section 15 A; thence by the centre of that road between allotments 5, 4, and 3 of section 13 A, and allotments 21, 12, and 5 on the west, and allotment 1 of section 15 A, of allotment 1 of section 14 A, and allotments 22, 11, and 6 on the east to the Ovens River, and by the Ovens River south-easterly to the commencing point.

THE CENTRAL RIDING.—Commencing at the junction of the road from Wangaratta to Eldorado with the eastern boundary of the shire; thence north and east by the eastern and northern boundaries of the shire to the centre of the road from Wangaratta to Rutherglen; thence by the centre of that road due south to the south-east angle of allotment 255, parish of Estcourt; thence west to the south-west angle of allotment 252; thence by a straight line through allotment 251 to the south-east angle of allotment 2, section 1; thence by the centre of a road between allotment 2 of section 1 and allotments 1 and 3 of sections 2 and 8 to the north-west angle of allotment 3, section 8; thence south-easterly by the centre of a road between allotment 1 of section 9 and allotment 3 of section 8 to the south-east angle of allotment 1, section 9; thence by a road between allotment 1 of section 9 and allotment 2 of section 7 to Reid's Creek; thence by Reid's Creek north-westerly to the south-west angle of allotment 8, parish of Estcourt, being the junction of Reid's Creek with the Ovens River; thence by the Ovens River to its junction with a road between allotments 5 and 6; thence by the centre of that road between allotments 5, 12, 21, 3, 4, and 5, and allotments 6, 11, 23, 1 and 1 of section 15 A to the road from Wangaratta to Eldorado; thence by the centre of that road through Eldorado to the eastern boundary of the shire, being the commencing point.

THE ESTCOURT RIDING.—Commencing at the junction of Reid's Creek with the Ovens River at the south-west angle of allotment 8, parish of Estcourt; thence by the Ovens River to the northern boundary of the shire; thence by that northern boundary to the centre of the road from Wangaratta to Rutherglen; thence due south by that road to the south-east angle of allotment 255, parish of Estcourt; thence west to the south-west angle of allotment 252; thence by a straight line through allotment 251 to the south-east angle of allotment 2 of section 1; thence between allotment 2 of section 1 and allotments 1 and 3 of section 2 and 8 to the north-west angle of allotment 3, section 8; thence south-easterly by the centre of a road between allotment 1 of section 9 and allotment 3 of section 8 to the south-east angle of allotment 1 of section 9; thence by a road between allotment 1 of section 9 and allotment 2 of section 7 to Reid's Creek; thence by Reid's Creek to the Ovens River, being the point of commencement.

And the Honorable James Forrester Sullivan, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Railways and Roads for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

At ECHUCA, on Thursday, the thirtieth day of September, 1869, in lieu of the fourth of the same month.

# PART II. OF "THE PUBLIC HEALTH AMENDING STATUTE 1867" EXTENDED TO THE BOROUGH OF GRAYTOWN.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the thirty-first year of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled *An Act to amend the Laws relating to or affecting Public Health* (31 Vict. No. 310), it is amongst other things enacted that this Part (that is to say; Part II.) of this Act shall apply to all places where the Part of the Act thereby repealed, or any portion thereof, has been in force, and all or some of the provisions of this Part shall also apply to every such city, town, borough, shire, district, or place in Victoria as the Governor in Council shall by Proclamation direct; and the Governor in Council may at any time, and from time to time, alter, repeal, or revoke any such Proclamation theretofore or thereafter made: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, and in exercise of the power thereby conferred, do, with the advice of the Executive Council, by this my Proclamation direct that all the provisions of Part II. of the said Act shall apply to the Borough hereinafter mentioned, viz.:—

THE BOROUGH OF GRAYTOWN.

# COMMON IN AN AGRICULTURAL AREA.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Amending Land Act 1865*, it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected under *The Land Act 1862*, or selected or leased under the now reciting Act, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land a farmers' common; when one-eighth part of any agricultural area has been selected under *The Land Act 1862*, or selected or leased under the now reciting Act, the Governor in Council may proclaim any unselected and unleased portion of such agricultural area, not exceeding twice the quantity so selected and leased, to be a temporary common for the use of such selectors and lessees; and it is also enacted, that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common theretofore or thereafter to be proclaimed or re-proclaimed, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of

the purposes and subject to the provisions of *The Land Act 1862* and the now reciting Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the Common hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

HERVEYBRIDGE AGRICULTURAL AREA COMMON.—Allotment 6 of section 12, in the parish of Banangal, containing an area of one hundred and seven acres three roods thirty-four perches, shall be and constitute a Farmers' Common for the use of selectors and lessees in the agricultural area of Herveybridge. —(69.U.13590.)
