FIXING THE TIME FOR HOLDING THE SECOND SESSION OF THE SIXTH PARLIAMENT OF VICTORIA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable SIR JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Constitution Act* it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor to fix such places within Victoria and, subject to the limitation therein contained, such times for holding the first and every other Session of the Council and Assembly, and to vary and alter the same respectively in such manner as he may think fit; and also from time to time to prorogue the said Council and Assembly, and to dissolve the said Assembly, by Proclamation or otherwise, whenever he shall deem it expedient: And whereas the said Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly, called "The Parliament of Victoria," now stand prorogued until Tuesday, the twenty-sixth day of January instant, and it is expedient to fix the time for holding the next Session thereof: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, in exercise of the power conferred by the said Act, do by this my Proclamation further prorogue the said Parliament of Victoria from Tuesday, the twenty-sixth day of January instant, until Thursday, the eleventh day of the ensuing month of February; and I do hereby fix Thursday, the eleventh day of February aforesaid, as the time for the commencement and holding of the next Session of the said Council and Assembly, called the Parliament of Victoria, for the despatch of business, at Two o'clock in the afternoon, in the Parliament Houses, situate in Parliament Place, Spring street, in the City of Melbourne; and the Honorable the Members of the Legislative Council and the Members of the Legislative Assembly are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and place accordingly.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-first day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, and in the thirty-second year of Her Majesty's reign.

GENERAL RULE FOR PROCEEDINGS BEFORE WARDENS.

WHEREAS by the *Mining Statute of 1865*, section 233, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Chief Judge of Courts of Mines, and any two or more of the Judges of the Courts of Mines from time to time, but subject to the said Act, to frame such general rules as to them shall seem expedient for and concerning and so far as not therein provided for the pleadings, practice, and proceedings of the Courts holden under the said Act, either in their original or appellate jurisdiction, and the practice and proceedings in cases before Wardens, and for and concerning the fees to be paid to barristers-at-law and attorneys practising in the said courts and before Wardens, and the expenses to be paid to witnesses in the said courts and before Wardens: Now we, the undersigned, the said Chief Judge, and Judges of the Courts of Mines, in pursuance of the said powers, do make and declare the rule following, and declare the same shall commence and come into operation from the first day of February next.

As an amendment to the General Rules, 22, 23, and 24, published in 1866, and Schedule One therein referred to.

In all suits commenced after the first day of February, 1869, where a plaintiff shall recover a demand of less value than £20, the fees to be paid to his barrister and attorney shall be at the discretion of the Warden, but not to exceed those allowed by the said rules and schedule.

SOUTH AUSTRALIA } Proclamation by Sir DOMINICK DALY,
to wit. } Knight, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Province of South Australia and the Dependencies thereof, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-fourth and twenty-fifth years of the reign of Her Majesty, intituled "An Act to enable the Governor to prevent the Importation of Cattle into South Australia under certain Circumstances, and for other Purposes," it was enacted that it should be lawful for the Governor from time to time, and at any time thereafter, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, by Proclamation in the *South Australian Government Gazette*, to prohibit the introduction or importation of any cattle, or any particular description of cattle, into the said Province from such places and during such time as should be set forth in such Proclamation: Now therefore I, the said Governor, in pursuance of the said authority, and of all other powers me enabling, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim, order, and direct that from the day of the date hereof no sheep, except such as being free from the disease known as "Scab," shall be authorized to be imported, under a permission in writing, signed by the Commissioner of Crown Lands, shall be introduced or imported into the Province of South Australia, from either of the colonies of New South Wales or Victoria: And I do also proclaim, order, and direct, that this my Proclamation shall continue in full force and effect until the same shall be revoked by Proclamation in the *South Australian Government Gazette*.

Given under my hand and the public seal of the said Province, at Adelaide, this seventh day of May, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, and in the twenty-sixth year of Her Majesty's reign.
