## ACT OF PARLIAMENT LEFT TO ITS OPERATION.

THE Principal Secretary of State for the Colonies has, in a Despatch bearing date the 29th day of June, 1869, intimated to the Governor that Her Majesty will not be advised to exercise Her power of disallowance in respect of the Act of the Parliament of Victoria passed in the 32nd year of Her Majesty's reign, the number, title, and date of which are hereunto subjoined, viz.:—

No. 336. An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of Thirty-six thousand four hundred and eighty-five pounds twelve shillings and five pence to the service of the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, and the sum of Five hundred thousand pounds to the service of the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine. THE following Notice to Mariners, announcing the replacement of the Buoys in Manukau Harbor, is reprinted from the *Auckland Provincial Gazette*, for general information.

Harbor Department,  
Manukau, 6th July, 1869.

Notice is hereby given, that all the buoys connected with the Manukau Harbor have recently been repaired and moored in their proper places, and mariners are to observe that all the buoys and beacons painted red are placed on the starboard side of the channel, and the black buoys on the port side of the channel, inwards.

The "Tranmere" shoal buoy (black) is now moored in four (4) fathoms at low water spring tides, close to the S.E. part of the shoal, and mariners are to avoid the more southern part of the shoal by paying attention to the pointing of the seneshore arms at the signal station, or by keeping the South Head beacons open (about three breadths) southwards.

The South Head beacons will shortly be extended, and the beacons adjusted to the course of the channel; and, when completed, due notice will be given. The least water now found in the course of the southern channel is three (3) fathoms at low water spring tides, deepening quickly to four (4) and five (5) fathoms.

AWARD OF WHITWORTH SCHOLARSHIPS, PRACTICAL EXAMINATION, ETC.

1. My Lords have, in concert with Mr. Whitworth, made the following rules for awarding the Whitworth Scholarships this year, and for holding the examinations in handicrafts and in the practical use of tools.

2. It was decided that the scholarships were to be awarded according to the results of the examination of the Science and Art Department in the following subjects, as defined in the Science Directory:—(1) elementary mathematics; (2) higher mathematics; (3) theoretical mechanics; (4) applied mechanics; (5) practical plane and solid geometry; (6) machine construction and drawing; (7) acoustics, light, and heat; (8) magnetism and electricity; (9) inorganic chemistry; (10) metallurgy; and according to the skill shown by the competitors in a special examination in the following handicrafts—(1) smith's work; (2) turning; (3) filing and fitting; (4) pattern making and moulding, or in the use of the following classes of tools—the axe, the saw and plane, the hammer and chisel, the file, or the forge.

3. Mr. Whitworth desired that the number of marks obtainable in the theoretical subjects and those obtainable by the most skilled workman should be about equal. And it was decided that no candidate should be eligible to obtain a scholarship who had not shown a satisfactory knowledge of elementary mathematics, elementary mechanics, and practical plane and solid geometry, passed in freehand drawing, and proved his power to use one at least of the before-mentioned classes of tools.

4. The relative position of candidates as regards the theoretical subjects, will be determined by affixing the same scale of marks to the several grades of success as is laid down for the competition for royal exhibitions, viz.—

"Good" in freehand drawing will count as 1 mark and "excellent" as 3 marks.

5. The "satisfactory knowledge" required for passing in the subjects mentioned in § 3, will be taken to mean the obtaining of a first class in the elementary stage of elementary mathematics, a second class in the elementary stage of theoretical or applied mechanics, a second class in the elementary stage of practical and solid geometry, and a "good" freehand drawing.

6. The results of the examination in all the theoretical subjects will be published about the middle of June. It will then be possible to define, within comparatively narrow limits, the candidates amongst whom the competition will really lie. These will be directed to hold themselves in readiness to undergo the practical examination which will be conducted at a certain number of centres, by qualified persons.

7. The practical examination is of two kinds. There is the examination of the handicraftsman or skilled artisan, and there is the qualifying examination in the use of certain tools.

8. The examiners will decide on the number of marks to be awarded, and the skilled artisans by the rate of wages, etc., which

\* The papers of candidates who have taken the honors papers and failed in obtaining a class, will this year be specially considered, and if it shall appear that the candidates show such knowledge as would undoubtedly have placed them in the first class in the elementary stage, they will be passed—that is to say, they will be considered to have satisfied the condition of showing a "satisfactory knowledge," but no marks will be given for these papers in the competition.

they have been receiving (as vouched by the certificates of their employers), by work specially executed for the occasion, or by an inspection of work upon which they may have been employed.

9. The examination in the use of tools, will be the performance of one or more of the following pieces of work.

The Axe.

- To square up a block of wood a foot long and six inches in diameter.
- To make a spoke for a cart wheel.
- To be able to shaft an axe.
- To cut out wheel spokes ready for fitting into knave.

The Saw and Plane.

- To saw from a plank two pieces of timber three feet long and three inches square, and plane them up true.
- To make a box 15" long x 9" wide x 9" deep, planed up true, and the joints dovetailed together.
- To saw out and plane up two parallel strips 2' 0" x 2" x 3/4".

The Hammer and Chisel.

- To chip a piece of cast-iron six inches square over on one of its surfaces ready for filing.
- To cut out of sheet-iron (any gauge) a figure or letter of any size from 1" to 6".

The File.

- To file two sides of a cast-iron inch cube as flat as possible with a Stubbs' twelve-inch second cut file, the stroke of the file not being less than nine inches.
- A wrought-iron hexagonal nut 1/2" or 1" to be filed up true.
- To file up two parallel strips, iron or steel.
- To file up pocket square as true as possible.

The Forge.

- To weld or join together two pieces of iron three quarters of an inch square.
- To make a pair of smith's tongs.
- To make the head of a hammer.
- To make a pick.
- To make 2ft. 3in. chain, with hook and ring.
- To make a horse-shoe complete.
- To cut off and draw out chipping chisel or drill, and afterwards harden.
- To make a pair of small calipers.
- To make a pocket square.

10. A competitor is not restricted to one only of the handicrafts, nor to the use of one class of tools, but he may show his skill in two or more. His position and the number of marks to be awarded to him, will be determined by his general skillfulness as a workman. A skilled mechanic will thus be enabled to obtain credit, and improve his position by showing his power of using those classes of tools not properly belonging to his own handicraft, and the ordinary student may in like manner, instead of simply qualifying in the use of a certain class of tools, show his skill in one of the handicrafts mentioned.

11. To those who merely qualify in the use of tools, a certain proportion of the marks obtainable for practical workmanship will be given according to their relative skill. These marks will count towards the general result.

12. The travelling expenses of poor students, 2nd class railway fare with a personal allowance of 10s. per diem, will be allowed to enable them to attend at the places where the practical examinations are to be held.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1863*, it is amongst other things enacted that at any time after the first annual election or general election, as the case may be, or first appointment of members of the district board for any original or proclaimed district (hereinafter sometimes called "single district"), the Governor in Council, if it seem fit, may, and if he shall have received a petition to that effect signed by twenty persons liable to be rated under the said Act in respect of rateable property in the said district, shall, within three months after the receipt of the same, divide the district into two, or, if the Governor in Council shall see fit, into three separate electoral subdivisions (hereinafter called subdivisions), by such names as shall by such Order in Council be assigned to the same, and in and by such Order in Council the boundaries of the subdivisions shall be set forth; provided that no such division shall be made within three months before any day appointed for holding any election of members of the district board in or for such district; and it is also enacted that every shire shall after the proclamation thereof as such be and be deemed to be and have been such and the same district as such shire was at the time of such proclamation, and save as aforesaid and save where therein otherwise expressly provided, all the provisions of the said Act relating to districts shall continue and be of full force and effect with regard to such shire and be read accordingly: And whereas by an Order of the Governor in Council made on the eighth day of February, 1864, the Shire of Buninyong was constituted: And whereas the Governor in Council has received a petition signed by not less than twenty persons liable to be rated under the said Act in respect of rateable property in the said shire, praying for the division of the same into subdivisions: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth, by this present Order, divide the Shire of Buninyong into three separate electoral subdivisions, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, by the names hereinafter assigned to the same respectively, and doth hereby set forth the boundaries of the said several subdivisions in manner following, that is to say:—

**THE WEST RIDING.**—Commencing at a point due west of the southern boundary of J. Winter's pre-emption right and due south of the western boundary of section VIII. in the parish of Cardigan; thence east to the south-west angle of the said J. Winter's pre-emptive right; thence north to its north-west angle; thence north-easterly to the south-east angle of section 5, parish of Cardigan; thence south to the northern boundary of the said J. Winter's pre-emptive right; thence east to its north-east angle on the River Leigh; thence northerly by the centre line of the River Leigh to the south boundary of the municipality of Ballarat East; thence east by the said municipal boundary to the centre of the Geelong and Ballarat Common-toll road; thence south-easterly by the centre of the said common-toll road to the municipal boundary of Buninyong; thence west and south by the north and west boundaries of the said municipality of Buninyong to its south-west angle; thence by a line bearing south to a point due west of the northern boundary of the Mount Mercer pre-emptive right, being a distance of ten miles ten chains, more or less; thence by a line bearing west six miles forty-one chains, more or less, to a point due south of the commencing point; thence by a line bearing north to the commencing point.

Tenders are required to be written on a form, printed copies of which may be had gratuitously on application at any post office in the colony, and may be forwarded (if by post, prepaid), addressed to the Honorable the Postmaster-General, with the words "Tender for the Conveyance of Mails" endorsed on the cover, or placed in the tender-box at the General Post Office.

Tenderers are requested to describe by their numbers as below the mail services for which they tender, and every tender will be taken to include the entire service as called for.

Every tender must bear the *bond fide* signature and addresses of the tenderer, and of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the fulfilment of the same in such sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of the contract.

Every tender must be accompanied by a bank deposit-receipt for a sum equal to twenty per cent. of the amount for which the tenderer is willing to undertake the service; the money to be lodged to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster-General, and to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete, within ten days of the date of notice being given of the acceptance of his tender, the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient.

The money deposited by successful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, on the bond and contract being completed.

The money deposited by unsuccessful tenderers will be returned to them on application, and on their signing receipts for the respective amounts, but not otherwise.

Persons tendering are requested to state the description of the vehicle they intend to use, and the number of horses by which it is to be drawn.

A separate tender must be sent in for each service; but notwithstanding this condition, any offer will be entertained for the performance of any number of services for a lump sum. The number of the service or services tendered for must be plainly endorsed on the outside of the cover.

The tender of any person failing to comply with the foregoing conditions will not be entertained.
