Sir.—I transmit to you herewith for your information, with reference to your Despatch, No. 10, of the 18th January last, translation of a Note addressed by the Spanish Minister of Foreign Affairs to Her Majesty's Minister at Madrid, from which you will perceive that the colony under your Government has been admitted to the privileges in respect of Port Dues of the Decree of the 4th June, 1868.

Sir.—The Minister of the colonies informs me, under date of the 12th instant, that he has given the necessary orders to the Superior Civil Governors of Cuba, Porto Rico, and the Philippines, and to the Governor of Fernando Po, to the end that vessels of the English colonies of New South Wales, Hong Kong, Montserrat, Victoria, South Australia, Labuan, Natal in the south of Africa, and Turks Island in the West Indies, may experience the same treatment as those of Spain for the payment of Ports Navigation Dues, in virtue of the reciprocity offered by your Excellency in your notes of the 12th of March and of 29th of April last, to which I have now the honor to reply.

TENDERS are hereby invited, and will be received until Noon of Tuesday the 26th October, 1869, for the Conveyance of Post Office Mails as undermentioned, for one year, from the 1st January, 1870, to 31st December, 1870.

Tenders are required to be written on a form, printed copies of which may be had gratuitously on application at any post office in the colony, and may be forwarded (if by post, prepaid), addressed to the Honorable the Postmaster-General, with the words "Tender for the Conveyance of Mails" endorsed on the cover, or placed in the tender-box at the General Post Office.

Tenderers are requested to describe, by their numbers as below the mail services for which they tender, and every tender will be taken to include the entire service as called for.

Every tender must bear the *bona fide* signature and addresses of the tenderer, and of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the fulfilment of the same in such sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of the contract.

Every tender must be accompanied by a bank deposit-receipt for a sum equal to twenty per cent. of the amount for which the tenderer is willing to undertake the service; the money to be lodged to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster-General, and to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete, within ten days of the date of notice being given of the acceptance of his tender, the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient.

The money deposited by successful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, on the bond and contract being completed.

The money deposited by unsuccessful tenderers will be returned to them on application, and on their signing receipts for the respective amounts, but not otherwise.

Persons tendering are requested to state, the description of the vehicle they intend to use, and the number of horses by which it is to be drawn.

A separate tender must be sent in for each service; but notwithstanding this condition, any offer will be entertained for the performance of any number of services for a lump sum. The number of these services or services tendered for must be plainly endorsed on the outside of the cover.

The tender of any person failing to comply with the foregoing conditions will not be entertained.
