HYDROGRAPHIC NOTICE. No. 18.—SOUTH PACIFIC OCEAN. WESTERN PART.

Neptune Reef.—Additional information to that given in Hydrographic Notice, No. 25 of 1868, has been received from Lieut. G. P. Heath, R.N., the Port Master at Brisbane, regarding the Neptune reef, which lies to the southward of the Solomon Islands. The *Neptune*, in about lat. 12° 54' S., long. 161° 45' W., struck near the middle of the eastern edge of the reef, which is described as being 16 to 18 miles long by about 7 wide, forming a deep lagoon. The only raised portion of the reef visible from the ships' topmast head was a rock about 6 feet high near the centre of the eastern side.

Miller Reef.—Information has also been received from the same authority, of the existence of a reef in the Coral Sea, supposed to be hitherto unknown, westward of the Dampton and Bellona reefs, on which the barque *Henry Miller* struck in December, 1868. From observations obtained on the reef it was found to be in lat. 20° 51' S., long. 158° 02' E., and appeared to extend about 2 miles in a north-west and south-east direction, and to be about one cable in width. A rise and fall of 18 inches at neaps was observed, as also a slight set to the north-west.

La Brillante Shoal.—This dangerous reef discovered in the French corvette *La Brillante* in 1847, and which has been removed from the charts in consequence of an unsuccessful search for it made in 1853 by Captain Denham, of H.M.S. *Herald*; having been subsequently seen from the British merchant ship *Creole*, nearly in the same position assigned to it by M. Le Comte Dubouzet, Commander of *La Brillante*, has been again inserted in lat. 23° 14' S., long. 169° 55' E., as originally placed.

The shoal is described as a round patch of coral, about one-quarter of a cable in diameter, with 1 or 1½ fathoms water over it. Two soundings, in 20 and 23 fathoms, were obtained in its vicinity.

TENDERS are hereby invited, and will be received until Noon of Tuesday the 26th October, 1869, for the Conveyance of Post Office Mails as undermentioned, for one year, from the 1st January, 1870, to 31st December, 1870.

Tenders are required to be written on a form, printed copies of which may be had gratuitously on application at any post office in the colony, and may be forwarded (if by post, prepaid), addressed to the Honorable the Postmaster-General, with the words "Tender for the Conveyance of Mails" endorsed on the cover, or placed in the tender-box at the General Post Office.

Tenderers are requested to describe by their numbers as below the mail services for which they tender, and every tender will be taken to include the entire service as called for.

Every tender must bear the *bond fide* signature and addresses of the tenderer, and of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the fulfilment of the same in such sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of the contract.

Every tender must be accompanied by a bank deposit-receipt for a sum equal to twenty per cent. of the amount for which the tenderer is willing to undertake the service; the money to be lodged to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster-General, and to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete, within ten days of the date of notice being given of the acceptance of his tender, the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient.

The money deposited by successful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, on the bond and contract being completed.

The money deposited by unsuccessful tenderers will be returned to them on application, and on their signing receipts for the respective amounts, but not otherwise.

Persons tendering are requested to state the description of the vehicle they intend to use, and the number of horses by which it is to be drawn.

A separate tender must be sent in for each service; but notwithstanding this condition, any offer will be entertained for the performance of any number of services for a lump sum. The number of the service or services tendered for must be plainly endorsed on the outside of the cover.

The tender of any person failing to comply with the foregoing conditions will not be entertained.

The general conditions referred to in the printed form of tender, and upon which the tender is to be made, can be inspected by persons proposing to tender, either at the General Post Office or at any Post Office in the colony.

The attention of tenderers is drawn to the condition which requires that in cases where vehicles are used, Members of Parliament shall be conveyed free of charge between the districts they represent and the districts in which they reside and Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

SHIRE OF TALBOT.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Council of the Shire of Talbot did, on the 30th September, 1869, make the following Bye-law by special order:—

Whereas by the 73rd section of *The Land Act 1862* it is amongst other things enacted that the managers of commons shall have exclusive charge of the common for which they have been elected, and shall from time to time make rules for the proper management thereof, and further determining the number of cattle which each person entitled to commonage shall depasture thereon, and the fees payable in respect thereof, and that all such rules shall be published in the *Government Gazette* or some newspaper circulating in the locality. And whereas by the 54th section of *The Amending Land Act 1865* it is enacted that so much of the said 73rd section of *The Land Act 1862* as enables the managers of commons to make rules and determine the number of cattle to be depastured, and the fees payable in respect thereof, shall be and the same was repealed, and the powers in future shall be exercised by the body, whether incorporate or not, by whom the managers are appointed. And whereas by the 48th section of *The Amending Land Act 1865* it is enacted that all commons proclaimed previously to the passing of or under the provisions of *The Land Act 1862*, or under this Act, shall be governed by managers elected or appointed as provided for in *The Land Act 1862*, or in any Act of the Parliament of Victoria then or thereafter in force relating to road districts and shires, and the administration of local affairs without the limits of boroughs, or in any case of any two road districts, or any road district and borough, or any two or more boroughs, in any of which any united common be situated, be united; or if any district be proclaimed a shire under the provisions of such last-mentioned Act, or if any Act then or thereafter in force relating to municipal institutions and boroughs in Victoria, then by managers appointed or elected by the council of the united district or united borough or shire as the case may be. And whereas by the 52nd section of *The Amending Land Act 1865*, it was *inter alia* enacted that the council of each shire, and the road board of every road district, shall in the place and stead of the Board of Land and Works alone have control over all unoccupied Crown lands, if authorized in that behalf by the said Board, and over all farmers' commons and temporary commons within such district and shire respectively. And whereas the Glendaruel, Ascot, and Tourlelo Farmers' Common, the Craigie and Eglinton Farmers' Common, the Lillicur and Yalong Farmers' Common, and the Amherst Farmers' Common, respectively, are within the territorial limits of the shire of Talbot, and whereas it is expedient to make rules for the proper management of the said commons, and for determining the number of cattle which each person entitled to commonage shall depasture thereon, and the fees payable in respect thereof: Now, therefore, at a meeting of the shire council of Talbot, held at their office, situated in Scandinavian crescent, Talbot, in the Colony of Victoria, on the 2nd day of September, Anno Domini 1869, it is resolved that the rules for the proper management of the said commons, and for determining the number of cattle which each person entitled to commonage shall depasture thereon, and the fees payable in respect thereof, shall be as follows:—

1. All rules or bye-laws heretofore made by the Council of the Shire of Talbot for the government of any of the above-named commons shall be and the same are hereby repealed.

2. Each person entitled to depasture stock on the Glendaruel, Ascot, and Tourlelo Farmers' Common, the Craigie and Eglinton Farmers' Common, the Lillicur and Yalong Farmers' Common, and the Amherst Farmers' Common, respectively, shall be allowed to depasture one head of cattle for every four acres of land occupied by them, him, or her.

3. No charge shall be made for young stock under six months old the progeny of stock licensed to depasture on any of the above-named commons; and no person shall be allowed to depasture entire horses or bulls without the written permission of the managers.

4. All licenses shall be in force for half a year, to be computed from the day of the date thereof, and be renewable at the expiration of each half-year.

5. The fees to be charged to persons entitled to commonage on any of the above-named commons respectively, for depasturing cattle thereon, shall be—as to the Glendaruel, Ascot, and Tourlelo Farmers' Common, those specified in the first schedule hereunder written; as to the Craigie and Eglinton Farmers' Common, those specified in the second schedule hereunder written; as to the Lillicur and Yalong Farmers' Common, those specified in the third schedule hereunder written; as to the Amherst Farmers' Common, those specified in the fourth schedule hereunder written.

6. All persons taking cattle to depasture on any of the above-named commons shall deliver them into the charge of the herdsman of such respective common at the appointed branding yards on the days appointed for the same, together with a duplicate of the written statement of the number and brands of the cattle so delivered, and the herdsman of such respective common shall, on receiving the fees payable on such cattle, give a half-year's license for the same, and shall then proceed to brand the cattle with the common brand, which shall be of pitch or tar; the owners or persons in charge of the cattle in all cases shall render every assistance to the herdsman during the branding, and the managers will not be responsible for the loss of any cattle from off any of the above-named commons.

7. The managers may at any time require persons bringing cattle to depasture on any of the above-named commons to make a statutory declaration, certifying to the ownership of such cattle, and that they are entitled from their proximity to the common or extent of land occupied to depasture stock thereon.

8. The brand of all the above-named commons shall be registered in the Ballarat, Clunes, Carisbrook, Lexton, and

Amherst pounds, and the herdsman of such respective common shall give notice to the owners of cattle licensed to depasture that may get impounded in any of such pounds forty-eight hours after receiving notice of such impounding from any of the poundkeepers of the above-named pounds, and the cost of releasing cattle from pound shall be in all cases paid by the owner.

9. The managers of the above-named commons shall cause all their books, accounts, and documents connected with such commons to be placed before the Council of the Shire of Talbot annually, for the purpose of having them audited.

10. The managers of each of the above-named commons shall hold an ordinary meeting every month at some place appointed by them for the purpose; and any manager, if any, of the above-named commons who is absent from three consecutive ordinary meetings shall forfeit his appointment as a manager.

BYE-LAWS OF THE MELBOURNE LYING-IN HOSPITAL, AND INFIRMARY FOR DISEASES PECULIAR TO WOMEN AND CHILDREN.

WHEREAS by an Order of His Excellency the Governor in Council, bearing date the 19th day of December, 1864, the contributors for the time being to the Institution called and known as "The Melbourne Lying-In Hospital," situate in the city of Melbourne, were, under an Act intitled "An Act for Hospitals and Charitable Institutions," and numbered 220, declared to be a body politic and corporate, by the style and title of "The Melbourne Lying-In Hospital and Infirmary for Diseases peculiar to Women and Children."

And whereas at a public meeting of the contributors of the said incorporated hospital and infirmary, holden at the Mechanics' Institute, Melbourne, on the 5th day of July, 1869, and duly convened by advertisement in the *Argus* newspaper, published in Melbourne, one week previously thereto:—

- 1st. For the purposes of deciding on the number of the committee of such institution, and electing the same;
- 2nd. For deciding the number of honorary medical officers, and for electing the same;

And whereas by the said Act, numbered 220, intitled "An Act for Hospitals and Charitable Institutions," power is given to the corporation of any institution incorporated thereunder to make bye-laws for the regulation of its own proceedings, for fixing the number of votes of contributors in proportion to the amount of their own contributions, for determining the validity of disputed elections, and for conducting such elections, and generally for all matters whatsoever affecting the management of the institution, not inconsistent with the laws of the colony,

Be it therefore ordered and directed by the corporation of the Melbourne Lying-In Hospital and Infirmary for Diseases peculiar to Women and Children, as follows:—

1. The incorporated institution was established in the year 1856, for the purpose of affording relief to such women and children as the committee shall deem fit subjects for in-door or out-door relief, without reference to creed or country.

MEDICAL OFFICERS.

2. No person shall be an honorary medical officer of the institution who is not a graduate in medicine in one of the recognised universities of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and a member of either the Royal Colleges of Surgeons of England, Edinburgh, or Ireland; or a doctor in medicine of an Australian university, and they shall be appointed at a general meeting of contributors.

SPECIAL APPOINTMENT OF DR. TRACY.

3. That the present honorary medical officer, Dr. Tracy, in acknowledgment of the strenuous and praiseworthy efforts made by him in promoting the formation of this institution, be appointed honorary physician to the Lying-in Hospital for life, being a confirmation of his previous appointment.

4. No such honorary medical officer (except Dr. Tracy) shall continue in office for a longer period than five years from the day of his election, but shall be eligible for re-election.

LIFE MEMBERS.

5. Every contributor of Twenty pounds and upwards in one sum, at any time since the establishment of the hospital, shall be a life member, with the privilege of voting at all elections,

and be entitled annually to recommend one in-door patient and six out-door patients.

6. The following ladies and gentlemen, on account of valuable services rendered to the institution, shall be entitled to the rights and privileges of those who contribute Twenty pounds each, and shall be members for life:—

ANNUAL CONTRIBUTORS.

7. Every annual contributor of One pound and upwards shall be deemed a member of the institution for the current year, and be entitled to vote at all general meetings of contributors, provided that his or her first annual subscription shall have been paid at least one month prior to the day of meeting; and every such member shall, for the year, be entitled to recommend to the committee patients for admission to the hospital, as follows:—

If a contributor of £1, 1 in-door patient or 4 out-door patients	" " £2, 1 " " and 6 "
" " £3, 3 " " " 8 "	" " £5, 5 " " " 16 "
and so on in proportion to the amount subscribed.	

VOTING.

8. Every contributor shall be entitled to vote as follows:—

Of £20, or an annual sum of £1	One vote.
" £30, " £3	Two votes.
" £40, and upwards, " £5	Three votes.

OFFICERS.

9. There shall be a president and two vice-presidents, who shall be elected yearly, at the annual meeting in January.

10. There shall be an honorary treasurer elected at the annual meeting in January.

11. There shall be two auditors, (who shall not be members of the committee) elected annually, and who shall audit the yearly accounts.

12. There shall be two honorary secretaries, one a lady and the other a gentleman.

13. There shall be a resident medical officer and a matron, to be appointed by the committee of management.

COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT.

14. The committee of management consists of the president, the two vice-presidents, the treasurer, and the members of the committee for the time being elected by the contributors, in whom is vested the management of the institution.

15. The committee of management is appointed under the 4th section of the Act No. 220, as follows:—

Every such incorporated institution as aforesaid shall be governed by a committee of not less than seven members, to be elected by the contributors for the time being of such institution, and such committee, or any four of them, shall have and exercise all the powers and authorities by this Act vested in the corporation; and one-fourth part of such committee, or such fractional part as shall be nearest to one-fourth part, but no more, may be honorary medical men on the staff of such institution; and the president, vice-presidents, and treasurer of every such institution, shall, by virtue of their respective offices, be members of such committee.

16. Should there not be a quorum of the committee present on the weekly board day, it shall be competent for a less number to admit and discharge patients.

17. The committee shall have the appointment of the resident medical officer, matron, bankers, and other officers and servants of the institution, and allow such salaries, allowance, or recompense to them respectively, during their service or employment, as to the committee shall from time to time seem fit. All such officers and servants shall be appointed during the pleasure of the committee, who shall have the power of discontinuing their

services at any time on giving one month's notice; and also of immediate dismissal in the event of inefficiency, irregularity of conduct, or disobedience of the orders of the committee.

18. The committee shall also have power to enter into contracts for the supply of provisions and other articles for the use of the institution, to make such regulations as may be necessary for the internal management of the same, and to direct payment of accounts.

19. The committee of management shall meet at the hospital once in every week, on a stated day, and oftener if necessary, to transact current business. Minutes of the proceedings shall be entered in a book, and be read and confirmed at the next meeting.

20. The ladies of the committee and the gentlemen of the committee may meet separately, but no alteration shall be made in the salaries of any resident medical officer or matron of the institution without a special notice for that purpose.

21. No member of the committee shall supply the institution with any articles of trade, or be concerned in any contract relative thereto.

22. The retirement and re-election of members of the committee is provided for by the 11th and 12th sections of the Act No. 220, as follows:—

Section 11.—On the second Thursday in the month of January in every year one-third part of the elected members of the committee shall go out of office, but may nevertheless be re-elected; and the persons who shall go out of office shall be those who have been the longest in office without re-election, or where two or more shall have been in office for the same length of time, then those who shall go out of office shall be determined by lot.

Section 12.—If any member of the committee shall die, or resign by letter under his hand addressed to the chairman of the committee, or become insolvent, or compound with his creditors, or be convicted of any treason, felony, or misdemeanor, or be absent for four consecutive meetings from the committee, his office shall become vacant, and the remaining members of the committee may declare his office vacant and temporarily appoint thereto some contributor to such institution, until the next annual meeting for the election of the committee, when the person thus temporarily appointed shall retire as one of those who, by the provisions of this Act, are required to go out of office.

23. At all general meetings of contributors, twelve shall constitute a quorum; and as soon as a quorum is present the chair will be taken, but if no quorum is present within half an hour of the time named, such meeting shall stand adjourned for the following week, at the same day and hour.

24. It shall be competent for the committee of management, or any twenty or more contributors, by a writing under their hands, to require the secretary to summon a special meeting of contributors, the occasion of calling such meeting being specified in the requisition; and no business shall be transacted at such special meeting, except that for which it shall have been summoned; every such meeting shall be called by the secretary.

25. The committee of management may suspend any member of the honorary medical staff, provided that an absolute majority of the committee concur in such suspension, and provided that the suspension and cause thereof be reported to a general meeting of the contributors, to be specially convened for that purpose, within two weeks after the order of suspension was made.

26. No proposition to enact or amend a bye-law, or frame or vary any rule, shall be entertained, unless one month's previous notice has been given of such, and no motion to rescind a resolution shall be submitted within three months after such resolution has been passed, unless one month's notice of the same be given, and such motion be passed by an absolute majority of the whole committee.

27. The honorary medical staff are empowered to frame rules for the admission of medical and surgical pupils, and the fees to be paid by the same, subject to the approval of the committee of management.

28. Special meetings of the committee may be convened on the requisition of the president or one of the vice-presidents, or of any four members of the committee, and the secretary shall give notice of the business to be transacted at such a meeting, at which no other business shall be considered.

29. It shall be competent for the committee to alter the rules, or add to them, subject to confirmation, as required by the 7th section of the Act No. 220.

ANNUAL MEETING AND OTHER GENERAL MEETINGS.

30. An annual meeting shall be held on or after the second Thursday in January in each year; of which not less than seven days' notice shall be given in two of the newspapers published in Melbourne, for the purpose of transacting the general business of the institution, receiving from the committee an abstract of the state of the accounts, of receipts and expenditure, with a report of the general concerns of the institution for the past year ending the 31st December, and for the election of members of the committee in place of those retiring, and the election of auditors.

31. All general meetings shall be called by like notices, signed by the honorary secretary, and shall elect the chairman.

ELECTIONS.

32. If the number of persons proposed at any public meeting of the contributors to the institution, for election as members of committee, honorary medical officers, or any other office whatsoever, shall exceed the number of persons to be elected, and a poll shall be demanded, the poll shall be taken at such place as the meeting shall appoint, on the following day, between the hours of two o'clock and four o'clock in the afternoon, by one of the members of the committee of management and two scrutineers appointed by him, and such other deputies and scrutineers as he may appoint.

33. The names in full of all the candidates shall be printed on ballot papers in alphabetical order of the surnames.

34. There shall be a ballot-box or boxes provided, which the scrutineers shall, before taking any vote, examine and see that they are empty, lock the same, and hand the key or keys to the officer taking the ballot.

35. Every person entitled to vote as a contributor shall state to the officer taking his vote his name in full; and upon the officer or his deputy being satisfied he is entitled to vote, shall deliver to him one or more ballot papers, according to the number of votes possessed by the applicant.

36. The person receiving such ballot papers shall then and there strike out the name of the candidate or candidates for whom he does not intend to vote, by obliterating the same; and taking care not to leave in the said paper more names than the number of persons to be elected, and shall then and there place such paper in the ballot-box provided for the purpose.

37. When the poll is closed, the officer taking the ballot and the scrutineers shall carefully separate, examine, and count the ballot papers, and note the number for each candidate.

TREASURER AND ACCOUNTS.

38. All moneys contributed to the institution shall be paid to the treasurer, who shall immediately, or as soon thereafter as practicable, pay the same into the bank.

39. The accounts of each tradesman shall be paid monthly.

40. All disbursements of the funds of the institution shall be made by cheque to be drawn upon the bank at which the account of the corporation is kept, and signed by the honorary treasurer, and no such disbursement shall be made unless by direction of the committee of management.

41. Receipts shall be obtained from all persons to whom any sum of money is paid.

THE MATRON.

42. The matron shall at once report to the committee any want of attention or neglect on the part of any or either of the nurses or servants of the institution, or any irregularity, or any other matter or thing that may occur relating to the affairs of the institution and out of the ordinary course of business.

ADMISSION OF IN-PATIENTS.

43. In-patients shall be admitted on the ticket of a qualified subscriber, subject to the approval of the committee or of the honorary medical officer for the week. In any case of emergency which the medical officer may admit on his own discretion, such officer shall make a special report of the circumstances to the committee, and all particulars respecting it shall afterwards be recorded and preserved for future reference. The committee shall have the power of admitting patients unable to procure subscribers' tickets, provided they bring satisfactory references.

OUT-PATIENTS.

44. Out-patients, on the ticket of a qualified subscriber, and subject to the approval of the committee or honorary medical officer, shall receive such medicines and medical advice as the case may require, and on days fixed for that purpose; this rule applying only to women suffering from diseases peculiar to them and to children. The committee shall have the power of admitting patients unable to procure subscribers' tickets, provided they bring satisfactory references.

RECOMMENDATION OF PATIENTS.

45. Subscribers, before recommending a patient to the committee, are expected, from personal enquiry, to satisfy themselves that the case is one needing charitable relief.

SPIRITUAL CONSOLATION.

46. Any in-patient desirous of spiritual consolation shall at all times be accessible to the minister of her religion.

VISITORS AND FRIENDS.

47. Subscribers may visit the hospital on Tuesdays and Fridays, between the hours of two and four o'clock p.m.; and the public and friends of patients may visit the hospital on Mondays and Wednesdays, between the hours of two and three o'clock p.m.

SEAL.

48. That the seal of the corporation shall be an elevation of the building, with the name "Melbourne Lying-in Hospital and Infirmary" round it; but until such seal shall be prepared, and a minute made thereof by the committee, the seal of which the impression is attached to these bye-laws shall be the seal of the corporation.

49. That such seal shall be in the custody of the gentleman honorary secretary, and shall be affixed only under the order of the committee, by and in the presence of such honorary secretary, or some one deputed in his place by the committee, and one other member of the gentleman's committee, and these two shall sign their names as witnesses.

The foregoing bye-laws were made and passed by the Melbourne Lying-in Hospital and Infirmary for Diseases peculiar to Women and Children, and the seal of the said corporation was hereunto affixed the third day of August, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, in the presence of

SHIRE OF YACKANDANDAH.

THE Rules and Regulations, made by the Council of the Shire of Yackandandah, for the management of Farmers' Commons within the shire, on the 5th day of October, 1865, and published in the *Government Gazette*, November 10th, 1865, are, by virtue of a Resolution passed by the Council on Thursday, September 30th, 1870, repealed, and the following substituted:—

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF BARNAWARTHA FARMERS' COMMON WITHIN THE SHIRE OF YACKANDANDAH.

1. Every farmer or tenant farmer in occupation of land within the same parish or agricultural area as the above-named common, also any holder of a business license, publican's license, or splitter's license resident upon or within the boundaries of the aforesaid common, shall be entitled to depasture thereon such description of stock as may be decided by the managers of the common.

2. Each person so entitled to commonage, as in the preceding section, shall be permitted to depasture cattle on the common according to the following scale, that is to say:—2 head of cattle or 1 horse for every 10 acres of land cultivated, and 6 head of cattle or 3 horses for every 100 acres of grass land occupied by him or her; but no person shall be permitted to depasture more than 40 head of cattle or 20 horses; the holder of a business license, publican's or splitter's license, 2 head of cattle or 2 horses.

3. The assessment of stock depasturing on the common to be as follows, viz.:—For every horse over 12 months old, 4 shillings per annum; for every head of cattle over 12 months old, 2 shillings per annum.

4. All assessment to be paid half-yearly, in advance; the half-year to commence on the first day of October and the first day of April in each year.

5. The owners of stock depasturing on the common will be required to muster them in their own yards, or some more convenient place, as often as may be found necessary, to be branded with the common brand in pitch, upon notice in writing being given them by the herdsman or managers. All stock to be branded by the herdsman or managers; all unbranded stock found on the common to be considered as straying, and to be impounded forthwith.

6. Bulls or entire horses will not be permitted to run on the common.

7. The herdsman of the common, or any person authorised by the managers, may have authority to impound all straying or unauthorised stock found thereon, a registry of which he will be required to keep, so that all damages and fees arising therefrom may be properly accounted for.

8. It shall be necessary for the owners of any cattle diseased or supposed to be diseased, to remove such cattle from the common within 24 hours after notice in writing requiring them so to do, has been given them from a majority of the managers, and in the event of the owner's refusal so to do, he shall be considered a trespasser and be liable to the penalties mentioned in section 129 of *The Land Act* 1862. Any person being found depasturing more cattle than what he has taken out a license and paid for, shall be liable to the penalties mentioned in the 129th section of *The Land Act* 1862.

9. The managers shall have the power of appointing and of discharging the herdsman.

10. The managers are not to be held responsible for any neglect or irregularities of the herdsman.

11. A record to be kept by the managers or the herdsman, showing the number and description of cattle each person has paid for.

12. The managers shall give a printed receipt to each person, showing number and description of stock, and the amount paid in respect of them.

13. All stock shall be at the owner's risk.

14. The managers to hand in to the secretary of the shire on the first day of October in each year, the various books of account kept by them in respect of the common, together with a statement showing the receipts and expenditure for the past year, for the purpose of being audited by auditors appointed by the council.

15. The shire council will appoint managers for the common at its first meeting in September in each year, such managers not to enter into office until the first day of October following, and to continue in office until the first day in October in the succeeding year. Should any manager vacate his office during the currency of any year, the council will appoint another in his stead, who shall continue in office so long only as the manager in whose stead he was appointed would have continued in office.

16. The managers shall elect a secretary from among themselves, who shall keep the common account, issue licenses, receive and disburse moneys connected with the common, subject to the consent and approval of the other managers, and shall pay to the secretary of the shire the balance (if any) after defraying the working expenses of the common.

17. Secretary to furnish security to the amount of Fifty pounds.

RULES, ETC., FOR SOUTH BARNAWARTHA FARMERS' COMMON.

1. Every farmer, or tenant farmer, in occupation of land within the same parish or agricultural area as the above-named common, also any holder of a business license, publican's license, or splitter's license, resident upon or within the boundaries of the aforesaid common, shall be entitled to depasture thereon such description of stock as may be decided by the managers of the common.

2. Each person so entitled to commonage, as in the preceding section, shall be permitted to depasture cattle on the common according to the following scale, that is to say:—2 head of cattle or 1 horse for every 10 acres of land cultivated, and 16 head of cattle or 5 horses for every 100 acres of grass land occupied by him or her; but no person shall be permitted to depasture more than 50 head of cattle or 25 horses; the holder

of a business license, publican's or splitter's license, 2 head of cattle or 2 horses.

3. The assessment of stock depasturing on the common to be as follows, viz.:—For every horse over 12 months old, 4 shillings per annum; for every head of cattle over 12 months old, 2 shillings per annum.

4. All assessment to be paid half-yearly, in advance; the half-year to commence on the first day of October and the first day of April in each year.

5. The owners of stock depasturing on the common will be required to muster them in their own yards, or some more convenient place, as often as may be found necessary to be branded with the common brand in pitch, upon notice in writing being given them by the herdsman or managers; all unbranded stock found on the common to be considered as straying, and to be impounded forthwith.

6. Bulls or entire horses will not be permitted to run on the common without the written consent of the managers.

7. The herdsman of the common, or any person authorised by the managers, may have authority to impound all straying or unauthorised stock found thereon, a registry of which he will be required to keep, so that all damages and fees arising therefrom may be properly accounted for.

8. It shall be necessary for the owners of any cattle diseased or supposed to be diseased, to remove such cattle from the commons within 24 hours after notice in writing, requiring them so to do, has been given them from a majority of the managers; and in the event of the owner's refusal so to do, he shall be considered as a trespasser, and be liable to the penalties mentioned in section 129 of *The Land Act 1862*. Any person being found depasturing more cattle than what he has taken out a license and paid for, shall be liable to the penalties mentioned in section 129 of *The Land Act 1862*.

9. The managers shall have the power of appointing and of discharging the herdsman.

10. The managers are not to be held responsible for any neglect or irregularities of the herdsman.

11. A record to be kept by the managers or the herdsman showing the number and description of cattle each person has paid for.

12. The managers shall give a printed receipt to each person, showing number and description of stocks and the amount paid, in respect of them.

13. All stock shall be at the owner's risk.

14. The managers to hand in to the secretary of the shire on the first day of October in each year, the various books of account kept by them in respect of the common, together with a statement showing the receipts and expenditure for the past year, for the purpose of being audited by auditors appointed by the council.

15. RULES, ETC., FOR NORTH AND SOUTH WOORAGER FARMERS' COMMON.

1. Every farmer or tenant farmer in occupation of land within the same parishes or agricultural area as the above-named common, also any holder of a business license, publican's license, or splitter's license resident upon or within the boundaries of the aforesaid common, shall be entitled to depasture thereon such description of stock as may be decided by the managers of the common.

2. Each person so entitled to commonage as in the preceding section shall be permitted to depasture cattle on the common according to the following scale, that is to say:—6 head of cattle or 3 horses for every 20 acres cultivated, and 10 head of cattle or 5 horses for every 100 acres of grass land occupied by him or her; but no person shall be permitted to depasture more than 60 head of cattle or 30 horses; the holder of a business license, publican's or splitter's license, 2 head of cattle or 2 horses.
