THE BOROUGH OF STAWELL.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the tenth day of November, 1869.

PRESENT:

WHEREAS by *The Municipal Corporations Act 1863* it is amongst other things enacted, that any district not being a district wholly or in part comprised within the limits of the city of Melbourne, or, save as therein provided, the town of Geelong, or of any of the boroughs constituted by or under the said Act, which district shall not exceed in area nine square miles, and shall have no one point in such area distant more than six miles from any other point therein, and shall contain a population of inhabitant householders not less than three hundred, may be constituted a borough in manner next hereinafter mentioned; and it is also enacted, that if not less than one hundred and fifty of the inhabitant householders resident within any such last-mentioned district shall sign and cause to be presented to the Governor a petition praying him to constitute such district a

borough under the said Act, and in such petition shall set forth accurately the boundaries of the district to which such petition shall refer, and if within one month of the publication as therein-after mentioned of such petition, an equal or greater number of inhabitant householders resident within such district so described shall not have signed and caused to be presented to the Governor a petition praying him not to grant the prayer of such first-mentioned petition, it shall be lawful for the Governor by an Order in Council, if it shall seem fit, to constitute such district, or any portion thereof, a borough within the meaning of the said Act; and it is further enacted, that in every such Order in Council as aforesaid the name and boundaries of the borough thereby constituted shall be set forth, and upon the making of every such order the district therein named shall be and be deemed to be a "borough," hereinafter sometimes called a "proclaimed borough," within the meaning of the said Act, provided that such district shall not comprise any locality not included within the boundaries set forth in the petition for the constitution thereof. And whereas by *The Local Government Act 1863* it is amongst other things enacted, that after any part of any district shall have been constituted a municipal district or a borough under any Act relating to municipal corporations, such part shall cease to be deemed for the purposes of the now-reciting Act part of such first-mentioned district or of any subdivisions thereof, provided that all rates made under the provisions of the now-reciting Act before such constitution shall and may nevertheless be paid, levied, and recovered by the board of the district as though such constitution had not taken place; and it is also enacted, that every Order in Council made under the preceding sections of the now reciting Act shall be forthwith published in the *Government Gazette*, and shall take effect upon such publication; and it is also enacted, that every shire shall, after the proclamation thereof as such, be and be deemed to be and have been such and the same district as such shire was at the time of such proclamation; and save as aforesaid, and save where in the now-reciting Act otherwise expressly provided, all the provisions of the now-reciting Act relating to districts shall continue and be of full force and effect with regard to such shire, and be read accordingly: And whereas a petition, in accordance with the provisions of the first-recited Act, has been presented to the Governor by inhabitant householders resident at Stawell, in the Shire of Stawell, and notice of such petition has been duly given in the *Government Gazette* of the seventeenth day of September, 1869, and in a newspaper circulating at Stawell: And whereas no petition in opposition to the above-named petition has been received from inhabitant householders resident at Stawell within one month of publication as provided by the first-recited Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth, in exercise of the power and authority conferred by the first-recited Act, constitute the district hereinafter described a borough within the meaning of the said Act, and doth set forth the name and boundaries of the said borough in manner following, that is to say:—

THE BOROUGH OF STAWELL.—Commencing at a point twenty-two chains south of the south-west angle of the boundary of the township of Stawell; thence west forty-one chains; thence north two hundred and ten chains; thence east two hundred and sixty-one chains; thence south to the main road from Ararat to Stawell two hundred and eighty-eight chains or thereabouts; thence north-westerly along the north-eastern boundary of the said main road to a one-chain road south of allotment thirteen of section B, Stawell; thence westerly along the southern boundary of the said road to the commencing point; the said bearings being magnetic.

And the Honorable John Alexander MacPherson, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

CLUNES UNITED BOROUGH AND GOLD-FIELD COMMON.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable SIR JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1862* it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon or within five miles of any gold-field, or in or within five miles of any town not contained in any municipal district, or within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land to be a municipal common, or a gold-fields common, or a town common, or a farmers' common, respectively, as the case may be; and it is also enacted that the Governor in Council may at any time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common proclaimed before or after the passing of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby diminish the Common hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the above-recited provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

THE CLUNES UNITED BOROUGH AND GOLD-FIELD COMMON, described in a Proclamation bearing date the 14th day of September, 1863, is hereby diminished by deducting therefrom the land in the parish of Smeaton, containing an area of 63

acres, temporarily reserved for Watering and Camping purposes, by Order of 26th March, 1866, the said land comprising allotment 15 of section B, in the parish of Smeaton, and a portion of land adjoining that allotment on the south-west, as set forth in the *Gazette* of the 17th April, 1866.—(69.V.19551.)

IRON CASTINGS.

TENDERS will be received until Noon on Tuesday, the 30th of November, 1869 (postponed from 23rd November), from persons willing to furnish Iron Castings, in such quantities as may be required for the Government Railways, from 1st January until the 31st December, 1870.

The castings are required for locomotive engine work, carriage work, &c.

The castings are to be clean, sharp, free from surface scale, shell, cold shuts, blow holes, honeycomb, cinder, or any other imperfection, and are to be sound in every respect and thoroughly close in grain. When specially ordered, the castings are to be run with heads or runners of such weight as may be requested, and no extra charge shall be made or allowed for same; and the contractor will be required to remove the head or runner from the casting where possible, and charge the casting at the net weight only, trimmed and cleaned. In cases where it is necessary to cut off the head in a lathe or machine, such head will be cut off by the Government, and returned to the Melbourne Station, there to be delivered to the contractor free of cost of carriage.

Whenever ordered, the castings are to be moulded in loam without a pattern, and loam price will be paid according to schedule, but no extra charge will be allowed for patterns, strickles, or loam boards. The orders will express the kind or description of casting according to the schedule distinction; and the rates there filled in opposite each item will be allowed accordingly.

The Government will supply all patterns, and deliver the same to the Melbourne Station free of cost, from whence the contractor must fetch them when required and when due notice of same has been given in writing, and no cost for carriage from Spencer street Station to the contractor's place of business will be allowed.

2. Notwithstanding the delivery of any castings into the store and a receipt having been given for them, should such castings turn out unsound, not in accordance with pattern or instructions, or in any way whatever defective, or of different quality of iron to that ordered, they must be taken away from the Railway Store at Williamstown at the expense of the contractor, and other castings must be supplied in lieu thereof, without delay, and without additional charge.

3. Tenderers must fill in opposite to each particular item in the schedule the price at which he undertakes to execute the work, according to the specification and conditions.

4. Should the contractor, in the opinion of the Engineer-in-Chief, fail to furnish work in accordance with the specification, then, in seven days after due notice to that effect shall have been given, in writing, the Secretary for Railways shall have full power to re-advertise and relet this contract to any other person the Government shall think fit; and at the expiration of seven days after such notice shall have been given to the contractor this contract shall become null and void.

5. The contractor must furnish with each delivery detailed invoices or bills of parcels, in duplicate, showing quantity, rate, and value, also the number of the order of the goods, otherwise they will not be received. Delivery, as a rule, is to be of the full quantity ordered at one time.

6. The contractor will prepare his own account on the prescribed form, and render the same to the Railway Storekeeper for certification, previously to payment at the Treasury.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer requiring the supply as to the quality, the same is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the Engineer-in-Chief, and the decision of the board is to be considered final. Any expense incurred on account of the rejection of supplies by a board of survey will be charged to the contractor.

8. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense, if any, will be charged to the contractor.

9.
