**W**HEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria passed in the twenty-eighth year of Her Majesty's reign, numbered 261, and intitled, *An Act for the Consolidation of the Law relating to County Courts*, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to direct that county courts shall be holden for the recovery of debts and demands under the said Act, and with the advice aforesaid, to alter the place of holding any such court or to direct that the holding of any such court be discontinued, and from time to time with the advice aforesaid, to direct in what towns and places a county court shall be holden; and it is also enacted that the judge of each county court shall attend and hold such court at the place where the Governor in Council shall have directed that such court shall be holden, at such times as such judge shall appoint for that purpose, so that a court shall be holden in such place once at least in such interval as the Governor in Council shall in each case direct: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order direct that a County Court shall be holden for the recovery of debts and demands under the said Act, at the town and within the interval hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

At BLACKWOOD, once at least in every three calendar months.

**W**HEREAS by *The Amending Land Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time, before or after the proclamation of any agricultural area, proclaim as a road or as a town or village any portion or portions of such area not selected, purchased, or leased, and not exceeding, if proclaimed as a town or village, six hundred and forty acres of the lands comprised in such area, and the lands in such town or village shall be sold by auction in the manner provided for the sale by public auction of lands not reserved for proclamation in such areas: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of colony, bearing date the eighteenth day of February, 1861, it was amongst other things declared that a certain area therein described should be considered the town of Beaufort: And whereas it is expedient to alter the area of the said town: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke so much of the Proclamation above mentioned, as relates to the said town of Beaufort; and, with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby proclaim the land hereinafter described as a town, that is to say:—

TOWN OF BEAUFORT, county of Ripon: Commencing at the north-east angle of allotment 6, parish of Erambeen; being a point on the western side of the road from Beaufort to Skipton; thence N. 89° 55' W. forty-three chains ninety links; thence north sixty-five chains forty-nine links; thence east one hundred and five chains forty links; thence south sixty-five chains fifty links; and thence N. 89° 58' W. sixty-one chains fifty links to the point of commencement.—(68 Q.7897.)

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

**W**HEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1863*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for ten or more inhabitants of any part of Victoria not lying within the limits of the city of Melbourne or town of Geelong, or of any municipal or road district, and of whom each one shall

possess property rateable under the said Act within the area next hereinafter mentioned, to sign and present to the Governor a petition setting forth that the area, which shall by metes and bounds be described in such petition, contains not less than forty square miles, and rateable property whereof the net annual value is not less than Five thousand pounds, and praying that such area may be constituted a road district; and it is also enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, upon being satisfied that the statements set forth in the petition are true, and that it is desirable to comply with the prayer thereof, to constitute such part of Victoria, under such name as shall in and by the same Order in Council be assigned thereto, a new road district; and the words "proclaimed district," where used in the said Act, shall be deemed to mean such new district: And whereas a petition signed by more than ten inhabitants of the area or part of Victoria hereinafter described, possessing rateable property in such area, has been presented to the Governor, setting forth the matters and things required by the said Act, and due notice of such petition has been published as provided by the said Act, and in compliance with the prayer thereof an Order in Council, bearing even date herewith, has been made, to constitute the said area a new road district: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby constitute and proclaim the part of Victoria hereinafter described to be a new road district, under the name assigned thereto in and by the Order in Council hereinbefore mentioned, that is to say:—

**THE BROADFORD ROAD DISTRICT.**—Starting on the boundary of Bourke county true south of the south-east angle of Linton's pre-emptive right; thence direct to that angle, and by Sunday Creek and the boundary of and including Broadford parish to the south-east angle of Loury parish; thence true east to a point true south of the south-east angle of Worrough pre-emptive right; thence true north to the Goulburn River, and by that river, Narragearnong and King Parrot creeks, excluding portions 58 to 77, Flowerdale parish, and by the boundaries of and excluding portions 5, 4, and 3, Kinglake parish, and by the boundaries of Evelyn and Bourke counties to the starting point.

**BOROUGH OF BRIGHTON.**

**WHEREAS** by the 170th clause of the Act 27th Victoria No. 184, intitled *An Act to consolidate and amend the Laws relating to Municipal Institutions*, the Council of the Borough of Brighton are empowered to make bye-laws for purposes expressed in the said Act, and whereas by the 363rd clause of the said act it is enacted, that it shall be lawful for the council of every borough by bye-law, to regulate the places and times at and during which persons of either sex shall be entitled to bathe, and to prohibit persons not engaged in bathing from unnecessarily resorting to such places during such times as aforesaid; Be it therefore enacted, that, from and after the date of the publication hereof in the Government Gazette—

1st. From the 1st day of October in every year to the following 30th day of April, both inclusive, the parts hereinafter mentioned of the beach or shore of Port Phillip Bay adjoining the borough, shall be, and the same are hereby set apart as bathing ground exclusively for females, between the hours of half-past Seven o'clock and half-past Ten o'clock in the forenoon, and between the hours of Five o'clock and half-past Six o'clock in the afternoon of every day during the above period.

Parts of the Beach referred to—

1. Between the prolongation to high-water mark of the south boundary of the North road, and the prolongation as above of the north boundary of Bay street.
2. Between the prolongation to high-water mark of the south boundary of Bay street, and the continuation to high-water mark of the north side of the Strand Crescent near Park street.
3. Between the continuation to high-water mark of the south side of the Strand Crescent, and the prolongation to high-water mark of the north boundary of Wellington street.
4. Between the prolongation to high-water mark of the south boundary of Wellington street, and the prolongation as above of the north boundary of Dendy street.

2nd. No male person above the age of ten years shall bathe upon any portion of the said bathing ground, or within 50 yards from the water edge thereof, within the time hereinbefore exclusively limited for females.

3rd. No male person shall within such time unnecessarily resort to, or linger about the said bathing ground, when any female is bathing or having just bathed.
