COMMON IN AN AGRICULTURAL AREA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable SIR JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Amending Land Act* 1865, it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected under *The Land Act* 1862, or selected or leased under the now reciting Act, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land a farmers' common; when one-eighth part of any agricultural area has been selected under *The Land Act* 1862, or selected or leased under the now reciting Act, the Governor in Council may proclaim any unselected and unleased portion of such agricultural area, not exceeding twice the quantity so selected and leased, to be a temporary common for the use of such selectors and lessees; and it is also enacted, that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common theretofore or thereafter to be proclaimed or reproclaimed, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of *The Land Act* 1862 and the now reciting Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby diminish the common hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

NEKEEYA AGRICULTURAL AREA COMMON:—The Nekeeya Agricultural Area Temporary Common, described in a Proclamation bearing date the 30th day of August, 1869, is hereby diminished by deducting therefrom the reserve containing ninety-three acres one rood twenty-three perches, adjoining allotment 46, in the parish of Nekeeya on the south-west.—(69 U.4395.)

PART I. OF "THE POLICE OFFENCES STATUTE 1865" EXTENDED TO GRAYTOWN.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable SIR JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the session held in the twenty-eighth year of Her Majesty's reign (No. 285), called *The Police Offences Statute* 1865, it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council may by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* extend all or any of the provisions contained in Part I. of the said Statute to any city, town, district, or place in Victoria, and may define the limits of any such city, town, district, or place, and vary and alter such limits, and may revoke any such Proclamation; and upon any such Proclamation the provisions so proclaimed shall extend to and be in force, in such city, town, district, or place: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, do, with the advice of the Executive Council, by this my Proclamation, extend all the provisions contained in Part I. of the said Statute to the borough hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

THE BOROUGH OF GRAYTOWN.

GENERAL REGULATIONS OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION.

THE subjoined General Regulations, relative to Gymnastics framed by the Board of Education, have been laid before the Governor in Council, and approved, in accordance with the provisions of the Act No. 149.

The subjoined Appendices, C, E, and H, to the General Regulations, have also been approved, instead of Appendices C and E to the Regulations published in the *Government Gazette* of the 15th October, 1869.

GYMNASTICS.

1. Bonuses will be granted to schools in which the scholars are instructed in Gymnastics, subject to the following conditions:—

- (a.) That the teacher imparting the instruction hold a certificate of qualification under Rule 118.
- (b.) That gymnastic apparatus be provided as described in Appendix H.
- (c.) That the pupils exhibit a fair amount of proficiency.

2. The Inspector will report upon gymnastics at the same time as on the examination for results. The amount of the bonus for the year will be determined by his report, and it shall not in any case exceed £10 to any one school; nor shall any bonus be paid unless the Inspector can report that the apparatus and the progress of the pupils are at least moderately satisfactory. The teacher who imparts the instruction shall be entitled to receive the bonus.

APPENDIX C.

PROGRAMME OF EXAMINATION FOR CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY, AND OF HONORS.

FIRST DIVISION OF COMPETENCY FOR HEAD TEACHERS OF SCHOOLS IN WHICH ONE OR MORE ASSISTANTS ARE EMPLOYED.

Reading.—To read fluently, and with proper expression and emphasis, both prose and poetry.

Writing and Composition.—To be able to write from dictation, with correct spelling and punctuation, from an ordinary book or newspaper, and to compose a short essay on some given subject from, or reproduce the substance of, some lesson in the Fourth or Fifth Book.

Grammar.—Morell's Grammar and Analysis.

Geography.—Descriptive geography of the four continents, Australasia, and Victoria, and to have a fair knowledge of the products, governments, and manners of the various nations, and the mathematical and physical geography of Sullivan's "Geography Generalized," or equivalent.

Arithmetic.—The simple and compound rules, practice, proportion, interest, principles of mental arithmetic, vulgar and decimal fractions, elements of book-keeping. Females to mental arithmetic only, inclusive.

Art of Teaching.—

Penmanship—To set fair copy head-lines, in large and small hands.

Time-table—To draw up a Time-table.

Notes of a Lesson—To compose the notes of a lesson.

School Management*—To answer questions in the methods of instruction and the organization of schools. To understand class drill.† To give a collective lesson.

Needlework.‡—Females to be able to cut out and do any kind of plain needlework.

SECOND DIVISION OF COMPETENCY FOR HEAD TEACHERS OF SCHOOLS IN WHICH NO ASSISTANTS ARE EMPLOYED, AND FOR ASSISTANT TEACHERS.

Reading.—To read clearly, fluently, and with proper emphasis.

Writing and Composition.—To write from memory neatly, with correct grammar, spelling, and punctuation, the substance of a short narrative read aloud.

Grammar.—To parse an easy sentence in prose.

Geography.—The elements of mathematical and physical geography, and the principal features on the maps of the World, Europe, Australasia, and Victoria.

Arithmetic.—The simple and compound rules, practice, proportion, principles of mental arithmetic, interest, vulgar and decimal fractions. Females to mental arithmetic only, inclusive.

*Art of Teaching.**—To give a satisfactory lesson to a class in reading, writing, arithmetic, grammar, or geography; to understand class drill,† and to keep a class in order, attention, and activity.

Needlework.‡—Females to be able to cut out and do any kind of plain needlework.

* The examination in school management will remain as at present till July, 1870, when the above will take effect.

† Knowledge of class drill is held to comprise: *Ability of a Teacher.*—1. When standing apart from his class (*i.e.*, where he cannot touch the scholars), by word of command alone, without explanations, to move them from the desks into the body of the schoolroom and place them in a gallery, if there be one, or, if not, replace them in the desks. 2. To carry his class (by word of command) through a set of extension exercises. Also to be fully acquainted with and to put a cue through the parts of military squad drill named below, and described in the "Field Book, 1867," on the pages specified:—

PROGRAMME OF SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION OF TEACHERS IN TRAINING.

Persons desirous of admission to training must be examined and pass in the following subjects :—

Reading, with tolerable fluency.

Spelling, from dictation, with tolerable correctness.

Penmanship.—To write a fair running-hand.

Grammar.—To know the parts of speech, the cases of nouns, and the tenses and moods of verbs. To know the government of the verb and the nominative case, the verb and objective case, and the syntax of adjectives.

Geography.—The outlines of the map of the world.

Arithmetic.—The four simple rules.

Teaching.—To manifest some natural ability therein.

THIRD CLASS.—EQUIVALENT TO THE FIRST DIVISION OF COMPETENCY.

Reading.—To read fluently, and with proper emphasis and expression, both prose and poetry.

Writing and Composition.—To be able to write from dictation, with correct spelling and punctuation, from an ordinary book or newspaper, and to write plain prose upon a given subject.

Penmanship.—To set fair copy head-lines in large, round, and small hands, and to write a fair running-hand.

Grammar.—Morell's Grammar and Analysis.

Geography.—To know the descriptive geography of the four continents, and of Australia and Victoria; to have a fair knowledge of the products, governments, and manners of the various nations, and the mathematical and physical geography of Sullivan's "Geography Generalized."

Arithmetic.—A full knowledge, both theoretical and practical, with the elements of book-keeping.

School Management.—To answer questions in the methods of instruction and the organization of schools. To understand class drill. To give a collective lesson.

Needlework.—Females to be able to cut out and do any kind of plain needlework.

Music and Drawing.—Teachers will be required to manifest as good a knowledge of these subjects as their natural abilities will permit. They will be examined in the subjects set forth in Appendix D.

Attendance in Training.—One year's attendance at the Training Institution. To have spent during each six months of attendance at least forty days or eighty half-days in the practice of teaching, either in the Central Schools or some other licensed practising school, as the Superintendent may have directed.

SECOND CLASS.

To have passed for Third Class, and to obtain fifty per cent. of the marks given for each of the following additional subjects:—

English Structure and Etymology, with Composition, including the study of some English classic to be named from time to time, *e.g.*, a book of Milton or a play of Shakespeare.

Any two of the following subjects.—(The subjects in which instruction shall be given to be fixed by the Board at the commencement of each half-year):—

1. Physical Geography and Popular Astronomy.
2. Euclid, four books, and Algebra to Quadratic Equations.
3. Outlines of the History of England and Victoria.
4. Physical Science, including—
Elementary Mechanics, Hydrostatics, Pneumatics.
Chemistry (inorganic)—Light, Heat, and Electricity.—Fownes' Manual, Parts I. and II., viz., to p. 404.
Botany (elementary).—Lindley.
Geology and Mineralogy.

Attendance.—Six months' attendance at the Training Institution, in addition to the attendance required for the Third Class.

FIRST CLASS.

To have passed for the Third Class, and to obtain eighty per cent. of the marks given for the additional subjects set forth for the Second Class.

Attendance.—One year in the Training Institution, in addition to the attendance required for the Third Class. To have spent during each six months of attendance at least forty days or eighty half-days in the practice of teaching, either in the Central Schools or in some other practising school, as the Superintendent may have directed.

Students at present in training will be permitted to include the periods already spent by them in the Institution in computing the amount of attendance required for the different classes.

Pupil-teachers who have completed their course, and teachers in Common Schools who are recommended by the Inspectors, and who shall have been employed for the two years previous to their admission in daily teaching in Common Schools, will be permitted to obtain classification in the third class after they have been in attendance six months, and in the second and first classes after they have been in attendance one year, and one year and six months respectively.

Trained teachers who have been classified will receive a provisional certificate, setting forth their classification, such certificate to continue in force for two years only.

Trained teachers who shall have served as the head teachers of schools for a period of not less than two years, and who shall have been during the whole of that period so reported upon by the Inspectors as to satisfy the Board, will be entitled to a permanent certificate; but if at the end of these two years they are not deemed worthy to receive such permanent certificate, all benefit arising from their having been classified as trained teachers, or from the provisional certificate previously obtained, shall cease.

Teachers who, previous to the 1st January, 1870, shall have obtained a first class of either year in training shall be entitled to attend at any half-yearly examination for the purpose of passing for the first and second classes of trained teachers, provided that no trained teachers shall obtain a classification in the second class unless they shall have spent eighteen months; nor in the first class unless they shall have spent two years in a Training Institution. Trained teachers holding first-class classification, who have not completed the residence in training required to obtain a first or second class, can, when convenient to the Board, enter the institution for the purpose of completing it.

APPENDIX H.

I.—APPARATUS REQUIRED IN ORDER TO OBTAIN BOUNTIES FOR INSTRUCTION IN GYMNASTICS.

1. A climbing apparatus, consisting of at least—
Two straight poles,
Two straight ropes,
One pair of double poles, slanting, not less than 15 feet in height.
2. A horizontal bar, 6 feet 6 inches long, movable from 5 feet to 6 feet 6 inches above ground.
3. A vaulting bar, movable from 2 feet 6 inches to 5 feet 6 inches above ground, and not less than 8 feet long.
4. Two wooden standards, with holes every 2 inches from 18 inches to 6 feet above the ground, for the practice of jumping height.
5. A spring-board and a storming-board.

The cost of an erection like that above proposed would vary, according to local circumstances, from £10 to £15.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation bearing date the eighteenth day of March, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, the Governor did declare the length of the voyage for a passenger ship proceeding from any part of the Islands of New Zealand to the respective places therein mentioned, and did declare what should be the scale of diet, and the medicines, medical comforts, and medical instruments for the use of passengers: And whereas it is desirable that the same should be amended:

Now, therefore, in exercise of all powers and authorities enabling me in this behalf, I, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of New Zealand, do hereby revoke the hereinbefore recited Proclamation, and do proclaim and declare that, for the purposes of the said Act, the length of the voyage for a "passenger ship" between any part of New Zealand and the under-mentioned places respectively shall be determined by the following scale, that is to say:—

AUSTRALIA—WEST COAST.

Existence of Beaver Reef confirmed.

THE following additional information relative to Beaver Reef, an outlying danger off Swan River, already reported in Hydrographic Notice, No. 10, dated 25th May, 1868, has been received from the Surveyor-General's Department, Western Australia.

The existence of the Beaver Reef, which was reported to have been seen in 1864, has been confirmed by Captain Laing of the schooner *Giff*, who passed it on the 15th April, 1869, when the sea was breaking heavily and continuously on the danger.

The reef appeared to extend about half a mile north and south soundings were obtained in 15 to 18 fathoms, a quarter of a mile from the southern end, and its position agreed with that

assigned to it in the above Hydrographic Notice, viz., about 52 miles, W. by S. (true) from the west end of Rottne Island, or in lat. 32° 8' S., long. 114° 32' E., approximately.

Yatala Shoal is 3½ miles long, north-west and south-east, by about a cable broad, shoaling gradually from 9 fathoms at its edges to 3 fathoms on its centre. From the shoalest part Cape Willoughby Lighthouse bears S. by W. 6½ miles, Cape Jervis N.W. ½ N. 7½ miles, and the South Page E. by S. ½ S. 6½ miles.

The Scrapers.—The least water on this shoal is 14 feet, distant 4 cables W.N.W. from Cape St. Alban, with Cape Willoughby Lighthouse bearing S. ½ E. 2½ miles. From the breakers on the south-eastern extreme of the shoal, Cape St. Alban bears N.W. ½ W. 1½ miles, and Cape Willoughby Lighthouse S. by W. ½ W. 1½ miles.

NORTH PACIFIC OCEAN.—WESTERN PART.

INFORMATION has been received from Captain Almond, of the ship *Decapolis*, of two supposed dangers passed by him during a recent voyage from Newcastle, Australia, to Shanghai.*

About noon of 15th May, 1869, the *Decapolis* passed within half a mile of a supposed shoal of small extent on which the sea broke occasionally; there was but little wind at the time, the sea being comparatively smooth. The shoal is reported to be in latitude 0° 32' N., and longitude (determined from D. R.) 152° 51' E.

Also, on 22nd May, at 9.30 a.m., a large patch of breakers was passed about 1½ miles distant; wind strong from the north-east. The position of this reported danger is given as latitude 8° 26' N., and longitude 150° 20' E.

Neither of these patches of broken water were sounded over.
