GENERAL RULE FOR PROCEEDINGS BEFORE WARDENS.

WHEREAS by *The Mining Statute* of 1865, section 233, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Chief Judge of Courts of Mines and any two or more of the Judges of the Courts of Mines, from time to time, but subject to the same Act, to frame such General Rules as to them shall seem expedient for and concerning and so far as not therein provided for the practice and proceedings in cases before the Wardens: Now we, the undersigned, the said Chief Judge and Judges of the Courts of Mines, in pursuance of the said power, do make and declare the rule following and that the same shall commence and come into operation on the first day of February next:—

In every proceeding before a Warden, after the complainant or applicant, his attorney or counsel, shall have stated his case or made his application, and before he shall have called any witness, the Warden may, if he shall think proper, call upon the defendant or person called upon to answer, his attorney or counsel, forthwith or after adjournment, to state the nature of his defence or answer, and neither party shall be permitted to depart from such opening statement, defence, or answer without leave of the Warden. But this restriction shall not be continued upon an appeal from the decision of the said Warden.

PORTS AND HARBORS OF VICTORIA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable SIR JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Passengers, Harbors, and Navigation Statute 1865*, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, may from time to time define the limits and boundaries of ports in Victoria, and frame rules and regulations for the governance and preservation of the said ports respectively, and for the regulation of shipping in the same, and also for the due protection and preservation and good government and management of all public wharfs, and may appoint officers to carry out and enforce such rules and regulations; and from time to time, in like manner, may alter, amend, or repeal any such limits, boundaries, rules, and regulations, and substitute others in their stead: And whereas by a Proclamation bearing date the thirteenth day of May, in the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers vested in him by the above recited Statute, did define the limits and boundaries of ports in the said colony, and did proclaim and declare that certain rules and regulations therein specified for the governance and preservation of the said ports, and for the regulation of shipping in the same, should be substituted for other rules and regulations formerly in force: Now therefore, I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby repeal rules 1 to 4 and 7 of the rules and regulations contained in the Proclamation above specified, and do declare that the following rules shall be substituted therefor (that is to say):—

GENERAL RULES AND ORDERS APPLICABLE TO ALL PORTS AND HARBORS IN VICTORIA.

- 1. Flag for vessels from other than Australasian ports.**—The person in charge of any ship from other than Australasian ports shall, when entering any port of Victoria, hoist and keep her ensign flying at the mainmast head, until the vessel has been boarded and cleared by the health officer, when the ensign is to be hauled down and a blue flag hoisted and kept flying until the ship has been cleared by the immigration officer, if such vessel have passengers on board.
- 2. Flag for vessels from Australasian ports.**—The person in charge of any ship having passengers on board from any Australasian port (not in Victoria) shall, when entering any port in Victoria, hoist a blue flag at the mainmast head, and keep it flying until cleared by the immigration officer.
- 3. Ship entering port.**—No person except the pilot and health and immigration officers, and boatmen employed to convey them, shall, with any vessel or boat whatever, go alongside of, nor shall any person, except the pilot and such officers, board any ship from other than an Australasian port when entering or within any port in Victoria, before she has been cleared by the health officer, nor in the case of ships carrying passengers shall any person on board leave such vessel before she has been so cleared by the immigration officer.
- 4. Blue flag.**—No person, except the pilot and other duly authorized officers of Government, and such reporters for the press as hold a written authority from the Government, shall go on board of, or leave, any ship carrying passengers entering or within any port until such vessel has been cleared by the immigration officer, which clearance will be indicated by the blue flag being hauled down.
- 5. Blue flag.**—No boat shall make fast to, or tow alongside of, any inward-bound ship carrying passengers under weigh within any port, except steam-tugs and those duly authorized

by Government, before the ship is properly anchored and the blue flag hauled down.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1862* it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon or within five miles of any gold-field, or in or within five miles of any town not contained in any municipal district, or within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land to be a municipal common, or a gold-fields common, or a town common, or a farmers' common respectively, as the case may be; and it is also enacted that the Governor in Council may at any time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common proclaimed before or after the passing of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby increase the common hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the above-recited provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

MERINO UNITED TOWN AND FARMERS' COMMON.—The United Town and Farmers' Common of Merino, described in two several Proclamations bearing date respectively the 6th and 13th days of October, 1862, is hereby increased by adding thereto the allotments of land hereinafter enumerated, and comprising an area of 1332 acres 1 rood 14 perches, viz.:—Allotments 1ab, 2ab, 3a, 4ab of section 13; and allotment 6ab of section 14; in the parish of Mocambo.—(69.T.13137.)

WORKS ON MAIN ROADS.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in exercise of the power conferred by *The Local Government Act 1863*, has, by Orders made on the 20th day of December, 1869, directed that the undermentioned Shire Councils shall, within the times by the said respective Orders appointed, execute the works on the Main Roads hereinafter named and described, as provided by the 220th section of the said Act, according to plans deposited with the Board of Land and Works, that is to say:—

The Council of the Shire of Ararat, shall, within twelve months from the 20th of December aforesaid, drain, form, and metal twenty-eight chains of the Wickliffe to Streatham Main road.

BYE-LAWS OF THE ROSEDALE ROAD DISTRICT BOARD.

ORDINARY MEETINGS.

THE ordinary meetings of the board shall be held at the office of the board on the first Thursday of every month, at eleven o'clock in the forenoon. The business to commence as soon as the required quorum is present; but should a quorum not be present at the expiration of half an hour after the time appointed for meeting no business shall be transacted at the meeting, and the names of all members present shall be recorded in the minute book by the clerk.

SPECIAL MEETINGS.

2. Special meetings may be summoned at any time by the clerk upon his receiving a written requisition, signed by three members, stating the matter to be brought forward at such meetings, provided he shall give to each member written notice thereof at least four clear days before such meeting.

MINUTES.

3. At every ordinary meeting of the board the first business thereof shall be the reading of the minutes of the preceding meeting for confirmation, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of proceedings. The minutes when confirmed shall be signed by the chairman, or, in his absence, the acting chairman.

ORDER OF BUSINESS.

4. At all meetings of the board the reading, considering, and ordering upon correspondence unconnected with the orders of the day, the receiving and reading of petitions and memorials, and bringing up reports of committees and of officers, shall have precedence of regular business.

5. Any petition or memorial addressed to the board must be presented by a member, who shall be responsible for its being respectfully worded; and no debate shall take place thereon, except as to its being received and taken into consideration after the orders of the day, or at any future meeting, or, if necessary, that it be referred to a committee.

ORDERS OF THE DAY.

6. The orders of the day shall include all matters arising out of the proceedings of former meetings of the board, all business of which due notice has been given, and any subject which the chairman may think fit to bring under consideration.

NOTICES OF MOTION.

7. Notices of motion shall be given to the clerk, in writing, and read aloud at the meeting previous to that at which the same shall be taken into consideration, and all such notices shall be considered in the order in which they are given.

MOTIONS.

8. No motion entered on the notice paper shall be proceeded with unless the member who has given such notice, or some one authorised by him, be present when the business is called on. Notices not proceeded with shall be struck out of the paper.

9. Every member, including the chairman, shall stand while addressing the board.

10. The chairman's ruling shall be final on all matters of order or practice.

11. Every motion or amendment shall be entered on the minutes, with the names of the mover and seconder; and on a division the clerk may be required by any member to record the votes.

AMENDMENTS.

12. One amendment only shall be discussed at one time, but, if lost, another may be moved before the original motion is put to the vote; but upon any amendment being carried it shall be competent for any member to move one other amendment thereon.

13. Any member moving or seconding any motion or amendment shall be held to have spoken on that motion or amendment.

NO MEMBER TO SPEAK TWICE ON THE SAME QUESTION.

14. No member shall speak twice on the same question, excepting by way of explanation or reply upon an original motion of which he may have been the mover, or as the mover of an amendment last proposed; and, after the reply, the amendment or the original motion, as the case may be, shall immediately be put to the vote.

MEMBERS TO ADDRESS THE CHAIRMAN WHEN SPEAKING.

15. Any member when proposing a motion or amendment, or if speaking on any matter, shall address the chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall be silent until the member calling to order shall have been heard, and the question of order decided. The member in possession of the chair shall then proceed with the subject.

COLLECTION OF RATES.

16. In all cases it shall be considered sufficient for the collector to post the notice of any amount due on the assessment roll; and in the event of any such amount not being paid to him, a notice stating that, unless the amount be paid before the expiration of fourteen days from the date thereof, legal proceedings shall be taken for its recovery. The collector shall, once a week at least, pay to the treasurer of the board all moneys received by him from time to time, and at the same time furnish the clerk with an account of such moneys.

17. Any member may require the clerk to take down any particular words used by a member immediately upon the same being used.

QUESTIONS HOW DECIDED.

18. All questions before the board shall be decided by show of hands, and the chairman shall, on taking the vote on any motion or amendment, put the question first in the affirmative, and then in the negative; and he may do so as often as may be necessary to enable him to decide which party has the majority. Provided always, that if at any meeting for the election of chairman, there should be an equality of votes, it shall be de-

cided by lot which of the members having an equal number of votes shall be chairman.

ON ADOPTING AMENDMENT THE MOTION QUASHED.

19. Upon the adoption of any amendment of the board, such amendment shall be held to have quashed the original motion; and for all purposes of subsequent discussion the amendment so carried shall be acted upon as an original motion.

MEMBERS MAY PROTEST.

20. Any member may enter his protest against any resolution of the board. Notice, in writing, of intention to protest must, however, be given in every case on the adoption of the resolution to be protested against; and the protest, signed by the member or members protesting, and specifying the reasons for protesting, must be entered before the next ordinary meeting of the board by the protesting member or members in a book to be kept for that purpose in the office of the board.

ADJOURNMENTS.

21. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the board; but if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice-paper, shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment be carried. The business then undisposed of shall have precedence at the next meeting of the board.

22. No motion the effect of which, if carried, would be to revoke or alter any motion that may have passed the board, shall be entertained, unless in compliance with clause 186 of the Act 27 Victoria No. 176.

MOTIONS FOR EXPENDITURE.

23. No motion the effect of which, if carried, would involve the expenditure of any sum of money exceeding £10 shall be entertained by the board, unless notice of such motion be given in the usual manner.

STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTS.

24. The clerk shall present a statement of the monetary affairs of the board at each ordinary meeting of the board.

ELECTION OF OFFICERS UNDER THE BOARD.

25. No election to any vacant office at the disposal of the board, the yearly emolument of which shall exceed £50, shall take place until fourteen clear days' public notice shall have been given by advertisement in the local newspapers inviting applications from candidates properly qualified.

PRELIMINARY DEPOSITS.

26. No tender for works shall be received unless accompanied by a preliminary deposit of 2½ per cent. on amount of tender (as a guarantee of the bona fide intention of the tenderer). In the event of the tender not being accepted, this deposit to be returned; if the tender is accepted, then this deposit to be taken as part of the 10 per cent. deposit on the contract, or to be absolutely forfeited to the board if the tenderer fails to take up the contract as allotted to him.
