## VICTORIAN AND TASMANIAN INTERCOLONIAL ELECTRIC TELEGRAPH SERVICE.

### REDUCTION OF RATE.

ON and after the 1st January, 1870, the charge for the transmission of Telegraphic Messages through the submarine cable between Victoria and Tasmania, will be as follows:—

For a message of ten words ... Four shillings.  
And for every additional five words, or  
fraction of five words ... Two shillings.

Press telegrams will be forwarded for one-half the above rate.  
The charge for the transmission of messages by the land lines will remain as at present.

## RESERVATION OF LAND IN RESPECT OF IM- PROVEMENTS ON RUNS.

THE attention of the Pastoral Licensees of Runs is directed to the provisions of the 110th section of *The Amending Land Act 1869*, by which it is enacted that "where any woolshed, sheepwash, cattle yard, drafting yard, reservoir, tank, dam, well, or other improvement has prior to the commencement of this Act been made, or shall with the consent of the Board hereafter be made, on any Crown land held under a license for pastoral purposes, the land on which such improvements are made and adjoining thereto shall, notwithstanding anything contained in this Act, or in any such rule, regulation, or order, be reserved for the exclusive occupation of the pastoral licensee of such lands, to the extent of one acre for every One pound expended on such improvements, so that the land to be reserved as last aforesaid shall not exceed on any one run six hundred and forty acres." And they are hereby requested to transmit to the Office of the Board of Land and Works a schedule showing the several improvements which they desire to bring under the provisions of that clause, with a statutory declaration as to the several amounts expended on such improvements, so that the extent of land to be reserved from selection may be at once determined in accordance with that section of the Act.

A tracing showing the position of these improvements with respect to the homestead and the boundaries of the run should accompany the schedule.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Justices of the Peace Statute 1865*, it is amongst other things enacted that Courts of General Sessions of the Peace shall be holden in and for such places or districts within Victoria as the Governor in Council appoints; and the Governor in Council may from time to time define and appoint the limits and boundaries of the places or districts within which all such courts shall have jurisdiction respectively, and the places and times at which such courts shall be holden: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony bearing date the seventh day of December, 1868, the limits and boundaries of the places or districts within which Courts of General Sessions shall have jurisdiction were defined: And whereas by another Proclamation bearing date the fourth day of January, 1869, two of such districts were altered: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby appoint that Courts of General Sessions of the Peace having jurisdiction within the places or districts defined as hereinbefore mentioned shall be holden during the year One thousand eight hundred and seventy, at the respective places and times hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:

## COMMON INCREASED.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1862* it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon or within five miles of any gold-field, or in or within five miles of any town not contained in any municipal district, or within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land to be a municipal common, or a gold-fields common, or a town common, or a farmers' common, respectively, as the case may be; and it is also enacted that the Governor in Council may at any time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common proclaimed before or after the passing of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby increase the Common hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the above-recited provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

MARYBOROUGH GOLD-FIELD COMMON—The Maryborough Gold-field Common, described in a Proclamation bearing date the 6th day of April, 1868, is hereby increased by adding thereto the unappropriated Crown land within the boundaries described as follow, viz.: Commencing at the north angle of the borough of Maryborough; thence by the north-west boundary thereof bearing S. 45° W. one mile, to a point on the eastern boundary of the existing common; thence by the north-eastern boundary of that common bearing N. 45° W. four miles, more or less, to the south boundary of section 2, parish of Waseek; thence by the said boundary of that section, and by a line bearing east five miles, more or less, to the west boundary of the Carisbrook Farmers' Common; thence by the west and south boundaries of that common bearing respectively south two miles, more or less, and east seventy-one chains, more or less, to the north-west angle of allotment 6, parish of Carisbrook; thence by that allotment bearing south forty chains; thence by a line bearing west

two miles, more or less, to the north-east boundary of the borough of Maryborough; and thence by that boundary bearing N. 45° W. sixty chains, more or less, to the point of commencement. Area about 5700 acres.—(69. V. 24109.)

## MINING OPERATIONS AUTHORIZED WITHIN THE CAMP RESERVE, MALDON.

THE Governor in Council, in pursuance of the 15th section of the *Mining Statute 1865*, has authorized W. A. Hadwen, W. R. Hodge, and George Wilson, all of Maldon, hereinafter styled Hadwen and party, to occupy under miners' rights, and to carry on mining operations upon the portion of ground situate within the Government Camp Reserve at Maldon, particularly described in the schedule hereto, subject to the conditions following:—

1. The surface of the ground shall not be occupied for purposes of residence, nor shall any tents or huts be erected thereon.

2. During the progress of mining operations, all excavations and heaps of headings shall be securely enclosed by a substantial fence.

3. The workings shall be open at all times to the inspection of any mining surveyor or other authorized officer.

4. The mining operations shall be conducted in such a manner as not to interfere with the purpose for which the reserve was made.

5. The trees in the reserve shall not be injured or interfered with in any way.

6. Before commencing mining operations the said Hadwen and party shall pay into the hands of the Receiver and Paymaster of the district the sum of Fifteen pounds sterling, as a guarantee that they will observe and fulfil these conditions.

7. On the discontinuance of the mining operations hereby authorized the said Hadwen and party shall notify to the mining surveyor of the division their intention to abandon their claim, and shall then, in the presence of the mining surveyor, fill in all shafts and excavations on the ground to his satisfaction, and thereupon the mining surveyor shall give a certificate to that effect, and on the production of such certificate to the Receiver and Paymaster the deposit shall be payable to the holders thereof.

8. The Minister of Mines, or any person by him authorized in writing, shall have at any time power to order the immediate discontinuance of any mining operations within the reserve.

9. In case any of the above conditions be in any way violated, the sum deposited by way of guarantee shall be forfeited, and it shall not be lawful for the said Hadwen and party to mine any longer within the limits of the said land.

All that piece or parcel of land in the colony of Victoria, county of Bendigo, in the mining district of Castlemaine, containing by admeasurement three acres and thirty-two perches, be the same more or less: except that portion comprising three roods and twenty-four perches, for the occupation of which authority has already been granted to Messrs. Printed forms of tender and conditions of contract may be obtained from the Secretary, Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge of police at each station, by whom also any information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

Each station to be tendered for on a separate form of tender, and tenders must be upon the printed form.

Tenders will be received for either oats, bran, hay, or straw; but if all be included in one tender, it may be accepted for one article only, if advisable.

Tenders must express the prices in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies.

As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small, will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

The price must be, per ton for hay and straw, and per bushel of 40 lbs. for oats and 20 lbs. for bran (net weight), including delivery at the stations and all charges; bags to be returned when empty.

Tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for one-third of the estimated amount of the contract, within ten days after the acceptance is notified. Two approved securities are required for contracts amounting to £150 and upwards, and one surety for contracts under £150.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

All tenders must be enclosed in a separate envelope, marked "Tender for Forage," and deposited in the box at the Stores Tender Board Office, Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Stores Tender Board Offices, Treasury, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known by *Gazette* notice, and by letter to accepted tenderers.

CONDITIONS.

1. The hay to be eaten, good, sound and sweet and properly trussed; the straw to be wheaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats (colonial grown) and bran to be sound and sweet and of the best description.

2. The supplies are for police and telegraph horses, and are to be delivered on the order of the officer in charge of the district or station. The quantities stated in the schedule being only approximate, it must be understood that the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned; and should new telegraph stations be formed, or additional horses be required to be stationed in any of the districts tendered for, the supplies required may be drawn from the contractor. The excess over the estimate, will not, however, exceed during the whole year 50 per cent. of the estimated quarterly consumption.

3. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by the particulars of quantity, showing the net weight, to be endorsed on the back of the order, which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

4. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the District, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.

5. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

6. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the board is to be considered final.

7. If the board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 5.

8. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue either to the public service or to the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 5.

9. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or of delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Government may direct. It will also be in the power of the Government, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

10. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government.

11. It will be competent for the Secretary to the Tender Board, on behalf of the Government, or for the contractor on his own behalf, to terminate the contract, by giving in writing a notice of three full calendar months to that effect, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the first day of a month, and provided that no such notice can be given before the 30th September, 1870; and in the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.


