DISTRICT FOR BEER LICENSES.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Wines, Beer, and Spirit Sale Statute* 1864, it is amongst other things enacted that a beer license shall authorize the licensee to sell and dispose of, not earlier than Six o'clock in the morning nor later than Eight o'clock in the evening, any ale or beer to be drunk in the house or on the premises described in such license, except in the city of Melbourne or town of Geelong, or in any borough, and if the premises described in such license be subsequently to the granting of such license brought within any borough, such license shall expire at the end of the council of any borough provided that upon the application of the council of any borough the Governor in Council may by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare the whole or any part of such borough a district wherein beer licenses may be granted, and may on a like application revoke any such proclamation: And whereas the council of the borough of Stawell has made application that the whole of the said borough may be declared a district under the proviso of the Act above recited: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power conferred by the above-recited Act, do by this my Proclamation declare the whole of the borough of Stawell to be a district wherein Beer Licenses may be granted.

PART I. OF "THE POLICE OFFENCES STATUTE 1865" EXTENDED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the session held in the twenty-eighth year of Her Majesty's reign (No. 265), called *The Police Offences Statute* 1865, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* extend all or any of the provisions contained in Part I. of the said Statute to any city, town, district, or place in Victoria, and may define the limits of any such city, town, district, or place, and vary and alter such limits, and may revoke any such Proclamation; and upon any such Proclamation the provisions so proclaimed shall extend to and be in force in such city, town, district, or place: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, do, with the advice of the Executive Council, by this my Proclamation, extend all the provisions contained in Part I. of the said Statute to the township and road district hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

* This calculation is made upon the population at the last census, instead of the present population, as there are no means of estimating the changes which have taken place in the different sub-districts since the census was taken. It is believed that the present population of the whole district of Melbourne and suburbs amounts to 175,000. If this be correct, the mortality of the month under review would indicate a proportion of 2'10 deaths to every 1000 persons living.

The mortality of Melbourne and suburbs, together with the mean temperature in the shade and the mean atmospheric pressure, during the month of January for the ten years 1860-1869 were as follow:—

The deaths in January 1870 numbered 367, which was 60 less than the average of the month during the previous ten years. In seven years of the period the mortality of January was greater and in three it was less than in the present year.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at the Melbourne Observatory during the month was 107'1° on the 24th, and the lowest was 45'5° on the 16th. The mean temperature of the month (67'3°) was nearly a degree above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (47'3°) took place on the 10th, viz.:—from a maximum of 94'2° to a minimum of 46'9°. The least range (10'9°) was on the 14th, viz.:—from a maximum of 65'3° to a minimum of 54'3°.

Fifty-four per cent. of the deaths were of males, and 46 per cent. were of females; 68 per cent. were of children under five. It is a remarkable fact that these percentages are precisely identical with those which obtained in January 1869. In January 1868, 62 per cent. of the persons who died were under five years of age; in January 1867, 75 per cent.; in January 1866, 65½ per cent.; in January 1865, 65 per cent.; in January 1864, 64 per cent.; in January 1863, 64 per cent.; in January 1862, 68 per cent.; in January 1861, 71 per cent.; and in January 1860, 73 per cent.

Eight persons of 75 years old and upwards died during the month, viz.:—Two males aged 76, and a male aged 80, of old age; a male aged 78 of diarrhoea; a female aged 75 of cerebral irritation; a female aged 78 of bronchitis; a female aged 78 of accidental fracture of the skull, and a female aged 84 of ileus.

The violent deaths numbered 18: of which one was attributed to suicide and the remainder to accident. The following are the particulars.—A female infant aged 6 months died of shock to the system resulting from a fracture of the arm; a boy aged 4 of a fractured skull, caused by machinery; a laborer aged 25 of injuries by a steam threshing-machine; a shipwright aged 50 of injuries by machinery; a female aged 73 of a fractured skull, caused by falling down stairs; a ship's steward aged 43 of hemorrhage after amputation of the leg; a laborer aged 83 of sunstroke; a female aged 18 of accidental poisoning by corrosive sublimate; a painter aged 40 of arsenical poisoning through working at his trade; a boy aged 6, a boy aged 10, a youth aged 16, a seaman aged 32, a solicitor's clerk aged 44, and a latter aged 45, of drowning; an infant aged 3 days of suffocation with food; an infant aged 4 months of suffocation in bed; a laborer aged 27 of a self-inflicted wound in the throat whilst laboring under temporary insanity.

The deaths in public institutions numbered 55, or 15 per cent. of the whole, viz.:—37 in the Melbourne Hospital, 5 in the Lying-in Hospital, 1 in the Immigration Hospital, 2 in the Benevolent Asylum, 2 in the Immigrants' Home, 4 in the Yarra Bend Asylum, 1 in the Carlton Asylum, 2 in the Industrial Schools, and 1 in the Melbourne Gaol.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 211, of which 112, or about 53 per cent., were of males, and 99, or nearly 47 per cent., were of females; of those dying, 160 were under one year of age, 39 were between one and two years, 3 were between two and three, 7 were between three and four, and 2 were between four and five.

The persons dying at a more advanced age than five years numbered 156, of which 87, or nearly 56 per cent., were males, and 69, or about 44 per cent., were females; 12 were between five and ten, 4 were between ten and fifteen, 3 were between fifteen and twenty, 15 were between twenty and twenty-five, 21 were between twenty-five and thirty, 18 were between thirty and thirty-five, 13 were between thirty-five and forty, 18 were between forty and forty-five, 9 were between forty-five and fifty, 13 were between fifty and fifty-five, 11 were between fifty-five and sixty, 3 were between sixty and sixty-five, 5 were between sixty-five and seventy, 3 were between seventy and seventy-five, 6 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 2 were eighty and upwards.

For the first time since February 1869 more deaths were caused by zymotic than by local diseases. The most fatal diseases under the former head were diarrhoea and dysentery, which caused 69 deaths against 61 in December; typhoid and infantile fever, which caused 14 deaths against 11; and diphtheria, which caused 9 deaths against 5.

THE accompanying Report by Professor Gamgee with reference to his process of preserving meat, which was furnished by that gentleman to the Agent-General of Victoria in London, is published for general information.

THE GAMGEE MEAT-PRESERVING PROCESS.

The prevention of imported and purely contagious cattle diseases, the great demand for fresh meat in England, and the importance of utilizing the animal produce of distant countries, led, four years since, to the first experiments, which have resulted in the satisfactory preservation of the carcasses of animals by a process that is inexpensive and readily carried out on the largest scale.

Theory of the Process.

Carbonic oxide gas combines with blood or flesh coloring matter, so as to enable this to resist the reducing or decomposing action of sulphurous acid; well-burned and dry charcoal absorbs 65 times its volume of sulphurous acid. In this way a compound is obtained of uniform strength, great affinity for oxygen and moisture, and which can easily be measured, weighed, or handled in boxes for the purpose of meat preservation; a gradual, certain, and sufficient diffusion of a given quantity of sulphurous acid is thus obtained in chambers in which meat is suspended. The sulphurous acid is prevented from injuring the aspect and taste of the meat in a great measure by the previously secured actions of the carbonic oxide. It attacks the surface, however, is dissolved, and penetrates gradually to the deeper parts of the tissue, and into the bones. It remains in the meat partly unchanged in solution, and partly in combination with soda and potash in the form of sulphites.

Practical Application of the Process.

Animals to be preserved are caused to inhale carbonic oxide by enveloping their heads in an air-tight hood, which communicates with a gas-bag or gasometer charged with the gas; when insensible—and in bullocks or sheep the inhalation occupies from 50 to 70 or 80 seconds—the animals are bled; they are then dressed as usual. Pigs are dressed in their usual way; the kidneys, as well as other internal organs, are removed. Animals that have been shot or otherwise slaughtered are subjected in chambers to the action of carbonic oxide gas, which is readily absorbed by the blood and tissues.

Having secured this preliminary condition, the carcasses are hung up in chambers full of carbonic oxide, pure or in combination with other gases, and boxes containing from two to three pounds of charcoal, well charged with sulphurous acid, for every hundred pounds of meat are placed therein. The whole is left undisturbed for seven or eight days in the case of sheep, ten days for pigs, and eighteen or twenty for bullocks.

Apparatus used.

Originally, metal receivers, air-pumps, gasometers, tin cases, and other expensive machinery were used; but the requirements of the American trade compelled improvements, which may be said to have been concentrated in the apparatus erected near the Columbia market. It has been fitted up as required in the hottest climates, and for the purpose of instructing colonists and others in the difficult art which has been so long in process of development. The preserving chambers are of concrete (2), and wood (1). They measure respectively 12 feet in length, 3 feet 6 inches in width, and 8 feet in height. They have a metal roof, over which brine coming from a sieve refrigerating machine on the other principle. This brine flows over one or all the roofs at the wish of the operator, and passes into a tank containing pipes through which the gases pass, and are cooled before entering the chambers. From this tank the brine passes back to the refrigerator. A three-inch pipe passes from the floor of each chamber in front, being provided with a stop-cock externally, and communicates with a blower. From this the air is carried either round to the cold tank to be used in establishing a circular current for refrigerating purposes, or through a furnace. From the furnace there is a communication with pipes in the cooling tank, and from there with the

chambers, a three-inch pipe opening just below the roof in the rear part of each, being likewise provided with a stop-cock.

When the blower is set in motion the air is drawn from one or all the chambers, as the operator chooses, and is driven unchanged through the cooling tank, or if made to pass through the furnace containing hot charcoal, converted into nitrogen and carbonic oxide; back into the chambers again. The refrigerating machine is only needed in hot climates, and used only to set the meat, and so lower its temperature as to favor gaseous absorption. The cooling occupies only a few hours, must never proceed to the freezing point, and indeed only to 50° Fahr.

According to the experiences of London brewers, who cool their liquor by means of other machines, the cooling of 500 sheep to the required temperature would not cost two pounds in any part of the world. The apparatus, therefore, consists in preserving-chambers which should hold the amount of meat to be packed in a single day; provision for external circuit of cooled water or brine, and internal currents of cooled air or burned air when the meat is put in the chamber with a box or boxes containing the required amount of charged charcoal; the doors are jammed tightly against india-rubber washers, and the blowers set in motion. So long as the air is burning in the furnace there is outward pressure, as indicated by a relief-valve on the blower. When the valve is quiet the blower is stopped. Time is allowed to facilitate the actions of carbonic oxide on the meat's surface, and then by means of a leather thong, which works through a "stuffing-box," the lid of the charcoal-box is removed. This completes the process.

Labor and Expense involved.

In addition to the butchers needed to slaughter and dress the sheep, the largest establishment can only need one man to drive the freezing machines and blower, and another to attend the charging of the charcoal.

In England the expense of preserving amounts to two or three pence for a sheep, and about a shilling for a bullock.

Transportation of the Meat.

The meat remains unchanged for weeks and even months in the open air. Consignments from Western America have been in quarters and entire carcasses, packed in cloths and common deal boxes. Experiments on a satisfactory scale are being instituted as to the best means of packing the meats for Australian purposes.

Packing in pots has succeeded well, but it is desired to convey the carcasses, if possible, so as to secure a freshness of surface suited to the ordinary butcher's shop.

Sale of the Meat.

Mr. Bonser's letter is evidence on this point:—

"29, 30, and 31, Grand Avenue,
Metropolitan Markets, 31st December 1869.

"SIR,—Professor Gamgee has requested me to write to you in reference to his process of meat preservation.

"When first spoken to on the subject last autumn, I did not suppose that preserved meat could be placed and sold by the side of meat fresh from the slaughterhouse. After, however, having the carcasses of beef, pork, mutton, and veal in this market, and sold without difficulty to our regular customers, I have no hesitation in saying that Professor Gamgee has achieved a very great success.

"I believe there are several gentlemen unconnected with the trade who can speak more positively than I can do as to the keeping qualities of this meat, from having seen and partaken of Mr. Gamgee's American consignments last year, but the specimens which first induced me to feel an interest in Professor Gamgee's operations were cured as follows:—

"19th October, four hind quarters of mutton placed in the chamber, and taken out 26th October.

"4th November, two quarters of pork placed in chamber, and taken out 11th November.

"A leg of the above-mentioned mutton and a leg of the pork were cooked on 22nd November, and partaken of by several persons, and the taste found to be excellent.

"Both the above-mentioned mutton and pork were in my possession from the time they were taken out of the chamber until now, and still continue untainted.

"On 8th December, I had twenty sheep submitted to the process, which were taken out in seven days, and have since been sold in this market.

"On 22nd December, three beasts, and ten pigs, and one calf, were treated in the same manner for seven days, and have since been sold to the trade in the regular course of business.

"Any further information you may desire upon the subject, I shall have much pleasure in furnishing.
