RESERVATION OF LAND IN RESPECT OF IMPROVEMENTS ON RUNS.

THE attention of the Pastoral Licensees of Runs is directed to the provisions of the 110th section of *The Amending Land Act 1869*, by which it is enacted that "where any woolshed, sheepwash, cattle yard, drafting yard, reservoir, tank, dam, well, or other improvement has prior to the commencement of this Act been made, or shall with the consent of the Board hereafter be made, on any Crown land held under a license for pastoral purposes, the land on which such improvements are made and adjoining thereto shall, notwithstanding anything contained in this Act, or in any such rule, regulation, or order, be reserved for the exclusive occupation of the pastoral licensee of such lands, to the extent of one acre for every One pound expended on such improvements, so that the land to be reserved as last aforesaid shall not exceed on any one run six hundred and forty acres." And they are hereby requested to transmit to the Office of the Board of Land and Works a schedule showing the several improvements which they desire to bring under the provisions of that clause, with a statutory declaration as to the several amounts expended on such improvements, so that the extent of land to be reserved from selection may be at once determined in accordance with that section of the Act.

A tracing showing the position of these improvements with respect to the homestead and the boundaries of the run should accompany the schedule.

NOTICE TO MARINERS AND OTHERS.

SHIPPING-SIGNALS, MARYBOROUGH, PORT DENISON, AND
CLEVELAND BAY.

SIGNALS to denote the arrival of vessels at and off the above ports will be brought into use and exhibited as follows, viz. :—
Maryborough, on the 3rd January, 1870, from the flagstaff on the tower of the Telegraph Office.

Port Denison, on the 1st February, 1870, from flagstaff at the Pilot Station.

Cleveland Bay, on the 1st February, 1870, from the flagstaff at the Look-out station.

The code of signals can be obtained at the harbor offices at the respective ports, and at the Port Office, Brisbane.

Vessels wishing to claim exemption from pilotage must, when nearing the signal station at the entrance to the above ports, show, in addition to the white flag at the mainmast-head; the numeral pendants denoting the port sailed from, by the sub-joined list, in accordance with II Vic. No. 15, section 3. The numeral pendants, which are the same as those in use in Sydney and Brisbane, must be hoisted where they can be most easily made out from the signal stations.

THE COUNTY OF GLADSTONE.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by The Amending Land Act 1865, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may divide into counties the territory not already included in any county, and by proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette may define the boundaries of such counties, and may distinguish each by name; and after such proclamation the territory comprised within the boundaries of any of the said divisions shall thenceforward be recognized as a county by the name so given as aforesaid: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, in exercise of the power conferred by the said Act, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby include in a county the territory hereinafter described, the same not having been hitherto included in any county, and to define the boundaries of such county, and do distinguish the same by the name mentioned in conjunction with such boundaries, that is to say:—

THE COUNTY OF GLADSTONE: Commencing at the intersection of the Loddon River by the geodetic line on latitude 36° 6'; thence by that line bearing west to the Avoca River; thence by that river bearing southerly to its source at the junction of the range which divides it from the sources of the Wimmera River with the Great Dividing Range; thence by that range bearing easterly to the source of the Bet-bet Creek; thence by that creek, being the western boundary of the county of Talbot, bearing north-easterly to its junction, with the Loddon River aforesaid; and thence by that river bearing northerly to the point of commencement.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS
VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, Knight Commander of the Most
Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-
in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the thirty-first year of
Her present Majesty's reign, intituled *An Act to amend
the Laws relating to or affecting Public Health* (31 Vict. No.
310), it is amongst other things enacted that this Part (that is
to say, Part II.) of this Act shall apply to all places where the
Part of the Act thereby repealed, or any portion thereof, has
been in force, and all or some of the provisions of this Part
shall also apply to every such city, town, borough, shire, dis-
trict, or place in Victoria as the Governor in Council shall, by
Proclamation direct; and the Governor in Council may at any
time, and from time to time, alter, repeal, or revoke any such
Proclamation theretofore or thereafter made: Now therefore
I, the Governor of Victoria, in pursuance of the provisions of
the said Act, and in exercise of the power thereby conferred,
do, with the advice of the Executive Council, by this my Pro-
clamation direct that all the provisions of Part II. of the said
Act shall apply to the respective Shires and Road Districts
hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

* This calculation is made upon the population at the last census, instead of the present population, as there are no means of estimating the changes which have taken place in the different sub-districts since the census was taken. It is believed that the present population of the whole district of Melbourne and suburbs amounts to 175,000. If this be correct, the mortality of the month under review would indicate a proportion of 1.68 deaths to every 1000 persons living.

The number of deaths in the month under review was only slightly above the average of November, during ten years. The November of 1860 was that in which the greatest mortality prevailed, and the same month of 1861 was that of the least mortality. In the former the deaths numbered 209 more, and in the latter 105 less than in the month under review.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at the Melbourne Observatory was 93° on the 17th, and the lowest was 40.8° on the 7th. The mean temperature of the month was a small fraction above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (39.2°) took place on the 7th, viz.:—from a maximum of 80° to a minimum of 40.8°. The least range (10.3°) was on the 5th, viz.:—from a maximum of 59° to a minimum of 48.7°.

Fifty-four per cent. of the deaths were of males, and 46 per cent. were of females. Forty-seven per cent. were of children who had not attained their fifth year, against 49 per cent. in November, 1868; 45 per cent. in November, 1867; 60 per cent. in November, 1866; 60 per cent. in November, 1865; 43 per cent. in November, 1864; 47 per cent. in November, 1863; 55 per cent. in November, 1862; 51 per cent. in November, 1861; and 73 per cent. in November, 1860.

Five persons died during the month at the advanced age of 75 years, or upwards, viz.:—A female, aged 75, of pneumonia; a male, aged 78, of softening of the brain; a female, aged 80, and another, aged 82, of old age; and a female, aged 84, of bronchitis.

Fourteen violent deaths occurred during the month, of which 11 were recorded as accidental, and 3 as suicidal. The accidental deaths were those of a miner, aged 24, who died of a fractured spine, caused by a fall of earth; of a drayman, aged 25, who died of an injury caused by a dray-wheel passing over him; of a miner, aged 34, who died of a fractured leg; of a male, aged 46, who died of a fractured leg, caused by his being knocked down whilst drunk; of a laborer, aged 50, who died from the effects of a fall; of a boy, aged 63, who was drowned in a water-hole; of a seaman, aged 39, and of a seaman, aged 48, who were drowned in Hobson's Bay; of a male child, aged 2 months, of a female, aged 33, and of a male, aged 54, who were choked with food. The suicidal deaths were those of a ship's steward, aged 34, who poisoned himself; of a gentleman, aged 63, who drowned himself whilst of unsound mind; and of an unknown male, aged about 40, who committed suicide by allowing a train to pass over him.

Forty-nine deaths, or 17 per cent. of the whole, occurred in public institutions, viz.:—35 in the Melbourne Hospital, 1 in the Lying-in Hospital, 7 in the Benevolent Asylum, 4 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, and 2 in the Industrial Schools.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 139, of which 74, or about 53 per cent., were of males, and 65, or nearly 47 per cent., were of females; of those dying, 107 were under one year of age, 20 were between one and two years, 6 were between two and three, 3 were between three and four, and 3 were between four and five.

The persons dying at a more advanced age than five years numbered 155, of which 85, or about 55 per cent., were males, and 70, or nearly 45 per cent., were females; 8 were between five and ten, 4 were between ten and fifteen, 4 were between fifteen and twenty, 14 were between twenty and twenty-five, 11 were between twenty-five and thirty, 16 were between thirty and thirty-five, 14 were between thirty-five and forty, 19 were between forty and forty-five, 16 were between forty-five and fifty, 15 were between fifty and fifty-five, 8 were between fifty-five and sixty, 11 were between sixty and sixty-five, 7 were between sixty-five and seventy, 3 were between seventy and seventy-five, 2 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 3 were eighty and upwards.
