ALL charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.

2nd. Any person paying the necessary charges, and making a vault, or erecting a monument of any kind in the cemetery, by and with the permission of the trustees under these rules, shall be entitled to have and keep such vault or monument, according to the tenor of such permission, to and for the use of such persons or their representatives for ever.

3rd. Applications for permission to make a vault or erect a monument or fence in the cemetery, must be made to the trustees through their secretary, and if such application be approved of, a certificate of permission in the form of schedule A, will be granted to the applicant on the payment of the proper charges.

4th. The charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in this cemetery, on the production of a certificate from a magistrate or minister of religion, or of other evidence proving to the satisfaction of the trustees that such person was a pauper, or that the relatives and friends of the deceased are unable to pay the costs and charges.

5th. The purchasers of permission to bury shall dig, or cause the graves to be dug, themselves, always providing that no grave be less than five feet deep.

6th. In case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent, in writing, of the party entitled thereto must be left with the order.

7th. Plans of all proposed monuments or fences must be submitted to the trustees for approval.

8th. All monuments, vaults, graves, gravestones, and fences, to be kept in proper order and repair at the expense of the owners.

9th. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in and covered with a slab of stone, slate, or iron.

10th. Every coffin must have on the lid the name of deceased.

11th. A plan of the cemetery and a register will be kept, and may be inspected on application.

12th. Any person wantonly destroying, defacing, doing, or causing to be done, any damage to any monument, vault, tombstone, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant in the cemetery is by the statute guilty of a misdemeanor.

13th. The trustees reserve the right of recommending any alterations from time to time in these regulations.

TEESDALE PUBLIC CEMETERY.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE TEESDALE PUBLIC CEMETERY.

ALL charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the vault or ground is opened.

II. Any person or persons making a vault, or erecting or placing a monument in the cemetery, by and with the permission of the trustees under these rules, and upon the payment of the proper charge, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep a vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the tenor of such permission, to and for the sole use of such person and his or their representatives for ever.

III. Application for such permission to be made at the office of the trustees. A certificate of permission, in the form set forth in Schedule B, will be granted to the party applying for such permission on payment of the proper charges.

IV. Orders for interments to be given at the office of the trustees on the day previous, between Eight o'clock a.m. and Five o'clock p.m.

V. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, but persons requiring brick graves or vaults must construct them under the direction of the surveyor to the trustees, or any other person appointed by them for that purpose; and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent (in writing) of the party entitled thereto must be left with the order. The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death must be stated at the time of giving the order.

VI. The charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such cemetery on the certificate of a minister of religion or other evidence, proving to the satisfaction of the trustees that such person was a pauper, or that the relations or friends of the deceased are unable to pay the costs and charges.

VII. Hours of interment from 10 a.m. till 5 p.m. except in special cases, as where death is occasioned by any contagious disease. The hour fixed for the funeral to be the time when the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually attended to.

VIII. All monuments, vaults, graves, gravestones, and fences to be kept in proper repair at the expense of the owners.

IX. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of freestone, slate, or iron; and no catacombs or any fencing allowed without first submitting a plan of the same for the approval of the trustees.

X. A plan of the cemetery, showing the situation of the purchased and other graves, is kept at the office, and all future selections must be in accordance with the divisions and subdivisions shown on the plan. Registers of all permissions are to be kept by the secretary.

XI. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these rules.
