UNION UNDER THE "WEIGHTS AND MEASURES STATUTE 1864."

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTEBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament of Victoria, passed in the twenty-seventh year of the reign of Her present Majesty, called *The Weights and Measures Statute 1864*, it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council, at the request of and pursuant to any agreement made by the councils or boards of any two or more of any adjoining boroughs, shires, and road districts, may proclaim such boroughs, shires, and districts to be a "Union" for the purposes of the said Act, and by such Proclamation fix the proportion in which the expenses devolving upon such union under the said Act shall be borne by the several bodies corporate of such boroughs, shires, or districts: And whereas the Councils of the Boroughs of Smythesdale, and Browns and Scarsdale, and the Shires of Grenville and Ripon, have requested that the said boroughs and shires may be proclaimed a "Union," and that the expenses devolving upon such union under the said Act may be borne in the proportion of one-sixth by the Borough of Smythesdale, one-sixth by the Borough of Browns and Scarsdale, one-third by the Shire of Grenville, and one-third by the Shire of Ripon: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do proclaim the Boroughs of Smythesdale, and Browns and Scarsdale, and the Shires of Grenville and Ripon to be a "Union" for the purposes of the said Act, and do fix the proportion in which the expenses devolving upon such union under the said Act shall be borne by the Councils of the said Boroughs of Smythesdale, and Browns and Scarsdale, and Shires of Grenville and Ripon, as follows :—

One-sixth by the Council of the Borough of Smythesdale, one-sixth by the Council of the Borough of Browns and Scarsdale, one-third by the Council of the Shire of Grenville, and one-third by the Council of the Shire of Ripon.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-first day of April, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy, and in the thirty-third year of Her Majesty's reign.

* This calculation is made upon the population at the last census, instead of the present population, as there are no means of estimating the changes which have taken place in the different sub-districts since the census was taken. It is believed that the present population of the whole district of Melbourne and suburbs amounts to 175,000. If this be correct, the mortality of the month under review would indicate a proportion of 2.19 deaths to every 1000 persons living.

The daily average of mortality in March was not so great as it was in February, the numbers being 12.35 and 13.21. The deaths in March amounted to 353, or 26 above the average of the month in the preceding ten years. In this calculation, however, the increase of population during the period is not taken into account, an allowance for which would show the mortality of the month under review to be lower than the average.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at the Melbourne Observatory during the month was 90° on the 19th, and the lowest was 42.3° on the 1st. The mean temperature of the month (64.3°) was a fraction above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (36.7°) took place on the 1st, viz.:—from a maximum of 79° to a minimum of 42.3°. The least range (10°) was on the 22nd, viz.:—from a maximum of 69° to a minimum of 59°. The mean atmospheric pressure (30.043 inches) was a fraction above the average.

Males and females contributed respectively 53 and 42 per cent. to the total mortality. Children under five contributed 47 per cent. to that mortality, against 45 per cent. in March 1869, 61 per cent. in March 1868, 63 per cent. in March 1867, 57 per cent. in March 1866, 59 per cent. in March 1865, 58 per cent. in March 1864, 57 per cent. in March 1863, 58 per cent. in March 1862, 65 per cent. in March 1861, and 61 per cent. in March 1860. It will be observed that during the past eleven years children under five have uniformly contributed more than half to the mortality of March, except in the case of this year and last.

No less than five octogenarians, of whom four were females, died during the month; also a female aged 77. The last-named died of dysentery. The other females, aged respectively 82, 85, 86, and 89, died of old age. The male aged 80, died of dysentery.

Twenty violent deaths occurred; of which 13 were referred to accident, 1 to homicide, and 6 to suicide. The accidental deaths occurred as follow:—A carter aged 23 died of injuries to the brain caused by a fall from a load of wood; a groom aged 33 of injury to the chest caused by running against a cab; a female child aged 13 weeks of burns; a schoolboy aged 10, a female aged 20, a male aged 26, a boiler-maker aged 43, a diver aged 55, and a laborer aged 60, of drowning; a male aged 25, described as a seaman and informer in sly-grog cases, was found dead on Williamstown beach, and is supposed to have been drowned; a male and a female infant, each aged 3 months, were suffocated in bed, and a male aged 40 died of suffocation in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum. The homicidal death was that of an infant smothered at birth by some person unknown. The suicidal deaths were those of a female aged 25 (insane), who poisoned herself with belladonna; of a druggist aged 28 (insane), who poisoned himself with prussic acid; of a gentleman aged 37 (insane), who poisoned himself; of a male aged 37, who poisoned himself; of a male aged 51 (intoxicated), who poisoned himself with strychnine; and of a female aged 26 (insane), who drowned herself.

Seventy-two deaths, or 19 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—46 in the Melbourne Hospital, 5 in the Benevolent Asylum, 8 in the Immigrants' Home, 9 in the Yarra Bend Asylum, 2 in the Carlton Asylum, 1 in the Melbourne Gaol, and 1 in the Pentridge Female Prison.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 179, of which 102, or nearly 57 per cent., were of males, and 77, or about 43 per cent., were of females; of those dying, 116 were under one year of age, 45 were between one and two years, 10 were between two and three, 4 were between three and four, and 4 were between four and five.

The persons dying at a more advanced age than five years numbered 204, of which 121, or about 59 per cent., were males, and 83, or about 41 per cent., were females; 11 were between five and ten, 4 were between ten and fifteen, 7 were between fifteen and twenty, 13 were between twenty and twenty-five, 23 were between twenty-five and thirty, 13 were between thirty and thirty-five, 28 were between thirty-five and forty, 23 were between forty and forty-five, 22 were between forty-five and fifty, 13 were between fifty and fifty-five, 10 were between fifty-five and sixty, 12 were between sixty and sixty-five, 8 were between sixty-five and seventy, 6 were between seventy and seventy-five, 1 was between seventy-five and eighty, and 5 were eighty and upwards.

The most fatal diseases were diarrhoea and dysentery, which caused 61 deaths against 55 in February. Typhoid and infantile fever also caused 17 deaths against 11, and diphtheria caused 6 deaths against 8. Local diseases again caused most deaths, which, with the single exception of January 1870, has been the case in every month since February 1869. Deaths from violence were above the average both in February and March, especially those from suicide in the latter month.

REGULATIONS MADE BY THE TRUSTEES OF THE PUBLIC CEMETERY, ESTABLISHED AT SEYMOUR.

- ALL regulations heretofore made by the trustees are hereby repealed.
2. All charges must be paid when the orders are given or before the ground or vault is opened.
 3. Application for permission to make a vault or erect a monument in the cemetery must be made to the trustees in writing, and if approved of, a certificate of permission will be granted to the applicant, on payment of the proper charges.
 4. The charges will be remitted for the burial of any person on evidence being produced to the trustees that the friends or relations of such person are unable to pay the costs and charges.
 5. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug; but when a brick grave or vault is required it must be constructed under the direction of the trustees or some person duly appointed by them.
 6. All monuments, vaults, graves, gravestones, and fences must be kept in proper repair and condition at the expense of the owners.
 7. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, and covered with a slab of freestone, granite, slate, or iron.
 8. A plan of every monument must be submitted to the trustees for their approval.
 9. In the erection of tablets, copper-cramps must be used.
 10. Orders for interment must be given to the sexton or other person appointed by the trustees between the hours of Ten a.m. and sunset on the previous day.
 11. In case an interment is to be made in any private vault or grave, the consent in writing of the proprietor must be left with the order.

12. The name, age, late place of residence, rank or occupation, and probable cause of death of the deceased, must be stated at the time of giving the order.

13. The procession to arrive at the cemetery punctually at the hour appointed for the funeral.

14. The usual hours for interment will be from Ten a.m. to Six p.m. from 1st September to 30th April, and from Ten a.m. to Four p.m. during the other months of the year.

15. A plan of the cemetery and a registry will be kept by the trustees.

16. The trustees reserve the right to recommend any alterations from time to time in these regulations.

10th. The trustees reserve to themselves the right of making alterations from time to time in these regulations, subject to the approval of His Excellency the Governor.
