HYDROGRAPHIC NOTICE, No. 5, AUSTRALIA DIRECTORY, VOL. 2. NOTICE No. 5, TORRES STRAIT—WESTERN CHANNELS.

The portmaster of Brisbane, Queensland, has forwarded the following information relative to a small sunken rock off East Strait Island, near Cape York, obtained from Captain Edwards, of the ship *Melanie*.*

(All bearings are magnetic. Variation 4° 50' easterly in 1870.)

Edward's Rock.—This rock was seen from the *Melanie* in June 1869, while working up from Wednesday Island. When near the rock the peak of Pole Island was just in sight to the eastward of Double Island, Strait Rock open to the northward of Horned Hill on Horned Island, and the south point of Hammond Island well open of the south point of Wednesday Island.

The rock is very small, probably 20 feet square, and considered to have about six feet water on it; from the above bearings it appears to lie S. $\frac{1}{2}$ W. about 12 miles from East Strait Island.

This danger is to the northward of the course recommended through this part of Torres Strait, but mariners should keep a good look-out when in the neighborhood of East Strait Island.

BEACON ON HAPUKA ROCK, ASTROLABE ROAD.

Notice is hereby given* that an iron beacon, painted red, has been erected on Hapuka Rock, Astrolabe Road.

It is an iron rod surmounted by a spherical cage, three feet in diameter, and will stand about thirteen feet out of water at high-water spring tides.

This rock, instead of being awash at high water, as described in the *New Zealand Pilot*, and *New Zealand Sheet Chart*, No. VII., is only about two feet out of water at low-water spring tides.

The Rear-Admiral Commander of the Naval Forces and Chief of the Marine Department in Netherlands India, for the information of parties interested, publishes the following communication received from the Captain of the Dutch barque *Luctor et emergo*, viz.:—That sailing in Karimata Straits the vessel under his command struck on a hitherto unknown reef, situated

in the soundings—Nanyka Island, west: Pesemoet, E. $\frac{1}{2}$ N.; westernmost of Momprang Islands, S. by E.

Edeling, in the Chart of the west coast of Borneo, page II., places it in 3 degrees 31 minutes 30 seconds S. latitude, 108 degrees 39 minutes 37 seconds E. long. from Greenwich.

The same communication mentions the existence of an island not laid down in the charts of these straits.

When in the soundings Pesemoet Island, N.N.E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E.; Nanyka, W. $\frac{1}{2}$ N.; easternmost of Momprang Island, S. by W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W., the said island was visible in N. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. On the aforesaid Chart it is placed in 2 degrees 32 minutes south latitude, 108 degrees 44 minutes east longitude from Greenwich.

COMMONS UNITED.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees shall be disposed of, and at any time to alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it is directed that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons shall be published and all objections thereto shall be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: And whereas all objections respecting the union of the commons hereinafter mentioned have been heard as directed by the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby unite the commons hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the above-recited provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

THE UNITED BOROUGH GOLDFIELD AND FARMERS' COMMON OF ARARAT AND CATHCART.—The Cathcart Farmers' Common, described in two several Proclamations bearing date respectively the 13th day of March 1861 and the 7th day August 1865, and the Ararat United Borough and Goldfield Common, described in a Proclamation bearing date the 3rd day of August 1868, are hereby united and proclaimed under the designation of the United Borough Goldfield and Farmers' Common of Ararat and Cathcart.—(70.Y.5011.)

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-seventh day of May, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy, and in the thirty-third year of Her Majesty's reign.
