REDUCED RATE OF POSTAGE ON FOREIGN PACKETS.

THE Governor in Council, under arrangements with the Postmaster-General in the United Kingdom, and the proper authorities in the undermentioned colonies, has approved of the following reduced rates being charged on book-packets, and patterns or samples of merchandise, posted in Victoria, addressed to the places named:—

To the United Kingdom, <i>via</i> Southampton.	Not exceeding one ounce in weight, One penny.
	Exceeding one ounce, but not exceeding two ounces, Two pence.
	And for every additional two ounces or portion of two ounces, Two pence.

Or double those rates when transmitted in the mails *via* Marseilles.

To South Australia, Tasmania, and New Zealand.	Not exceeding one ounce in weight, One penny.
	Exceeding one ounce, but not exceeding two ounces, Two pence.
	And for every additional two ounces or portion of two ounces, Two pence.

RESERVATION OF LAND IN RESPECT OF IMPROVEMENTS ON RUNS.

THE attention of the Pastoral Licensees of Runs is directed to the provisions of the 110th section of *The Amending Land Act* 1869, by which it is enacted that "where any woolshed, sheepwash, cattle yard, drafting yard, reservoir, tank, dam, well, or other improvement has prior to the commencement of this Act been made, or shall with the consent of the Board hereafter be made, on any Crown land held under a license for pastoral purposes, the land on which such improvements are made and adjoining thereto shall, notwithstanding anything

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contained in this Act, or in any such rule, regulation, or order, be reserved for the exclusive occupation of the pastoral licensee of such lands, to the extent of one acre for every One pound expended on such improvements, so that the land to be reserved as last aforesaid shall not exceed on any one run six hundred and forty acres." And they are hereby requested to transmit to the Office of the Board of Land and Works a schedule showing the several improvements which they desire to bring under the provisions of that clause, with a statutory declaration as to the several amounts expended on such improvements, so that the extent of land to be reserved from selection may be at once determined in accordance with that section of the Act.

A tracing showing the position of these improvements with respect to the homestead and the boundaries of the run should accompany the schedule.

PART II. OF "THE PUBLIC HEALTH AMENDING STATUTE 1867" EXTENDED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the thirty-first year of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled *An Act to amend the Laws relating to or affecting Public Health* (31 Vict. No. 310), it is amongst other things enacted that this Part (that is to say, Part II.) of this Act shall apply to all places where the Part of the Act thereby repealed, or any portion thereof, has been in force, and all or some of the provisions of this Part shall also apply to every such city, town, borough, shire, district, or place in Victoria as the Governor in Council shall by Proclamation direct; and the Governor in Council may at any time, and from time to time, alter, repeal, or revoke any such Proclamation theretofore or thereafter made: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, and in exercise of the power thereby conferred, do, with the advice of the Executive Council, by this my Proclamation direct that all the provisions of Part II. of the said Act shall apply to the Borough hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

BYE-LAW 44.—[18th August, 1869.]

AT a meeting of the Board of Agriculture, holden at the offices lately occupied by the Department of Mines, Queen street, in the city of Melbourne, on the eighteenth day of August, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, it is ordained as follows, that is to say:—

BYE-LAW 45.—[18th August, 1869.]

At a meeting of the Board of Agriculture, holden at the offices lately occupied by the Department of Mines, Queen street, in the city of Melbourne, on the eighteenth day of August, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, it is ordained as follows, that is to say:—

45. All societies entitled to the grant in aid to agricultural societies for the year 1869, shall receive such in proportion to their respective amounts of revenue, until this revenue amounts to the sum of £500 in each case; such societies, however, as possess a revenue exceeding this sum, namely £500, shall receive for the surplus half the rate of grant proportionate to the revenue, or in other words, each pound of revenue above £500 in each case shall rate as Ten shillings.
