NOTICE TO LIGHTERMEN, BOATMEN, AND LICENSED CARRIERS.

THE attention of lightermen, boatmen, and licensed carriers is directed to the 7th section of *The Customs Laws Amendment Act* (27 Victoria No. 169), by which the following annual fees are payable in advance by every person licensed or to be licensed under the 17th, 137th, and 138th sections of *The Customs Act* 1857, viz.:-

For every dray or vehicle to be licensed to carry goods under bond, the fee of £1.

For every vessel or boat used as a lighter, the fee of £1.

For every other vessel or boat, the fee of 5s.

The above fees for the year ending 30th June 1871 are due on the 1st of July next.

Instructions have been given to the proper officers for the due enforcement of the law.

SEAMEN PROHIBITED FROM CARRYING ABOUT THEM, ON SHORE, KNIVES OR OTHER OFFEN- SIVE WEAPONS.

THE following Notice, which appeared in the *Government Gazette* of 27th October 1863, is republished for the information of seamen and others.

The practice of late adopted by seamen of carrying about their persons when on shore sheathed knives, being dangerous to the lives of the inhabitants, and in direct contravention of *The Town and Country Police Act* (18 Vict. No. 14, sec. 5, part 24), which attaches a penalty of Twenty pounds on every person who may be found carrying any firearms, sword, dirk, dagger, or other offensive weapon within any town or place: Commanders and officers of vessels are requested to warn seamen accordingly, and to use their utmost endeavours to prevent their crews from appearing on shore so armed, and thereby incurring the penalty imposed by the above recited Act.

NORTH PACIFIC OCEAN.—(WESTERN PART.)

INFORMATION has been received from Captain Bartlett, of the British barque *Britomart*, of a reef seen by him during a recent voyage from Australia to Hong Kong.*

Britomart Reef.—This reef, close to which the *Britomart* passed, is level with the water, and from 400 to 500 feet long. It lies nearly 75 leagues to the westward of Assumption Island, one of the northern of the Ladrone Group, and the position as determined, lat. 19° 18' N., long. 141° 34' E.

The *Britomart* afterwards passed over the assigned position of Lindsay Island, lat. 19° 20' N., long. 141° 15' E., but it was not visible from the mast-head in fine clear daylight.

Captain Bartlett also reports passing near the Minto Reef in the Caroline Islands. This reef is described as being 10 miles long, east and west, and level with the water, except near the northern part, where it rises about 6 feet above the sea. The position as given, lat. 8° 10' N., long. 154° 34' E., was found to be correct.

DANGERS IN THE BAY OF PLENTY AND EAST CAPE PASSAGE

Customs Department,

THE following Notices to Mariners respecting dangers in Bay of Plenty and East Cape Passage, furnished by Lieut. G. A. Woods, of the colonial surveying schooner *Edith*, are published for general information.

(In the absence of the Commissioner of Customs.)

BAY OF PLENTY.

(1.) A dangerous rocky patch, extending N.W. and S.E. about two hundred (200) feet, with about five (5) feet at low-water spring-tides, has been discovered off Motiti Island, in the fairway of vessels bound from the eastward to Tauranga, when passing between Aihohake Reef and Motiti.

The following are the bearings and distances:—

Mongonui Hill N. 60° 15'—distant 9½ miles.

Northern point of Motiti N. 78° 30' W.—distant 2½ miles.

(2.) A dangerous sunken patch, bearing from the Schooner Rock about N. by E.½ E.—distant about ¼ of a mile—has been seen breaking.

Mariners are therefore cautioned against passing within a mile of this rock on that line of bearing.

EAST CAPE.

The following dangers have been discovered in or near the passage between East Cape and East Island (Whanga Okena).

(1.) A sunken rock, with only sixteen (16) feet of water, bearing from the northern extreme of East Island W. by N.½ N.—distant five-sixths of a mile.

The extreme of Matakana Point in conjunction with the extreme of Horoera Point leads on this rock.

(2.) A shoal patch, with twenty (20) feet of water, bearing from the northern extreme of East Island N.W.¼ W.—distant two (2) miles.

The extreme of Horoera Point in conjunction with Iron Point leads on to this danger.

ALL charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.

2. By the Cemeteries Statute of 1864 any person making a vault, grave, or tombstone, or erecting and placing a monument in the cemetery, by and with the permission of the trustees under these rules, and upon the payment of the proper charges, is entitled to have maintained and kept up such vault, grave, monument, or tombstone according to the terms of such permission to and for the sole and separate use of such person or persons and his representatives for ever.

3. Application for such permission to be made at the office of the trustees. A certificate of permission, in the form set out in the schedule, will be granted to the party applying for such permission on payment of the proper charges.

4. The charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such cemetery on a certificate of a minister of religion or other evidence proving to the satisfaction of the trustees that such person was a pauper, or that the relations and friends of the deceased are unable to pay the costs and charges.

5. Orders for interment to be given to one of the trustees, or at the office of the trustees, such notice to be given before Four o'clock on the day previous.

6. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, but parties wanting brick graves or vaults will be required to construct them under the direction of the surveyor; and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent of the party (in writing) entitled thereto must be left with the order.

7. The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death of the deceased, must be stated at the time of giving the order.

8. The time fixed for the funeral to be the time when the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.

9. Until otherwise ordered, the usual hours fixed for the performance of funerals will be from Ten a.m. to Six o'clock p.m. in the months of September to April inclusive, and from Ten a.m. to Four o'clock p.m. in the other four months.

10. All monuments, vaults, graves, and grave-stones to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.

11. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, and covered by a slab of freestone, slate, or iron.

12. A plan of every monument and tombstone proposed to be erected and placed shall be exhibited to the said trustees before permission for the erection thereof is given, and the said trustees shall be at liberty to withhold such permission, and prevent the erection of any monument or tombstone which shall appear to them inappropriate or unbecoming; and shall determine and fix the position of any monument or tombstone which may be proposed to be erected according to the description, size, and character thereof, having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the said cemetery in an appropriate manner.

13. No servant or other person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.

14. The ground will be open daily to the public from sunrise to sunset.

15. A plan of the cemetery, showing the situation of the purchased and other graves, is kept at the office, and registers of all grants are kept by the secretary.

16. It is hereby notified that any person who shall wantonly and wilfully destroy, or do or cause to be done any damage to any monument, vault, tombstone, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant in the said cemetery will be guilty of a misdemeanor, and being convicted thereof will be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding £20, or, at the discretion of the justices, to imprisonment for any period not exceeding three months; and any person who shall do or cause to be done any injury to any such monument, vault, tombstone, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant, whether the same be done wilfully or wantonly, or otherwise howsoever, shall be liable to pay a reasonable sum of money by way of damages and compensation, which said sum of money shall be recoverable in any court of competent jurisdiction in the colony by the trustees of the said cemetery, or any person injured by such damage.

17. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these regulations.

The charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such cemetery on the certificate of a minister of religion or other evidence proving to the satisfaction of the trustees that such person was a pauper, or that the relations or friends of the deceased are unable to pay the costs and charges.

7. Hours of interment from 10 a.m. till 5 p.m., except in special cases, as where death is occasioned by any contagious disease. The hour fixed for the funeral to be the time when the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually attended to.

8. All monuments, vaults, graves, gravestones, and fences to be kept in proper repair at the expense of the owner. A plan of the cemetery showing the situation of the purchased and other graves is kept at the office. Registers of all permissions are kept by the secretary.
