LIGHT ON FAREWELL SPIT-(WESTERN ENTRANCE TO COOK STRAITS).

NOTICE is hereby given that, on and after the 17th June 1870 a light will be exhibited from a Lighthouse erected on Bushend Point, Parewell Spit, in lat, 40° 33° S, and long. 173° 1′ 45° E. s measured from the Admiralty Chart. The light will show all round, except on the outer side of the Spit, where, off deck, it will not be seen when the light is brought to bear eastward of E. 4 S, as it is shut in by sand hills.

It is a revolving white light, of the second order dioptric, attaining its greatest brilliancy once a minute.

Over the Spit End (that is, between the hearings of N.W. 4 N. to W. by N. 4 N.), the light will be red, in order to caution mariners of their approach to that danger.

The light is elevated about 120 feet above the sea-level, and will be visible in clear weather about 17 nautic miles, allowing 15 feet for the height of the observer's eye.

The tower is an open-framed structure of timber, painted in alternate bands of red and white, and is 113 feet in height from the ground to the top of the lantern.

Vessels must take care not to open the northern edge of the red light when within four niles of the Lighthouse.

All bearings are magnetic.

That the land required for the extension of Cameron street be taken possession of by the council, and that the price thereof be fixed by arbitrators appointed by the council and the owners of such land, as provided for by The Boroughs Statute.
