## LIGHT ON FAREWELL SPIT—(WESTERN ENTRANCE TO COOK STRAITS).

NOTICE is hereby given that, on and after the 17th June 1870 a light will be exhibited from a Lighthouse erected on Bushend Point, Farewell Spit, in lat.  $40^{\circ} 33' S.$  and long.  $173^{\circ} 1' 45'' E.$  as measured from the Admiralty Chart. The light will show all round, except on the outer side of the Spit, where, off deck, it will not be seen when the light is brought to bear eastward of  $E. \frac{1}{2} S.$ , as it is shut in by sand hills.

It is a *revolving white light*, of the second order dioptric, attaining its greatest brilliancy *once a minute*.

Over the Spit End (that is, between the bearings of  $N.W. \frac{1}{2} N.$  to  $W.$  by  $N. \frac{1}{2} N.$ ), the light will be *red*, in order to caution mariners of their approach to that danger.

The light is elevated about 120 feet above the sea-level, and will be visible in clear weather about 17 nautic miles, allowing 15 feet for the height of the observer's eye.

The tower is an open-framed structure of timber, painted in alternate bands of red and white, and is 113 feet in height from the ground to the top of the lantern.

Vessels must take care not to open the northern edge of the red light when within four miles of the Lighthouse.

All bearings are magnetic.

## Light vessel in Yokohama Bay.

Also that a rock exists in latitude 18 degrees 32 minutes S., longitude 179 degrees 27 minutes 20 seconds W.

## Rocks in Viti Rauran Bay.

Notice is also given of the existence of two patches of coral rock, on which H.M.S. *Blanche* struck on the 6th and 7th December 1869, in Viti Rauran Bay, Viti Levu Island.

1. A patch inside the Mololo Passage, with  $2\frac{1}{2}$  fathoms water on it, lies 1 mile south from Spieden Island.

2. A patch in the centre of the Bay with the following bearings:—Liuthieum Island north 6 miles, north point of Malolo Lailai W. by N.  $\frac{1}{2} N.$  5 miles, and Spieden Island S.W.  $\frac{1}{2} S.$  7 miles.

Note.—In navigating the Fiji group great caution is necessary, as many unknown patches of rock may exist.

And bye-law numbered VII., intituled a bye-law for licensing and regulating the slaughtering of small cattle within the township of Inglewood.

And bye-law numbered X., intituled a bye-law prohibiting damage to the public footpaths and water-courses, and regulating the formation of private drains and crossings.
